#### From the desk of Father Rudolph

#### Holy only by God's Grace...

As we celebrate the Feast of the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph, we might be stirred to feelings of love and devotion for them, but at the same time feel pangs of inadequacy. How can we measure up to their example, as the Church encourages us to? Jesus and Mary were without sin, and Sacred Scripture doesn't record any shortcomings on the part of Saint Joseph. In contrast, we are probably well aware of our own sinfulness as well as some of the faults of our loved ones.

One way to go forward in hope can be seen in the collect (opening prayer) of this Sunday's Mass, part of which reads: "O God, who were pleased to give us the shining example of the Holy Family, graciously grant that we may imitate them in practicing the virtues of family life and in the bonds of charity." There are many virtues of family life. The Church, in this prayer, singles out one virtue as preeminent, namely charity—the kind of love God has, which is sacrificial, patient, generous, self-giving, and unconditional. We may not be able to do this yet as well as Jesus, Mary and Joseph, but with God's help we can make a good start. Receiving the Body and Blood in a state of grace is the most potent way to become like God in how we love. Another way is to say prayers like: "Lord, help me to experience your love for other people and myself," "Lord, please love other people through me," "Lord, help me to love other people with your love," and "Lord, I pray other people will see you in me."

The love of the Holy Family didn't just stay in their household. It was manifested in how they loved their neighbors in Bethlehem, Egypt, and Nazareth, including those whose relationships were far from perfect. Human nature being what it is, I'm sure they knew some people who conceived children with partners they weren't married to, and couples who were living together without being married. There may even have been some same-sex couples, at least among those pagan Greeks and Romans who were living among the Jews, and whose cultures tolerated such activities, unlike Judaism. (The Law of Moses given to the Jews by God states: "If a man lies with a male as with a woman it is an abomination" (Leviticus 20:13).)

My guess is that Jesus, Mary and Joseph treated people in these irregular or immoral relationships with the same charity they shared with each other in their own household. That doesn't mean pretending sin is OK, calling evil good, or neglecting to call people to repent and change their lives with God's help, but it does mean treating everyone with respect and kindness. That's another way the Holy Family can be a good example for us today.

Some people may not understand yet what God's plan is for sexuality and marriage, and so are living in ways contrary to Sacred Scripture and the teachings of the Catholic Church. But putting them down for their behavior, or treating them like they are second-class, won't help draw them to the truth. Sure, people need to hear about right and wrong. But we should be discreet and respectful when helping people find the right path. Above all, we should keep in mind these words of Jesus: "If you continue in my word, you are truly my disciples, and you will know the truth, and the truth will make you free" (John 8:31-32). It is very difficult, if not impossible, to know or understand the truth without first getting to know Jesus Christ. With God's help, may we help everyone do that.

Thank you to the generous donors who have supported our Faith in Our Future capital campaign.

We are nearing the final stretch our 3-year Faith in Our Future Capital Campaign and are pleased to give you an update. The original budget for each project is in *red*.

For those of you who have not yet pledged, we invite you to join the many others who have made a sacrificial gift to our parish. Pledge cards are available in the back of church or you may donate on our parish website, <u>stncc.net</u>.

#### PROJECT DETAILS - PROGRESS UPDATE

ELEVATOR LIFT (\$422,746): The church does not have handicapped access to the lower-level gathering space and restrooms. The project will also include a new entrance on the north side of the building and an ADA Compliant staircase connecting the church, basement, and parking lot. Completed for \$424,096.

TUCKPOINTING (\$150,000): Due to the age of our campus buildings, the brickwork in some areas is deteriorating. The maintenance required includes cleaning, repairing, recaulking, and resealing masonry. Completed for \$229,453. This project was over budget due to inflation, expanded scope to include part of bell tower and unexpected expenses to replace footings for the new cheek walls. Note: Tuckpointing the remainder of the church is not included in the capital campaign and has been paid for by two anonymous parish families. The additional tuckpointing work will be completed in 2024.

STAIR AND SIDEWALK REPAIR (\$12,000): Several stairs and sidewalks are cracked or crumbling and need to be repaired to ensure all walking surfaces are safe. Completed for \$11,305. Note: Additional stairs and sidewalks will be needed due to the water remediation work and will be paid for using the maintenance fund.

JPII BUILDING REMODEL (\$96,995): The JPII building currently houses the adoration chapel, youth room, and meeting room. Extensive renovations have already been completed with minimal cost to the parish. Now we need to accomplish the following projects to finish upgrading the building:

- Office space completion (\$5,000): The new office location will provide more space conducive to welcoming visitors as well as providing much-needed storage space.
   Completed for \$2,872.
- Window replacement (\$8,000): Most windows throughout the building have lost their gas seal and need to be replaced. Glazing only. Completed for \$6,617
- Exterior door replacement (\$28,455): The exterior doors were installed when the building was built in 1916 and are rusting, do not fit in the frames, and are no longer weather- proofed. New doors will be more energy-

efficient and provide a more secure building. *Completed for \$31,305*.

• Electrical panel expansion (\$26,630): The electrical system in the building was designed to meet lesser power demands from decades ago. However, the need for air conditioning, the expanded use of technology, and other electrical equipment in the building has created an increased demand for power. Completed for \$24,110.

Air conditioning installation (\$28,910): To allow the new office and meeting space to be comfortably used throughout the year, air conditioning will be installed. *Completed for* \$16.080.

#### CAMPUS IMPROVEMENTS (\$20,000):

- Men's restroom updates (\$15,000): New plumbing is needed for some of the fixtures. Also, water leaking into this room from outside the building needs to be addressed. *Pending*.
- Church speaker replacement (\$5,000): To improve sound quality and allow parishioners throughout the church to fully hear and participate, we will install new amplifiers and speakers in the church. Completed. Note: The scope of this project was expanded and paid for by an anonymous donor couple in the amount of \$13,441.

#### RECTORY REMODEL (\$25,000):

- Kitchen remodel (\$20,000): Moving the parish offices to the JPII building will allow the rectory to be used solely as our priest's residence. Our goal is to enlarge the kitchen and remodel the former office space to create a chapel in the rectory. *Pending*.
- Furnace replacement (\$5,000): The 25-year-old furnace no longer has replacement parts made for it and needs to be replaced before complete system failure. A new heating system will provide significant cost savings for maintenance and utilities. Completed for \$4,700.

MAINTENANCE FUND (\$200,000): Establishing a Maintenance Fund that can be accessed when needed will create financial security by ensuring our ability to address significant maintenance issues in the future rather than putting them off due to insufficient funds. Projected to be used for expenses related to water remediation.

#### Saint of the Day – Saint Columba

According to tradition, Columba was a Spanish girl who, when she was sixteen, moved to Gaul (now France) with some other Spaniards and settled at Sens, possibly in the third century. She is said to have been the child of noble but pagan parents and to have left them to avoid the worship of false gods. She was baptized at Vienne. When the Emperor Aurelian came to Sens he ordered Columba and her companions to be put to death. She was beheaded at the fountain of Azon on the road to Meaux. Devotion to Columba spread over France and Spain and to Italy. The abbey of Sainte-Colombe, which sheltered her relics, was the chief religious house of Sens. Its third church was consecrated by Pope Alexander III in 1164. Saint Columba, pray for us!
