Spiritual Notes:

Christians view God's test of Abraham as a foreshadowing of the death of Jesus. God asks Abraham to take his "son Isaac, your only one, whom you love," and offer him as a sacrifice on a designated mountain. Early Christian artists and homilists viewed this "binding of Isaac" as a parallel to the sacrifice of Jesus. The traditional place of Abraham's sacrifice is the mountain of Jerusalem, which is also the place of Jesus' crucifixion. Isaac is Abraham's beloved son, and Jesus is God's beloved Son. As Jesus carries His own cross to the place of crucifixion, so too, Isaac carries "the wood for the burnt offering." Paul reminds the Romans that God "did not spare his own Son but handed him over for us." So great is God's love for us, Paul says, that we should be confident in the face of trial or affliction; Christ, who gave His life for us, "intercedes for us." This is the cause of our hope as Christians. Jesus' Transfiguration anticipates His Resurrection as His disciples see him transfigured in the company of two great prophetic figures, Moses and Elijah. Mark makes it clear that the disciples did not fully understand the experience. Peter's suggestion to "make three tents" seeks to extend the moment and is reminiscent of the tents used by the Israelites in the wilderness with Moses. Moses and Elijah are eschatological figures whose returns were anticipated in association with the Messiah. The heavenly voice first acknowledges Jesus as "my beloved Son" and then commands the disciples to "listen to him." Significantly, the next words Jesus speaks to them are concerned with "when the Son of Man had risen from the dead," words they fail to understand until after the Resurrection.

For reflection: What sacrifices have I been asked to make for the sake of the gospel? What is the greatest sacrifice someone has made for me? How did I benefit from that person's sacrifice?

Lenten Reflection on Divine Mercy

The three crosses on Golgotha can give us a better understanding of Divine Mercy. The whole Passion was an infinite act of Divine Mercy for each and every one of us. Jesus, in His compassion for us, paid in full the sin-debt owed to God by all of humanity, reconciled a sin-damaged humanity to God the Father, and obtained for humanity an eternal share in the divine life of the Holy Trinity. What Adam lost through his self-centered pride, Jesus restored through a freely offered gift of humble and suffering love. Humanity did not merit redemption. It came freely through Divine Mercy. Next week, we will learn what the other two crosses on Golgotha teach us about Divine Mercy.





Notas Espirituales

Los cristianos ven la prueba de Abraham de Dios como un presagio de la muerte de Jesús. Dios pide a Abraham "Toma a tu hijo único, Isaac, a quien tanto amas," y lo ofrecerá como sacrificio en una montaña designada. Artistas y predicadores cristianos tempranos vieron este "sacrificio de Isaac," como un paralelo con el sacrificio de Jesús. El lugar tradicional del sacrificio de Abraham es el monte de Jerusalén, que es también el lugar de la crucifixión de Jesús. Isaac es el hijo amado de Abraham, y Jesús es el hijo amado de Dios (véase el Evangelio de hoy). Como Jesús carga su propia cruz hasta el lugar de la crucifixión, también Isaac lleva "la leña para el holocausto." Pablo recuerda a los Romanos que Dios "no perdonó a su propio Hijo, sino que lo entregó por nosotros" Tan grande es el amor de Dios por nosotros, Pablo dice que debemos tener confianza en la faz de prueba o aflicción; Cristo, que dio su vida por nosotros," intercede por nosotros." Esta es la causa de nuestra esperanza como cristianos. La transfiguración de Jesús anticipa su resurrección como sus discípulos, viéndole transfigurada en compañía de dos grandes figuras proféticas, Moisés y Elías. Deja en claro que los discípulos no entendían plenamente esta experiencia. Sugerencia de Pedro a "hacer tres tiendas" busca extender el momento y es una reminiscencia de las tiendas de campaña utilizadas por los israelitas en el desierto con Moisés. Moisés y Elías son figuras escatológicas cuyos rendimientos fueron anticipados en relación con el Mesías. La voz celestial reconoce primero a Jesús como "mi Hijo amado" y luego manda a los discípulos a "escucharlo." Significativamente, las siguientes palabras de Jesús que les habla se refieren a "cuando el Hijo del hombre resucitara de entre los muertos," palabras que no entiendo hasta después de la resurrección.

Para reflexionar: ¿Qué sacrificios ha pedido que hagamos por el bien del evangelio? ¿Cuál es el mayor sacrificio que alguien ha hecho por mí? ¿Cómo me beneficio de sacrificio de esa persona?
