The Smoke of God versus the Smoke of Satan...

Smoke, or a cloud, has been associated with the presence of the Lord for thousands of years. A column of cloud accompanied the Israelites on their journey from slavery in Egypt to the Promised Land, showing them where they should go (Exodus 13:21). After Moses had set up the meeting tent in the desert, a cloud settled down on it and filled it (Exodus 40:34-38). When Moses was preparing to climb Mount Sinai to receive God's commandments, the Lord told him that he was coming to him in a dense cloud (Exodus 19:9). When Solomon dedicated the Temple in Jerusalem, a cloud filled it (1 Kings 8:10-11). The Prophet Isaiah had a vision of the Lord on his throne in which the heavenly temple was filled with smoke (Isaiah 6:1-4). At the Transfiguration of Jesus Christ, God the Father spoke to the three apostles present from a bright cloud (Matthew 17:1-5). Saint John had a vision of heaven in which the sanctuary of God's Temple there became filled with smoke from God's glory and might (Revelation 15:8).

The use of incense in Jewish and Christian worship can be seen as a response to this cloud of God. Incense is not as dense as the visible sign of God's Glorious Presence, but it is a humble imitation and reminder of it. In fact, Sacred Scripture records incense being used in the worship of heaven: **"Another angel came and stood at the altar, holding a gold censer. He was given a great quantity of incense to offer, along with the prayers of all the holy ones, on the gold altar that was before the throne. The smoke of the incense along with the prayers of the holy ones went up before God from the hand of the angel"** (Revelation 8:3-4).

The Mass is the highest form of prayer on earth, and at the same time a participation in the worship of heaven. With this in mind, and with the Jewish roots of the Mass, it's not surprising that incense has remained a part of Mass in many Catholic churches. Here at Saint Nicholas, I started using incense at both Sunday morning Masses not long after I got here. I subsequently stopped doing so after feedback that it was bothering some people, but I've wondered ever since if that was a good decision. Recently I've come to the conclusion that the best way forward might be a compromise—using incense at the 10:00 am Mass but not the 8:00 am Mass on Sunday. That way people who like incense could come to the later Mass; those who don't could come to the earlier one. I plan to start this on the Solemnity of Christ the King, November 21, 2021.

There is another kind of smoke, referred to by Pope Saint Paul VI. In 1972, on the Feast of Saints Peter and Paul, he said: "From some fissure the smoke of Satan has entered the temple of God." Whereas the smoke of God is a sign of his glory and majesty, the smoke of Satan is a symbol of his deceit and sneakiness. As the Pope observed, it has infiltrated into the Church.

One type of institution that has been heavily infiltrated by the smoke of Satan is Catholic higher education. Many high schools, colleges and universities that claim to be Catholic are staffed in part by administrators and faculty member who openly teach things contrary to the Catholic faith. It's not surprising that so many young people, sent to these institutions by well-meaning parents, lose their Catholic faith at the very places that their parents hoped would strengthen it.

There are four Catholic colleges and universities in the United States that I have a great deal of confidence in and would recommend to any Catholic parent or student. They are Benedictine College in Atchison, Kansas; Saint Thomas Aquinas College in Santa Paula, California and Northfield, Massachusetts; University of Mary in Bismarck, North Dakota; and Franciscan University in Steubenville, Ohio. From what I've heard and read, they are largely free from the smoke of Satan. But watch out for Catholic institutions of higher learning that host organizations like Planned Parenthood, give awards to pro-abortion politicians, and mention "diversity," "inclusion" and "equity" more than "Jesus Christ." Another option for high school grads is to not go to any college. While a degree from one is required for some professions, you can also make a good living in the building trades, without stacking up a huge debt, and while filling a great need in our country.







SAINT OF THE DAY — Blessed Lucia of Narni

Lucia was born on December 13, 1476 in the town of Narni in the region of Italy known as Umbria. She was the oldest of eleven children. From an early age she wanted to consecrate her life to God, but her guardians—her father died when she was a child—had other ideas for her. At one point when she was fourteen, they tried to force her into marriage. Lucia threw the ring on the floor, slapped the face of the intended bridegroom, and ran from the room. But the next year she agreed to get married, upon the advice of her confessor and, she said, of Our Lady, who reportedly appeared to her in a vision.

Lucia married a young man named Pietro de Alessio, but it turned out to be a marriage in name only, and after about three years Pietro told her she was free to go and do as she pleased. She moved into her mother's house, then joined communities of Third Order Dominicans, first in Rome and then in Viterbo, where she received the stigmata, which appeared every Wednesday and Saturday. Lucia was examined by a number of Church authorities, including a bishop and Pope Alexander VI's personal physician. They all came as sceptics but left convinced that the phenomena were genuine. Her husband Pietro, too, came to see her and was convinced. He is said to have joined the Friars Minor (Franciscans) as a result.

Lucia then came under the influence of Ercole I, Duke of Ferrara. With her permission and that of the Pope, he built a convent for her in the town of Ferrara. Great obstacles were placed in the way of her leaving Viterbo, but finally she was smuggled out of town in a clothes basket strapped to the back of a mule. But once Lucia was installed as the convent's Superior, it became evident that she lacked the age, experience and gifts to carry out that role well. To add to her difficulties, the Duke's daughter-in-law recruited a number of recruits for the convent who were not suitable. Then, in 1505, Duke Ercole died. Deprived of her protector, Lucia, who had up until then filled the role imposed on her as a kind of fashionable mystic, moved into the hidden life in which she was to spend the last thirty-nine years of her life.

The new prioress treated Lucia with cruel harshness. But it was in these years that she earned her reputation for holiness. She was never impatient, and no one ever heard her complain, even when she was sick and left unattended. So complete was her self-effacement and obscurity that when she died on November 15, 1544, the people of Ferrara were surprised to find out that she had still been alive all those years. Lucia was venerated as a saint immediately and so many people came to pray at her tomb at the convent that it was moved to the cathedral, where miracles were attributed to her intercession. Blessed Lucia of Narni, pray for us!
