## A word from the Pastor... Fr. J.D. Jaffe



Having been in the Washington DC area for all my life, Memorial Day has become almost synonymous with the Rolling Thunder veteran's demonstration. For those of you who are not familiar with these things, permit me to briefly explain.

Memorial Day is the last Monday in May every year. It is a U.S. holiday where we honor all who have died in service of the United States Armed Forces. Its origins date back to the 1860's and the need for honoring and remembering the more than 600,000 souls who lost their lives in the Civil War. Each year we take this one day to commemorate the fallen, visit and often decorate their graves at the cemeteries and we take time out of our busy lives to give respect to those who gave their lives in service of their country and our freedom.

Rolling Thunder is an annual demonstration that takes place in Washington D.C. over Memorial Day weekend. Motorcycle groups, mostly comprised of military veterans, from all over the country gather in Washington D.C. to raise awareness of Prisoners of War (POW) and those who are Missing in Action (MIA). You will often see their motorcycles adorned with black flags with the initials POW/MIA. This will be the 32<sup>nd</sup> year they have gathered at the Pentagon and then rode their motorcycles on Memorial Day in a large procession to the Capitol building and eventually ending at the Lincoln Memorial. Their goal is to help people remember there are still soldiers who are POWs and who are MIA. They raise money for veteran issues. Their primary hope is to raise awareness of the need to bring our men and women home, ideally alive; but if they are dead, then to bring them home for a proper burial with military honors. It was announced in December, primarily due to costs, that this will be the last year that Rolling Thunder will do one huge demonstration in Washington DC.



The common element in both Memorial Day and Rolling Thunder is the respect and honor of those who have died. This coming Memorial Day is a chance for us to remember the importance of giving due respect and honor to our departed brothers and sisters. The greatest and most selfless act that we can give our loved ones is the dignity of a proper Christian burial and a final resting place where they can be remembered and honored. It is essential that we give them a place that shows their dignity and honors their memory. This means that we should never spread or scatter their ashes or keep their cremated remains in our house or garden. Whether or not our family members are buried in a casket or their remains placed in an urn; they should be given a plot or niche at a cemetery or memorial park, so that we may return there and remember, as well as pray for and commemorate our beloved friends and family. On Memorial Day, may we all pray for the men and women of the Armed Forces who gave up their lives in defense of our freedom and may we remember all our beloved dead. May their souls and all the souls of the faithful departed rest in peace. Amen.
