## Chapter 3: We Follow God's Law

- Law must contain a covenant to be effective
- 10 Commandments are an example of a covenant between God and the Israelites. "I
  will be your God and you will be my People."
- We are called to continual conversion as people of God
- Beatitudes (Matthew 5:3-16) show us that following God's law leads to happiness, love and fulfillment
- LOVE is what makes our covenant with God so strong.
- The New Commandment "As I have loved you, so you also should love one another" (where we get the Golden Rule) tells us how to show we are Disciples of Christ



#### Vocabulary

Human Dignity - the value and worth that we share because God created us in his image and likeness

Natural Law - the law of God within us, which is known by human reason

Conscience - the ability to know the difference between good and evil, right and wrong

Free Will - God's gift to human beings of the freedom and ability to choose what to do

Original Sin - the first sin committed by the first human beings

**Eternal Life** - a life of happiness with God forever

Grace - a participation, or a sharing, in God's life and friendship

Church - the community of people who believe in Jesus Christ, have been baptized in him, and follow his teachings

Holiness - a participation in God's goodness and a response to God's love by the way that we live

Kingdom of God - the power of God's love active in our lives and in our world

Moral Decision Making - the process by which we make choices between right and wrong, good and evil, eternal life and sin

Well-Formed Conscience - a conscience that is educated so that it is able to recognize what is good and then direct us to act on that good

Social sin - unjust situations and conditions that negatively impact society and its institutions

Conversion - turning back to God with all one's heart

New Commandment - Jesus' teaching that we are to love one another as he loves us

Covenant - an agreement
