From Kevin Ryan

Brothers and Sisters of St. Nicholas,

As Fr. Barnes will probably tell you, seminary is an interesting place. Men will come there for a number of reasons, most related to formation for a call to the priesthood. My reason for entering three years ago was something like that. I had developed a great love for the Catholic Church. A potential call to the priesthood might provide a way for me to use my gifts and talents in service to God and his Church.

Seminary, however, as much as it is a place of formation, is also a place of discernment. Many men enter not knowing clearly what the Lord's will is for their lives, yet desiring to surrender themselves over to Him so that He may enlighten and guide them to their true calling. I was one of these men who entered not knowing what the Lord held for me, but desiring to abandon myself to His great providence. Through many hours of prayer and formation, God has made it clear to me that I am not being called to the priesthood at this time, thus I will be stepping out of the seminary at the end of this semester.

While this may come as a shock to some of you, and understandably so, this discernment is the fruit of much prayer and great peace. God has blessed me abundantly with some outstanding gifts, many of which would make me well suited for the priesthood. However, I believe that the Lord has other plans for me, and other ways in which my gifts will be utilized to serve Him.

All that being said, I want to express my deep gratitude to you all, the parishioners of St. Nicholas. What a true blessing it has been for me to be assigned such a generous and loving parish. I've gotten to know many of you well, and it is grieves me to think that I will no longer be around to get to know you all better and to serve you and learn from you. But I am so thankful to have had the opportunity in the first place, and you will continue to be in my prayers as I move on to other things. I ask for yours as well.

Perhaps this is a bit cliché, but I'd like to leave you with a poem, a personal favorite of mine, written by Blessed John Henry Newman as he contemplated God's workings in his life. It is best read out loud. I hope it serves as a reminder that God will always guide our steps, even if just a little bit at a time.

Lead, Kindly Light

"Lead, Kindly Light, amidst the encircling gloom, Lead Thou me on! The night is dark, and I am far from home, Lead Thou me on! Keep Thou my feet; I do not ask to see The distant scene; one step enough for me.

I was not ever thus, nor prayed that Thou Shouldst lead me on; I loved to choose and see my path; but now Lead Thou me on! I loved the garish day, and, spite of fears,

Pride ruled my will. Remember not past years!

So long Thy power hath blest me, sure it still

Will lead me on.
O'er moor and fen, o'er crag and torrent, till
The night is gone,

And with the morn those angel faces smile, Which I have loved long since, and lost awhile!"

LIVE THE LITURGY INSPIRATION FOR THE WEEK

Did you ever wonder why so many images of a shepherd show him with a sheep around his neck? When sheep wander, they need to learn who to follow. A good shepherd realizes that in order for the animal to do this, there must be a bond so tight that they then "smell" like each other and the sheep can recognize the scent. Jesus has us around his neck. He wants us to follow him; not just his teachings, but in the relationship with his Father. Jesus shows us, by his life, suffering, death, and resurrection what we ought to do to be fully human and live as children of God. By bonding with those most poor and vulnerable, Jesus calls us to do the same and desires to be our Good Shepherd. As you worship here today, keep in mind an image of Jesus carrying you around his neck. He wants you to recognize him so that you can follow, especially when we find ourselves wandering away.

EVERYDAY STEWARDSHIP RECOGNIZE GOD IN YOUR ORDINARY MOMENTS

In the past year, my wireless provider introduced something called HD Voice. Suddenly, the voice I heard on my phone was unbelievably clear and it felt at times like both the caller and I were in the same room. The best aspect of this feature is that it didn't cost the customer any additional fees and it didn't require any changes to the phone. I could say it was free, but I suspect I was already paying for it in my monthly bill anyway. At least it felt free.

The clearer the voice calling you, the easier it is to recognize who it is on the other end of the call. How clearly can you hear the voice of Jesus Christ? In John's Gospel, Jesus speaks of the gatekeeper who opens the gate and calls for his sheep. They respond because they know his voice. Others try to lure the sheep when the gatekeeper is not there, but the sheep find their voices unclear or unfamiliar.

Jesus is our gatekeeper, but unlike receiving something for free from a wireless company, to be able to hear his voice we need to pay attention and practice listening. By developing a stewardship way of life that is mindful and prayerful, we become attuned to his voice and are able to discern when the call is from our Lord and when it is from an imposter. It is great to talk about all the things we can do and all the gifts we can share, but if are not listening for his call to hear where our offerings are needed, we can end up like a lost sheep searching for the gatekeeper.
