Spiritual Notes

Once again, we encounter John the Baptist in today's Gospel. He "came to testify to the light," who is the one promised by God long ago through the prophets. John's presence and preaching stir up the hopes of the people. They suspect he might be "the Christ or Elijah or the Prophet," individuals expected to be sent by God to the people. But John tells them, and us, that the one coming "after me" is more than that. The one who is to come is the Son of God, our redeemer. Today's text, from Third Isaiah is considered a foreshadowing the mission of Jesus. "The spirit of the Lord God is upon me." He has been anointed and sent. He comes to bring glad tidings, the gospel, to those in darkness. The time of His visitation marks a new era in world history, a time when those who are in need of God's healing grace will receive it and when justice will "spring up" on earth. Paul calls the Thessalonians to persevere in their faith. "Pray without ceasing" he advises. In his prayer for them, he prays that God will make you perfectly holy and may you be preserved blameless for the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ. God is faithful, Paul tells us, and He will also accomplish it. Writing with an expectation of an imminent return of the Lord Jesus, Paul exhorts them to live lives of holiness as they wait. Two thousand years later, we still anticipate His return and so are called to live with that same hope, cooperating with the grace of God in our lives.

For reflection: How does my baptismal anointing unite me with Christ's mission to bring good news to the world? Do I regularly seek God's grace to grow in holiness, or am I content to stay as I am?

Fiel es Dios, nos dice Pablo, y "también lo logrará". Escribiendo con la expectativa de un inminente regreso del Señor Jesús, Pablo los exhorta a vivir una vida de santidad mientras esperan. Dos mil años después, todavía anticipamos su regreso y así estamos llamados a vivir con la misma esperanza, cooperando con la gracia de Dios en nuestras vidas.

Para reflexionar: ¿Cómo mi unción bautismal me unen con la misión de Cristo a evangelizar al mundo? Dios desea hacernos santos y sin mancha;¿Qué tan frecuentemente busco la gracia de Dios para crecer en santidad, o estoy contento de permanecer como yo?
