Learning the Mass - What is the Missal?

The word "Missal," is where we get the word, "Mass" from. The Missal is the book that contains all the Mass texts that the priest prays from start to finish. In the Roman Rite of the Catholic Church, parishes are currently allowed to offer a Mass using one of two Missals. With the bishop's permission, we can use the 1962 Missal, which is often called the *Traditional Latin Mass*, but far more commonly we use the 1970 Missal, or the *Novus Ordo*. Even though the '62 and '70 Missals are different, they share a lot of commonalities, perhaps most surprising is that both are officially written in Latin. They are both "Latin Masses." The '62 must always remain in Latin, but the '70 is allowed to be translated into English. However, both may be offered entirely in Latin.

The priest celebrating Mass is bound to pray the words of the Missal exactly as they appear in the book - adding, deleting, and changing nothing. He must also follow the guidelines I the Missal for physical motions he makes during the Mass - when to make the sign of the cross, when to bow, and so on. This isn't to take away the individual freedom of the priest, but rather it is to help him conform to the high priestly prayer of Christ. Our Lord prays through all his priests, and their words and actions are entirely his.

Here's the current Marian Hymn after Mass -

Salve Regina, mater misericordiae, vita, dulcedo, et spes nostra salve. Ad te clamamus, exules filii Evae. Ad te suspiramus, gementes et flentes, in hac lacrimarum valle. Eia ergo, advocate nostra, illos tuos misericordes oculos, ad nos converte. Et Jesum, benedictum fructum ventris tui, nobis post hoc exsilium ostende. O Clemens, o pia, o dulcis virgo Maria.

Hail, holy Queen, mother of mercy, Hail our life, our sweetness, and our hope. To you we cry, poor banished children of Eve; to you we send up our sighs, mourning and weeping in this valley of tears. Turn, then, most gracious advocate, your eyes of mercy toward us; and after this, our exile, show unto us the blessed fruit of your womb, Jesus. O clement, O loving, O sweet Virgin Mary.

WHY DO WE DO THAT? - CATHOLIC LIFE EXPLAINED

Question: Can a person (the mother, father, or provider) ever be forgiven for an abortion? Answer: For people of faith, any conversation of human sinfulness should always lead us to reflect on God's loving mercy.

Answer: For people of faith, any conversation of human simulness should always lead us to reflect on God's toving mercy. Because God's mercy is greater than any sin, the Church is clear that even those involved in the sin of abortion can be reconciled with God and the Church. To help make this grace more available through the Sacrament of Reconciliation, Pope Francis extended the permission to absolve someone of the sin of abortion to all priests in 2016. Even with the grace and blessings of the Sacrament of Reconciliation, the tragedy of abortion and the aftermath of abortion takes a toll on everyone involved. Ministries of outreach and support, such as Project Rachel, offer pastoral counseling, support groups, retreats, and other forms of care.
