From the desk of Father Rudolph

Unity in Diversity...

I remember the very first time I went to a Catholic Mass. I had resisted more than one invitation before finally giving in. I was struck by the beauty of the building, the singing, and the joy and kindness of the priest. But what most moved my heart was the variety of people as they humbly and reverently lined up to receive Jesus Christ—Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity—in Holy Communion.

This was at Saint Stanislaus parish in Saint Paul. The priest was Fr. John Clay, who was pastor there for 48 years, and who just passed away last year. May he rest in peace.

I've been to many Masses in many parishes since then, before and after being ordained, but I've never lost that feeling of being moved by watching the people as they come up for Holy Communion.

There are young people, old people; skinny people, fat people; people in suits and dresses, and people in shorts and sandals. There are rich, poor; of every skin color; from every continent; documented and undocumented; speaking many languages; CEOs and custodians; extroverts and introverts. There are people with polished social skills and people who are socially awkward; joyful and depressed; intense and laid back; practicing good hygiene or smelling like a goat; healthy as a horse or as afflicted as Job.

In this Sunday's Second Reading, Saint James writes:

Show no partiality as you adhere to the faith in our glorious Lord Jesus Christ. For if a man with gold rings or fine clothes comes into your assembly, and a poor person in shabby clothes also comes in, and you pay attention to the one wearing the fine clothes and say, "Sit here, please," while you say to the poor one, "Stand there," or "Sit at my feet," have you not made distinctions among yourselves and become judges with evil thoughts? (James 2:1-4)

This admonition to "show no partiality" extends not only to relatively superficial differences such as I mentioned above, but also to differences in moral and political opinions and behavior. As followers of Jesus Christ, we are called to show respect, compassion and God's love equally to "progressives" and "conservatives"; people who've been vaccinated and those who haven't been; vets and pacifists; parents who send their kids to Catholic schools, other private schools, public schools or who homeschool; people who are living in matrimony and people who are living in sin. This doesn't mean we have to respect everyone's *opinions or behavior*—but we should respect *them*.

This is one way in which we can imitate God and His infinite Love—He who **"makes His sun rise on the evil and on the good, and sends rain on the just and the unjust"** (Matthew 5:45). It also helps draw people to the Lord. As the old saying goes, "You catch more flies with honey than with vinegar."

Just so no one misunderstands me—I am not saying that everyone should be able to receive Holy Communion. From the earliest days of the Church, this has been reserved for those who have professed faith in Jesus Christ, been baptized, are not aware of any grave unconfessed sins, and lead a life according to the teachings of the Catholic Church. As the 1983 Code of Canon Law puts it: "Those who have been excommunicated or interdicted after the imposition or declaration of the penalty and others obstinately persevering in manifest grave sin are not to be admitted to holy communion." (Canon 915). "A person who is conscious of grave sin is not to celebrate Mass or receive the body of the Lord without previous sacramental confession unless there is a grave reason and there is no opportunity to confess; in this case the person is to remember the obligation to make an act of perfect contrition which includes the resolution of confessing as soon as possible." (Canon 916)

Restrictions like the above are not a statement that some people are worthy to receive the Body and Blood of Christ, and some people are not. Who in this life is? Rather, limits on the reception of Holy Communion are attempts to protect folks from the spiritual harm that could come to them from receiving it in a state of grave sin—and also because the Eucharist is a sign of the unity of faith. May God's unconditional love for all people flow through us like a magnet, drawing them toward that unity in faith and love that makes out of diversity not an arena of battle, but a tapestry of beauty.

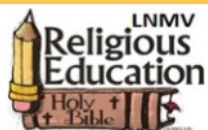
This week, contractors that are planning to bid on the project visited St. Nicholas to do a walkthrough. This will help them get an accurate price to perform the work.

SAINT OF THE DAY – Blessed Seraphina Sforza

Seraphina, whose baptismal name was Sueva, was born in Urbino, Italy in 1434. She suffered many losses as a child. When she was four, her mother Caterina died. Five years later her father Guidantonio died; three years after that her brother Oddanontio, who had been taking care of her, died. Then Sueva's stepbrother Federico briefly cared for her until she was sent to Rome to be brought up in the household of her uncle, Cardinal Prospero Colonna. When she was fourteen he agreed to an arranged marriage for her with Alessandro Sforza, a widower with two sons. They seemed to live happily together until he was called away to war. When he returned, their relationship soured. He had begun an affair with a local doctor's wife named Pacifica. Sueva tried to win back his heart, but he responded with physical cruelty, and finally kicked her out of the house. She found refuge in a house of Poor Clare nuns. Eventually she joined their community and took the name Seraphina. She prayed continually for her husband's conversion. Before he died in 1473, he came to the convent and asked her forgiveness. Seraphina was elected abbess of the convent in 1475 and died three years later, on September 8, 1478. Blessed Seraphina Sforza, pray for us! 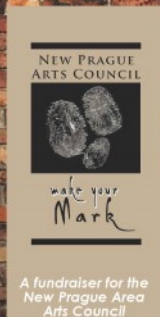
