Interview Questions Before Reconciliation

- 1. What words would you use to describe God? God is a forgiving, loving, patient friend who wants us to be as loving as we can be.
- 2. Who are the three Persons in the one God? God the Father, God the Son, God the Holy Spirit
- **3.** Please make the Sign of the Cross. The child should cross his/her heart at the word, "HOLY" and touch the left shoulder.
- **4.** Who is Jesus? Jesus is the Son of God.truly God and truly human
- 5. What is the greatest commandment? Love God with your whole heart, and love each other as yourself.
- **6.** What are the Ten Commandments? The ten commandments are rules that tell us what we need to do in order to follow God and be happy.
- 7. What is sin? Sin is choosing to do something we know is wrong.

 What is the difference between a sin and an accident? Sin is something we do on purpose; accidents happen without our wanting them to happen.
- 8. What is the sacrament of Reconciliation? The sacrament of Reconciliation is a celebration of God's pardon for our sins. Celebrating we have a loving and forgiving God
 What are the 3 names for the Sacrament? Reconciliation. Confession. Penance
- 9. What five steps are always a part of the Sacrament of Reconciliation?

You can use <u>big words</u> (Examination of Conscience, Confession, Act of Contrition, Absolution and Penance)

or <u>small words</u> (Think of your sins, Tell the priest, Tell God we are sorry, Receive forgiveness, and Do the penance)

- **10.** What do you say when you first begin your confession? Bless me Father, for I have sinned, this is my First Reconciliation..... (then tell Father your sins).
- 11. Please say an Act of Contrition (Act of Sorrow).

My God, I am sorry for my sins with all my heart. In choosing to do wrong and failing to do good, I have sinned against you whom I should love above all things.

I firmly intend, with your help, to do penance, to sin no more, and to avoid whatever leads me to sin.
