
5th Sunday of Lent, March 22rd, 2015



Dear brothers and sisters in Christ, we hope your Lenten journey is going well and is bearing spiritual fruit. Whether we have had a great Lent or not, we can finish strong. Or really, it would be best to finish weak, for it is in depending on God and in weakness that we are strong! Doing a weak, little penance, but with great love, will move mountains!! The beauty is that we don't have to go far to find love, for God has written it on our hearts. It may just take a little time of prayer and reflection to recognize and cultivate that love and to allow it to flow out of us like a river through works of charity, especially for those in need.

A few updates to keep you in the loop:

- -If you have not introduced yourself to Deb Carlson, our new music and choir director, please do!
- -We are pleased to announce that the wood paneling has been installed in the basement of the church. Thank you Randy Rhein and Tracey Friedges for your volunteer work!
- -Have you noticed the basement is a little brighter? Our maintenance crew has installed new bulbs and it has made a big difference.
- -We have our third GROW meeting on Saturday in Lonsdale at the Civic Center. The GROW process includes the survey many of you filled out along with the analysis of your responses which we will be doing Saturday. It also includes analyzing the census data of our neighborhood in order to identify trends and in order to make short and long range plans for the parish. Ultimately, the fruit of something like this is that we as a parish can plan and can be intentional about parish life, ministries, activities, maintenance and buildings, etc.
- -A couple of key items for the GROW process are the question of a gathering space as well as an elevator. These have been a part of the conversation since I have been in the parish. Hence with the carpet project approaching, along with re-finishing the wood floors underneath the pews, we see this as a potential opportunity to move forward with the planning of these projects that have long been desired by the parish. The carpet will be installed, we will just need to schedule a time that works in accord with the overall plans. We do not want to delay the carpet any longer than necessary. The GROW has been informative and will be helpful in making such plans, yet in some ways this information is nothing new!
- -A gathering space has been a part of the conversation since I came to the parish as well. A gathering space could be used for funeral wake services that are currently held in church preceding the funeral Mass. A gathering space would also allow families and friends to freely pray, talk and mourn together, and then move into the body of the church for the funeral itself, a place of quiet prayer.
- -A gathering space would also allow for parishioners to gather and talk freely after Mass, outside of the body of the church, which could then remain a place of quiet prayer. This space would allow for our community to continue to grow in our friendships we have with each other and in the support we provide for each other. This flows naturally from prayer and the Mass, out from the body of the church, and into such a space.
- -Note well that the intention of such a gathering space is not for luncheons, etc., that would remain in the basement of the church. Also, the space would be in back of the church where people naturally walk through after Mass. It seems there may be enough space in the back of church that we would not need to build an addition. Rather there would be a re-configuration of the back of church. The GROW information will help us in estimating the amount of pew space we will need in the future. Right now there are no issues with space, especially when we consider how many open pews there are across all three Masses.
- -We will have to look closely at the 10am Mass. So far this year the numbers at the 10am Mass were: 258, 214, 199, 207, 184, 283, 235, 272, 256, 225, and 192, which averages out to about 230. Right now our capacity not including the crying room is 348 with eight people per pew. Even if we lost 6 full pews, that

gives us seating for 300, which is far more than our current usage. Easter and Christmas would still be possible with the use of folding chairs, which we already need anyway.

-Therefore we would ask your prayers, especially invoking Saint Joseph, patron of the Universal Church as well as patron of workers and carpenters. We ask that he would intercede for us regarding these plans. The most important issue is that we need an elevator or some way for our elderly and those with disabilities to be able to enter the basement. Firstly, there is no bathroom in the upper church, and there should be bathroom access for those who cannot walk down stairs.

Additionally, the basement is not accessible for those who cannot walk stairs for funeral luncheons and other events. Addressing this issue is high priority for us as a parish.

Please think and pray about all of this and for our parish! -Saint Joseph, pray for us!
