Spiritual Notes:

We read today's Gospel in the context of last week's Gospel in which Jesus sent the twelve disciples to proclaim the kingdom of heaven. In between last week's reading and today's reading, Jesus has predicted that the disciples will face difficulties in their mission. Many people will not receive them well, even within the land of Israel. Even family members will turn away from the disciples because of the disciples' commitment to Jesus and the kingdom. Today's Gospel offers the disciples consolation against this difficult truth.

This section of Matthew's Gospel should be read in the context of Matthew's intended audience, a Jewish-Christian community. The Gospel alludes to the dangers and persecutions that this community has most likely already faced and will continue to face. To reassure this community, Matthew recalls for them the encouraging words of Jesus that we read today.

In this Gospel passage, Jesus might be understood as putting suffering in perspective. The disciples of Jesus are called upon to keep their focus on God. Those who can harm the body do not have ultimate power; God does. Still persecution and suffering cannot be avoided or prevented. But Jesus reassures His disciples that God knows and cares about what happens to His children.

We might not face the same type of persecution, but we do experience difficulties as we endeavor to live a Christian life. Sometimes we let the opinions of others prevent us from doing what we know to be right. We need the reminder that what God thinks about us is more important. We are reassured by the promise that God cares for us and protects us.

Please keep in your prayers, Matt Plotts, age 60, who died on Thursday, June 15, 2017. Eternal rest grant unto him, O Lord, and let perpetual light shine upon him. Please also keep Matt's family in your prayers.

Notas Espirituales:

Leemos el Evangelio de hoy en el contexto del Evangelio de la semana pasada en el que Jesús envió a los doce discípulos para proclamar el reino de los cielos. Entre la lectura de la semana pasada y la de hoy Jesús ha predicho que los discípulos tendrán dificultades en su misión. Muchas personas no los recibirá bien, ni aun dentro de la tierra de Israel. Incluso los miembros de la familia se alejarán de los discípulos debido a su compromiso con Jesús y el reino. Hoy el Evangelio les ofrece a los discípulos consuelo contra esta difícil verdad.

Esta sección del Evangelio de Mateo debe leerse con el contexto del público en mente: una comunidad judía-cristiana. El Evangelio alude a los peligros y persecuciones que esta comunidad ya ha enfrentado y continuará enfrentándose. Para tranquilizar a esta comunidad, Mateo recuerda las palabras alentadoras de Jesús que leemos hoy.

En este pasaje del Evangelio, entendemos que Jesús pone el sufrimiento en perspectiva. Los discípulos de Jesús son llamados a mantener su enfoque en Dios. Aquellos que pueden dañar el cuerpo no tienen el poder supremo; Dios lo tiene. La persecución y el sufrimiento no pueden ser evitados ni prevenidos, pero Jesús asegura a sus discípulos que Dios conoce y se preocupa por lo que les sucede a los niños.

Es posible que no nos enfrentemos con el mismo tipo de persecución, pero experimentamos dificultades cuando nos esforzamos por vivir una vida cristiana. A veces dejamos que las opiniones de otros nos impidan hacer lo que sabemos que es correcto. Necesitamos el recordatorio de que lo que Dios piensa de nosotros es más importante. Estamos tranquilos por la promesa de que Dios cuida de nosotros y nos protege.



Por favor, recuerde en su oración, a todos los enfermos, al salir de casa, y la recuperación de nuestra parroquia. Además, orar por aquellos que sufren de condiciones físicas o mentales.
