

Spiritual Notes

The Book of Proverbs is a collection of wise advice that was used for instruction of ancient Israel. Traditionally attributed to Solomon because of his reputation for great wisdom, many of these sayings were originally intended for young men. Their inclusion in the biblical text gives them a wider audience: all people are called to seek and embrace the way of the wise. In today's reading we hear of the value of a "worthy wife"; this text is sometimes read at funerals as a tribute to a woman whose value is far beyond pearls. The text reminds us of the importance of associating with good people in our lives. Paul's letter to the Thessalonians reminds us that there is more to life than this world. As Christians we anticipate the day of the Lord. As believers we are children of the light and we are called to live lives worthy of our status as God's children; we are called to stay alert and sober, not becoming distracted by unimportant things or falling into darkness. The apostle calls us to encourage one another in our common faith. In the parable of talents, Jesus calls us to make good use of what we have been given. The talents given to each of the servants represent a great amount of money. One talent was equivalent to approximately 6,000 days' wages. Each servant was given a different amount, according to his ability. The parable focuses on what each one did with the talents received. The master accuses the third servant of laziness. The third servant knew his master was demanding, but he didn't even put the money to work in what we would call a conservative financial plan "in the bank" to accrue interest; he merely buried the talent in the ground. Like him, we are called to make good use of what has been entrusted to us, for one day we will be called to give an accounting for our

For reflection: What is my belief about the day of the Lord? How can I prepare for it?

Make holiday celebration baskets filled with festive goodies for nursing homes, homebound neighbors or homeless shelters. Let your kids fill and decorate them.

Make blankets or scarves for the homeless or for a women's shelter—ideal for children 10 and up, and also a great way for them to learn a new skill!

During the holidays, trim a Christmas tree with mittens, scarves, and hats and donate it to a local homeless shelter.

Día de Acción de Gracias 23 de Noviembre de 2017 - Misa 9:00 a.m.

Notas Espirituales:

El libro de Proverbios es una colección de consejos sabios que se utilizó para la instrucción en el antiguo Israel. Tradicionalmente se atribuye a Salomón debido a su reputación de gran sabiduría, muchos de estos dichos fueron pensados originalmente para los hombres jóvenes. Su incorporación en el texto bíblico les da un público más amplio: todas las personas están llamadas a buscar y abrazar el camino de los sabios. En la lectura de hoy escuchamos sobre el valor de "una digna esposa"; este texto se lee a veces en los funerales como un homenaje a una mujer cuyo valor es "mucho más allá de las perlas." El texto nos recuerda la importancia de la asociación con buenas personas en nuestras vidas. La carta de Pablo a los Tesalonicenses nos recuerda que hay más a la vida que este mundo. Como cristianos anticipamos "el día del Señor." Como creyentes somos "hijos de la luz," y por lo que estamos llamados a vivir una vida digna de nuestra condición de hijos de Dios; estamos llamados a "estar alerta y sobrio," no dejarse distraer por cosas sin importancia o caer en la oscuridad. El apóstol nos llama a "animarse unos a otros" en nuestra fe común. En la parábola de los talentos, Jesús nos llama a hacer un buen uso de lo que se nos ha dado. Los talentos dados a cada uno de los siervos representan una gran cantidad de dinero. Un talento era equivalente a aproximadamente a 6,000 días de salario. Cada siervo se le dio una cantidad diferente," según su capacidad." La parábola se centra en lo que hizo cada uno con los talentos recibidos. El maestro acusa al tercer siervo de la pereza. El tercer siervo sabía que su amo era exigente, pero él ni siquiera puso el dinero a trabajar en lo que llamaríamos un plan financiero conservador - "en el banco" a acumular intereses; él simplemente enterró el talento en la tierra.
