From the desk of Father Rudolph

Big things from small groups...

Note from Father Rudolph: The following is adopted from the homily I gave last Sunday—in case you weren't there to hear it.

Saint Peter stepping out on the Sea of Galilee in imitation of Jesus Christ is an event that is acted out very movingly on the TV show "The Chosen." It's in Season 3, Episode 8. I recommend watching it if you get a chance. Appropriately, the theme song for "The Chosen" is "Walk on the Water." Why appropriately? Because Jesus Christ has chosen each one of us to do with him what we can't possibly do on our own.

For many of us, walking on water might seem only a little more difficult than something the leaders of our Church have been telling us to do for a long time. What's that? Evangelize! I think many of us might rather try stepping out onto the surface of a lake than try to talk about Jesus with another human being.

In telling us to evangelize, the popes and bishops have simply been passing on to us what Jesus told his apostles just before he ascended into heaven: "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you; and behold, I am with you always, to the close of the age."

Evangelization is something the Shepherd of our local Church, Archbishop Bernard Hebda, has in mind when he is asking every parish to be involved with the Archdiocesan Synod Process. Now I know that word "synod" might turn some of you off. I get that. You may have heard some things about other synods that alarm you. But rest your hearts—the Synod here in the Archdiocese of Saint Paul and Minneapolis has no connection with those other synods.

Here we are in a five-year Synod implantation process. Year 1, which started on July 1st, is devoted to small groups. Year 2 will be devoted to the Mass. Year 3 will be devoted to parents as primary educators. We don't know what Year 4 and 5 will be devoted to. I think the Archbishop may be waiting to hear from the Holy Spirit on that one.

I'm excited to let you know something about what you can expect in this year devoted to small groups. Here at St. Nick's we have an eight member synod evangelization team. They are Angie Nicolai, Chris McAllister, Lynda and Mike Cole, Marlin Hennen, Rochelle Ibarra, Shawn Overgaard, and Steve Addabbo. Last winter they and I went through a School of Discipleship, and in the Spring met for a Parish Small Group Visioning Day and an Activated Discipleship Seminar. Three of the members of the evangelization team coordinate its work as an executive cell (small group) team. They are Angie, Chris, and Mike. Rochelle is helping them out as their secretary.

The members of the synod evangelization team are preparing something that a lot more parishioners will get to be involved in. It's a seven-week small group leader formation series this fall. Many of you will be getting invitations to it. "Seven weeks!" Please, don't freak out! I was in seminary six years. And I know that some of you have been blessed to go through the Catechetical Institute, which has a two-year program. Seven weeks is not that long.

Going to this training won't commit you to anything. But it will give you some perks. If you are already involved in leading a small group of some kind, the training can equip you to be an even better leader. If you think God might be calling you to lead a small group, but aren't sure, the training can help you discern that. If you think the parish needs a kind of small group that it doesn't already have, the training might help you be able to get it going. At the very least, the training could teach you some helpful interpersonal skills. If you don't get invited to the training, feel free to volunteer for it. Step out in faith! Any new small groups are supposed to be launched by Ash Wednesday of next year.

Saint Peter was able to walk on water when Jesus called him. Whatever God is calling us to do—as individuals and as a parish—we will be able to do. Let's not worry about getting wet.

Saint of the Day - Saint Maria de Mattias

Maria was born in Vallecorsa, Italy in 1805, the oldest of four children. Her father was an attorney. In 1834, she was asked by a bishop to take charge of a school in his diocese. She decided to not only teach, but to start a religious house. She welcomed her first recruit, Anna Farrotti, the next year, and they committed themselves to the establishment of a religious congregation, known as the Sisters Adorers of the Precious Blood. Maria had the gift of straightforward and convincing speech. She used this to good effect in teaching religion and in the girls' and women's societies she organized. She also led spiritual exercises for mothers of families. Other foundations followed, and the work for adult women and girls expanded. Maria died at the age of 61 on August 20, 1866, in Rome. During her lifetime, the Congregation established over 70 communities throughout Europe, and eventually expanded into other continents. Saint Maria de Mattias, pray for us! CAPITAL CAMPAIGN CORNER

As of 8/16/2023, the total pledged is \$971,676 less \$23,753 pledges withdrawn for a net of \$947,923 in pledges. The total payments received is \$849,971. **THANK YOU** to all who have made a commitment! **Pledges/donations can still be made.** Please consider supporting this campaign to enhance the life of our parish. PROJECT UPDATES

The tuck pointing has resumed. Although much progress will be made in the tuck pointing, we have only addressed the more urgent areas on the church and the JPII building in this capital campaign. The remaining tuckpointing is not so urgent and can be done in the next 5 - 10 years. 6,600 sq. ft. remains to be tuck pointed on the church at an estimated cost of \$226,000. We are awaiting an estimate for the remaining tuck pointing to be completed on the JPII building.

Also, this fall we plan to have the cheek walls (stone walls on the sides of the steps) rebuilt on the west entrance, the west steps overlayed with new concrete, and a new patio and sidewalks poured on the west side of the church.

More concrete work is planned for spring after we address the water issues in church. The remaining concrete work and water remediation work is not included in this capital campaign.

During these three years, situations arise such as donors moving out of town or facing financial challenges or deaths. So far we have been notified of \$23,000 of pledges that will be unfulfilled.
