The King of Hearts...

When I was a teenager, I saw a comic film made in France in 1966 called "The King of Hearts." Starring Alan Bates, it is set in a small French town during the closing days of World War I. The Germans, who had occupied the town, are about to retreat from it in the face of the approaching Allied soldiers, in this case, Scots. Before they leave, they booby trap the town with a large hidden cache of explosives set to blow up at midnight, set off by a wire attached to a clock in a tower, hoping to kill the approaching Scotsmen. The Scots find out about the plot and send a soldier, Private Plumpick, to find and defuse the bomb.

As Plumpick approaches the village, it is nearly empty, the townspeople having fled to avoid being blown up. Carrying his cage with two carrier pigeons, he is spotted by a few remaining German soldiers and chased to an insane asylum. There he disguises himself as one of the inmates, who have been left behind by the villagers. Taking refuge behind a magnificent house of cards built by two patients who identify themselves as Bishop Hollyhocks and the Duke of Clubs, Plumpick tells the Germans that he is the "King of Hearts." The inmates instantly accept his word and proclaim to the others that the King has returned. When the Germans leave, Plumpick exits the asylum, leaving the door unlocked. The residents leave the asylum and joyfully take the place of the absent "sane" residents of the town.

Plumpick communicates with his commanders via his carrier pigeons. One of his messages is intercepted by the Germans, who return to see what is going on. As they do, Plumpick is being crowned King of Hearts in the town Cathedral by "Bishop Hollyhocks" and the other escapees from the asylum. Fearing for their safety, he tries to lead them out of town. They resist, and urge their "King" to stay with them, warning him that the countryside is full of wild beasts, and that "there is murder in their hearts." Plumpick tries to reason with one of them, the "Duke." He says to him, "My poor friend, you were all in the nuthouse only a few hours ago," "Jealous?" the duke inquires, "And where were you yesterday?" Plumpick stays, and at the last minute finds the explosive wire and prevents the intended disaster.

Another disaster happens, however. After midnight the German and Scottish soldiers both come into the village and begin killing each other, until none are left alive except Plumpick. With more Allied forces approaching, the inmates return to the asylum, shedding their costumes along the way. The town is reoccupied and the townspeople take up their normal places again. Private Plumpick, the sole survivor of the massacre, is awarded a medal and sent back into action immediately. The Germans are holding another village, he is told by a new commanding officer, and they are going to blow it sky high.

Plumpick has had enough. He jumps out of his troop truck, sheds his uniform, and rings for admission at the gates of the insane asylum. He stands bare naked, wearing only his humility, as the nuns who staff the asylum prepare to admit him. Between the gentle insanities of the residents within, and the horrifyingly real insanities of war without, Plumpick prefers the former.

To those outside the Church, we Catholic Christians often appear to be insane. Our beliefs that marriage is about one man and one woman, that sexual activity is meant just for marriage and is meant to be open to new life, that abortion is always wrong, that Christ calls only men to be ordained priests, that the Pope is the Vicar of Christ, that there really is a Heaven, Hell, Purgatory, and devil, that Jesus Christ is the sole Savior of the world, and that the true meaning of life is most fully revealed in His life, death and Resurrection, seem from their perspective to make the Catholic Church seem like one, big, world-wide insane asylum.

The Church is an asylum. "Asylum" means a place of refuge and safety. Admittedly, the Church has fallen short of this ideal many times, through the sins of us, her members. But at her best, just like the asylum in the movie, the Church is a place of refuge from the lies, violence and madness outside. But unlike the movie, the Church is not an insane asylum. It's a very sane asylum. Because the Church is the Body of Christ, who is Truth Itself.

Also like in the movie, we Christians have our "King of Hearts." But unlike the movie, our King of Hearts is so in reality. His name is Jesus Christ. He rules not with force, soldiers, police or prisons. He rules through love in hearts that let Him in, that stand naked before him, free from pride. May Jesus Christ reign forever in our hearts!





SAINT OF THE DAY — Saint Gelasius I

The family of Gelasius came from Africa. He was born in Rome in the early Fifth Century. He became a valued assistant and advisor to Pope Felix II, who reigned from 483 to 492. When Felix died, Gelasius took his place as Bishop of Rome. He had a couple of major crises to deal with right away. Many of the kings who ruled in Western Europe supported the Arian heresy. Also rival kings were waging war in Italy. Gelasius was a firm leader but could also compromise when necessary in political matters, for example with the Emperor. He also was a strong supporter of the doctrine that the Bishop of Rome is the successor of Saint Peter and as such is the leader of the other bishops of the world. He was probably the first pope to be called "vicar of Christ." Gelasius was also known for writing about the right relationship between religious authority and secular authority. He said that each is independent in its own sphere, although the spiritual is superior because it's the channel of salvation. People who knew Gelasius described him as humble, more interested in serving than ruling, prayerful, and very eager to serve the poor. He believed that bishops had the duty to give a quarter of their income to charity. Gelasius died in 496. Saint Gelasius, pray for us! 
