From the desk of Father Rudolph

The God in the Mirror...

Recently I was having a conversation with a couple of Protestant pastors about our faith journeys. After I had explained how the Lord had brought me from atheism, through evangelical Protestantism, to the Catholic Church, one of them said something to this effect: "So, that's where you feel at home." I don't think she understood what I was trying to say. Feelings had nothing to do with my decision to become Catholic. On the contrary, I became convinced, through examining the evidence and reasoning, that the Catholic Church was the community of disciples that Jesus Christ established and has ever since been inviting everyone into the world to join.

Feelings alone are not a reliable guide to belief and behavior. They are a gift from God, good, but meant to be servants, not masters.

Many people have known this for thousands of years. For example, the ancient Greek philosopher Plato wrote a book called *The Republic*, in which he presents an imaginary conversation between several men about what an ideal—or just—society should be. The conclusion is that in a just society, there are three classes of men, each of which carries out their respective roles in harmony with the others. The guardians (rulers), who are also philosophers, are concerned with the wellbeing of the entire community and able to determine what that is by their superior knowledge. The auxiliaries (warriors) have as their concern to uphold the goals established by the guardians. The producers (farmers, craftsmen and so on) are motivated primarily by desires, such as for pay, security, the things that money can buy, and so on. In this just society, the auxiliaries and producers work to support the goals determined by the guardians.

Plato also applied this to what he describes as three parts of the human soul. Corresponding to the guardians is the rational part of the soul, which seeks after truth and is responsible for our philosophical inclinations. Corresponding to the auxiliaries is the spirited part of the soul, which desires honor and is responsible for our feelings of anger and indignation. Corresponding to the producers is the appetitive part of the soul, which desires many things. In a just person, his desires and passions support whatever is willed by his reason.

Sadly, for many people, it is the other way around. What they think is determined by what they want or feel. You can see this at work in the process by which many people, I think, leave the practice of the Catholic faith. It begins with recurring temptation to sin—often against the sixth commandment. At first there is resistance to the temptation. Then, after repeated falls, or getting weary of the battle, the person may start to wonder: "If this is wrong, why doesn't God protect me from experiencing this temptation, or keep me from falling?" This may go on to "Maybe these desires aren't wrong at all. Maybe God gave them to me to enjoy." This may go on to "If the Church is wrong about this, maybe it is wrong about other things too." This may go on to: "Why should I stay in the Church?" They fail to consider the rational reasons for believing in the authority of the Catholic Church and her teachings. Their horizon is limited to themselves. Their only god can be seen in the mirror.

Other people—I don't know how—apparently sincerely consider themselves Catholic but manage to rationalize disregarding some teachings of the Church while holding on to others. This is particularly harmful when it comes to life-and-death matters like abortion.

With that in mind, in case you haven't heard, Archbishop Salvatore Cordileone of San Francisco has started a Rose and Rosary campaign of prayer and fasting for the conversion of heart of Speaker of the House Nancy Pelosi, who was elected from his Archdiocese to the U. S. House of Representatives, and who, while Catholic, has been outspoken in her support for legal abortion, and opposed to restrictions on it, and so can hardly be said to be a faithful Catholic. You can sign up for praying the Rosary and fasting on Fridays for Speaker Pelosi's conversion of heart, and having a rose sent to her as a sign of your doing that, by going to the website of the Benedict Institute: benedictinstitute.org.

A god that you can see in the mirror is no more life-giving or stable than a leaf fallen from a tree and blown by the wind. Let's stick to the true and living God.

4:00 p.m.

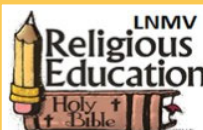
Cemetery Sunday is a day set aside to pray for the deceased and to visit the graves of loved ones and friends in a show of respect to those who have gone before us.

SAINTS OF THE DAY — Blessed Ursuline Nuns of Valenciennes

The Ursuline convent at Valenciennes in the north-east of France had been established in 1654; its nuns had run schools and looked after the poor of the neighborhood. After the anti-Catholic French Revolution broke out in 1789, a large number of religious houses were forcibly closed by the revolutionaries and many of their occupants condemned to death. Among these were the Ursuline nuns of Valenciennes. They were imprisoned in 1794. Five of them were brought to trial on October 17th; they stated openly that they were teaching the Catholic religion and were sentenced to death. As they were being led to the guillotine in the marketplace one of them, Marie Augustine Dejardin, spoke to the mother superior: "Mother, you taught us to be valiant, and now that we are going to be crowned, you weep!" Five days later the superior, Marie Clotilde Paillot, and the remaining five nuns were also executed, with the superior declaring publically, "We die for the faith of the Catholic, Apostolic and Roman Church!" A lay sister, Cordule Barré, had been overlooked by the public commissioners who had brought about the arrest of the nuns. Cordule on her own accord climbed into the cart taking the others to the guillotine, and was executed along with the rest. They went to their deaths singing the Litany of Our Lady. Blessed Ursuline Nuns of Valenciennes, pray for us! 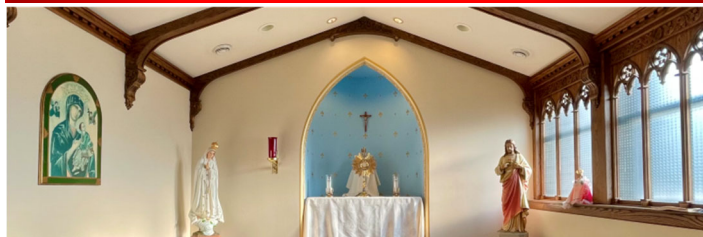


The Lonsdale Knights of Columbus Council 16225 hosted the annual Soccer Challenge at Holy Cross with 49 students participating from ages 9-13.

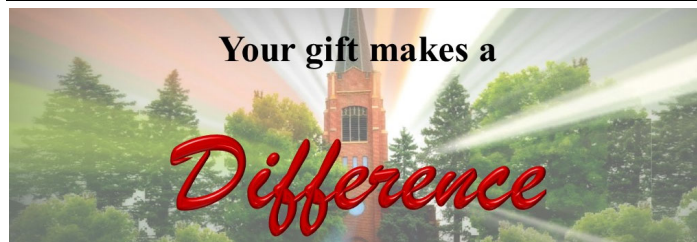

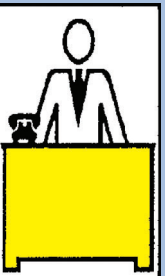
