

CORPUS CHRISTI

This weekend we celebrate Corpus Christi (the Body of Christ). Here are some great quotes that help us reflect on the importance of the Eucharist:

"Today [said in 2011], Corpus Christi is being celebrated in Italy and in other countries. It is the Feast of the Eucharist, the Sacrament of the Body and Blood of the Lord, which he instituted at the Last Supper and which is the Church's most precious treasure. The Eucharist is, as it were, the beating heart that gives life to the whole mystical body of the Church... Without the Eucharist the Church quite simply would not exist. Indeed, it is the Eucharist which makes a human community into a mystery of communion that can bring God to the world and the world to God. The Holy Spirit, who transforms the bread and wine into the Body and Blood of Christ, also transforms whoever receives it with faith into a member of the body of Christ so that the Church is truly the sacrament of unity, of human beings with God and among themselves. In an ever more individualistic culture, such as the one in which we are immersed in western society and which tends to spread throughout the world, the Eucharist constitutes a sort of "antidote" that works in the minds and hearts of believers and continually sows in them the logic of communion, service and sharing, in short, the logic of the Gospel." - Pope Benedict XVI

THE CORPUS CHRISTI PROCESSION: A CATHOLIC TRADITION

Processing through the community with the Blessed Sacrament on the Feast of the Body and Blood of Christ (Corpus Christi) is a venerable Church tradition.

The procession is an outward demonstration of Catholic faith and belief in the Real Presence of Christ in the Eucharist. This is the foundation and source of our faith and will help us to grow in our devotion to the Blessed Sacrament and life of the church.

In his Apostolic Letter *Mane nobiscum Domine*, Saint John Paul II urged all Catholics to participate in Corpus Christi Processions as a public profession of their faith in the real presence of Christ in the Most Holy Sacrament.

CREATED FOR COMMUNION

With the COVID-19 pandemic subsiding, we can safely return to the Communion for which we were created. That is, we are created for communion with each other, and we are created for Holy Communion, "the source and summit of the Christian Life." (CCC 1324)

We are created for fellowship. Just as the Father, Son and Holy Spirit have a living union, so are we created to reflect their union in our relationships with others. It is through our relational nature that we recognize our vocations and grow in love and holiness.

We are created for the Eucharist. During the holy sacrifice of the Mass, Jesus Christ becomes truly present in the Eucharist. The Catechism tells us "The principal fruit of receiving the Eucharist in Holy Communion is an intimate union with Christ Jesus." (CCC 1391) How beautiful that Jesus has given us a way to be intimate with Him.

Welcome back to that for which you were created!

DIRECTOR OF RELIGIOUS EDUCATION (DRE)




