

From the desk of Father Rudolph

Can't Do, or Can Do?

One big difference between the Christian and secular worldviews is that Christians know that *with God all things are possible*. Jesus both said this (Matthew 19:26) and demonstrated it through many miracles. History outside the Bible shows it. And many of us have experienced it.

Beginning in 1519, Spaniards under Hernán Cortéz conquered the people of Mexico. Many of them were killed, enslaved, or died from smallpox. Along with the conquerors came Franciscan and Dominican friars to preach the Good News of Jesus Christ to the Mexicans. Not surprisingly, at first not many of them were interested in the religion of their oppressors. But soon after the Blessed Virgin Mary appeared to Saint Juan Diego in 1531 and left her beautiful image on his cloak, millions of the Mexican people became Christians. *With God all things are possible*.

In October of 1859, a young woman named Adele Brise encountered the Blessed Virgin Mary near what is now Champion, Wisconsin. Within a few years, the site of this visit became a shrine, with a chapel, convent, and school. Nine years after our Blessed Mother's visit to Adele, the Great Peshtigo fire broke out, killing between 1,200 and 2,400 people and burning about 1.2 million acres. As the fire, fueled by strong winds, approached the Shrine, people from the surrounding countryside fled to the Chapel, prayed the Rosary, and sang hymns. That night the fire was extinguished by a heavy rain. The morning light revealed a stark contrast. As a local priest, Father Peter Pernin, wrote at the time, "Everything about them was destroyed; miles of desolation everywhere. But the convent, school, and chapel on the holy land consecrated to the Virgin Mary shone like an emerald isle in a sea of ashes." *With God all things are possible*.

In 1986, the dictator of the Philippines, Fernando Marcos, fled the country after his country's military refused to crush peaceful protests organized by the Catholic bishops there and joined in by hundreds of thousands of Filipinos, about 85 percent of whom were Catholic. A Chicago Tribune newspaper headline read: "Guns Fell to Rosaries in Philippine Revolution." *With God all things are possible*.

By the end of the 1980's, Communists had been in power in Russia for about 70 years, and after World War II they had taken over the government of all the countries of Eastern Europe. Then, in the space of just two years—1989 and 1990—after the Soviet Union gave up trying to control them, all the countries of Eastern Europe became non-Communist democracies, and did so without fighting any violent revolutions. In 1917 at Fatima, the Blessed Virgin Mary had urged people to pray for the conversion of Russia. Millions did. *With God all things are possible*.

In recent years, there has been some strong criticism of what is called "reparative therapy," which aims to help people who experience same-sex attraction—but would rather experience attraction to the opposite sex—to explore the potential for change. Many people have called such therapy unethical, or have even called for it to be banned, arguing that sexual orientation is unchangeable. But there are people who have experienced a change from a homosexual to a heterosexual orientation. I know some of them myself. *With God all things are possible*.

When I was in the seminary, a married couple came to us who had separated and then gotten back together again. They had both come to their marriage with a strong Christian faith, but the husband had problems with his temper so strong that the wife and children had to separate to protect themselves. He got counseling for his anger problems and experienced wonderful healing. They were able to move back together again. *With God all things are possible*.

Let's reject the secular view that some things can't be done. With God all things are possible!



Saint of the Day – St. Godric of Finchale

Godric was born in Walpole, England about the year 1070 to peasant parents. Until middle age he worked as a travelling salesman to earn a living, at which he was very successful, but his real love was going on pilgrimages. He went to Rome (three times), Jerusalem, Santiago de Compostela in Spain and the Abbey of Saint-Gilles in France. When he was over forty years old he settled down in England at Finchale on the Wear River, as a hermit. At first he lived on roots and berries, later he grew vegetables and rye. He cut down trees to make a little hut in which he lived. He also built a little church out of stones next to his hut. He lived there for about fifty years. Although he liked solitude, visitors came to him for advice. He also liked to write songs, set to tunes similar to Gregorian chant. A contemporary described him as a good listener, always serious, and sympathetic to those in trouble. Without seeking it, he became famous, and even received a letter of encouragement from Pope Alexander III. The last ten years of his life he was bedridden, being cared for by the monks of nearby Durham Abbey. He died on May 21, 1170. Saint Godric of Finchale, pray for us! 
