

La parábola de hoy trata sobre un rey que da un banquete e invita a personas de afuera a participar en él. Envía a sus siervos a invitar a la gente por los caminos y caminos. Hay algunas lecciones obvias en esta parábola. En primer lugar, cuando Dios nos llama a su banquete, debemos aceptarlo. Es una gran bendición que podamos venir a la Iglesia y celebrar Misa. En segundo lugar, no es solo para nosotros. Jesús quiere que todos participen de su amor y de su vida. Jesús nos pide que salgamos a los caminos y caminos e invitemos a la gente a asistir a su banquete: la Misa. Sé que a algunos les parece aterrador, pero una simple invitación es bastante fácil y muchas personas simplemente están esperando la invitación. El banquete está listo y el Señor está llamando. Todo lo que tenemos que hacer es ir e invitar a otros.

Today's parable is about a king giving a feast and inviting outsiders to have a share in it. He sends out his servants to invite people in the highways and byways. There are some obvious lessons in this parable. First of all, when God calls us to his feast we should take him up on it. It is a huge blessing that we are able to come to Church and celebrate Mass. Secondly, it's not for us alone. Jesus wants everyone to have a share in his love and life. Jesus asks us to get out into the highways and byways and invite people to come to his banquet - the Mass. I know it seems scary for some, but a simple invitation is pretty easy and many people are just waiting for the invitation. The feast is ready and the Lord is calling. All we need to do is go and invite others.

Liturgical Tidbits Cositas Litúrgicas

The Mass 101: What is the presentation of the gifts?

At the conclusion of the Prayer of the Faithful at Mass, the Liturgy of the Eucharist begins with the Presentation and Preparation of the Gifts. Everyone is seated and the collection is taken. Members of the assembly prepare to bring the bread and wine to the altar. This often was also when items that are distributed to the poor were also brought forward. In the early church, the people brought the bread they had baked and the wine they had made in their homes for the liturgy. In this way, it was clear that these gifts of bread and wine represented the people, "the work of human hands." With time, this ministry has been handed over to monasteries and religious communities who produce the hosts and wine for Mass.

The church uses unleavened bread made only of pure wheat flour and water, and wine only from grapes. Why?

Because that's what Jesus used. He told us to "do this" in his memory, and if "this" changes too much, we're no longer following his command. Even in places of the world where wheat or grapes are scarce, the church still insists that these foodstuffs be imported instead of substituted with local products such as corn flour or rice wine. For persons with celiac disease or alcohol intolerance, the church permits low-gluten hosts and mustum. Mustum is grape juice in which fermentation has begun, but has been suspended with the result that its alcohol content does not reach the levels found in most table wines..to be continued...

¿Cuál es la presentación de los regalos?

Al concluir la Oración de los Fieles en la Misa, la Liturgia de la Eucaristía comienza con la Presentación y Preparación de las Ofrendas. Todos se sientan y se hace la colecta. Los miembros de la asamblea se preparan para llevar el pan y el vino al altar. A menudo esto también ocurría cuando también se presentaban los artículos que se distribuyen a los pobres. En la iglesia primitiva, la gente traía para la liturgia el pan que habían horneado y el vino que habían elaborado en sus casas. De esta manera, quedaba claro que estos regalos de pan y vino representaban al pueblo, "obra de manos humanas". Con el tiempo, este ministerio ha pasado a manos de monasterios y comunidades religiosas que elaboran las hostias y el vino para la misa.

La iglesia usa pan sin levadura hecho únicamente de harina pura de trigo y agua, y vino únicamente de uvas. ¿Por qué?

Porque eso es lo que Jesús usó. Nos dijo que "hiciésemos esto" en su memoria, y si "esto" cambia demasiado, ya no seguiremos su orden. Incluso en lugares del mundo donde el trigo o las uvas escasean, la iglesia todavía insiste en que estos alimentos se importen en lugar de sustituirlos por productos locales como harina de maíz o vino de arroz. Para las personas con enfermedad celíaca o intolerancia al alcohol, la iglesia permite hostias y mostum bajos en gluten. Mustum es jugo de uva en el que la fermentación ha comenzado, pero se ha suspendido con el resultado de que su contenido de alcohol no alcanza los niveles encontrados en la mayoría de los vinos de mesa...continuará...

COFRADÍA DE ST. GERARDO






