

From the desk of Father Rudolph

Watching and Running...

Recently I was blessed to hear from a young woman about some life-changing encounters she experienced. One was the appearance of the Blessed Virgin Mary to her in a dream, telling her that a wonderful but seemingly unlikely reunion would happen the next day. It did. The other, also in a dream, was a visit from Our Lord Jesus Christ, who had eyes like fire, as described in the Book of Revelation (1:14). In both dreams, she was in a place of whiteness and peace. Some people have gotten visits *from* heaven. It sounds like this woman was brought temporarily *to* heaven. Both dreams had profound, positive spiritual effects on her. Genuine appearances and words of Our Lord and Our Lady always do.

Over the years, I've heard from a number of people who have either personally experienced visions of Jesus or Mary or know people who have. When the fruit is good, I have no reason to doubt them. And why should we doubt? Jesus promised to be with his disciples always, until the end of the age (Matthew 28:20). Some of these ways are public—in the Holy Eucharist, the Gospels, the disguise of the poor, the ministry of a priest, and wherever two or three are gathered in his name. But he comes to people in private ways, too, whether it's a sense of his loving and encouraging presence, a message in our mind, an appearance in a dream, seeing him with our waking eyes, or hearing him with our ears. As for the many apparitions of the Blessed Virgin Mary, she is continuing to respond to her Divine Son's words on the cross in reference to Saint John: "Woman, behold, your son!" (John 19:26) by lovingly reaching out to us as her spiritual sons and daughters.

This Sunday is the beginning of the Liturgical Season of Advent, when we try to focus our minds and hearts on the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ. The Readings for Mass start with admonitions to watch for the coming of the Lord at the end of time, and be prepared, for we do not know when that will be. Later in Advent, the Readings go backward in time to the birth of Christ. That may seem strange, but it makes sense if you think about it. Knowing the culmination of God's plan of salvation in Christ can help us better appreciate its initiation, like knowing the possibilities after graduation from a trade school, college or university can help a student better appreciate starting school and persevering in his or her studies.

The prayers of the Church during Advent speak not only of watching for Christ—that is, to being prepared for his coming—but also to running to meet him when he arrives. For example, here's the collect (opening prayer) for this Sunday's Mass:

Grant your faithful, we pray, almighty God, the resolve to run forth to meet your Christ with righteous deeds at his coming, so that, gathered at his right hand, they may be worthy to possess the heavenly Kingdom. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, God, for ever and ever.

Is it presumptuous to think of running to meet the Lord? Shouldn't we instead imagine falling to our knees, face to the ground, pleading for mercy? Not if we meet him with a heart cleansed by his mercy, and joyful and full of love from countless meetings with Jesus in this life. So let us watch—in humility for sure—but also prepared to run.

Saint of the Day - Saint Crispina

Crispina was from the town of Thagara in Numidia, a province of the Roman Empire in North Africa that is now part of the nation of Algeria. She was arrested in the year 304 and brought before the proconsul (governor) Anulinus in the town of Theveste. She was charged with ignoring the imperial commands to offer sacrifice to all the Roman "gods." At her trial, she repeatedly stated that there is only one God, and that she would worship and offer sacrifice only to him, and to his Son, the Lord Jesus Christ. She also said that it is no true religion that forces the unwilling. Later in the interrogation, Crispina referred to the "gods" of Rome as demons. Anulinus said, "I will have you beheaded if you persist in mocking our venerable gods." Crispina replied, "Thank God for that. I should certainly lose my head if I took to worshipping them." Finally, Anulinus sentenced her to death by the sword, to which she replied, "Praise to God, who has looked down and delivered me out of your hands!" Crispina was executed in Theveste on December 5, 304. Saint Crispina, pray for us!
