From the desk of Father Rudolph

Lining up for Lent...

Lent starts this Wednesday. As we accompany Jesus on his 40 days fast in the wilderness, it's a good time to think more deeply about our sins, which led Our Savior in his great love to lay down his life on the cross for our salvation.

What exactly is sin? According to the *Catechism of the Catholic Church*:

Sin is an offense against reason, truth, and right conscience; it is failure in genuine love for God and neighbor caused by a perverse attachment to certain goods. It wounds the nature of man and injures human solidarity. It has been defined as "an utterance, a deed, or a desire contrary to the eternal law." (1849)

Sin is an offense against God: "Against you, you alone, have I sinned, and done that which is evil in your sight." Sin sets itself against God's love for us and turns our hearts away from it. Like the first sin, it is disobedience, a revolt against God through the will to become "like gods," knowing and determining good and evil. Sin is thus "love of oneself even to contempt of God." In this proud self-exaltation, sin is diametrically opposed to the obedience of Jesus, which achieves our salvation. (1850)

The two legs that sins walk on are pride and selfishness.

My guess is that just about everyone reading this has a pretty good idea of what actions are sinful. It's pretty easy to know what constitutes sin if we read the Bible, learn the teachings of the Catholic Church, and pay attention to our subsequently well-formed consciences. So, for today, I'm not going to go write much more about sins. Instead, I'm thinking it might be more helpful to mention some things that are *not sins* that some people think are:

1. Forgetting to do something.
2. Making a mistake.
3. Doing something by accident.
4. Not doing something as well as we could have.
5. Being tempted or attracted by sin.
6. Having thoughts about sin pop into our head.
7. Experiencing emotions, for example anger, fear, frustration, sadness, or anxiety.
8. Having desires.
9. Having our minds involuntarily wander during Mass or other prayers.

The above examples are just part of being a human being in this life. Only God doesn't experience them. Sins, in contrast, are things we *choose* to do or not to do.

Sin darkens the intellect and weakens the will. The sacrament of reconciliation wipes away our sins, and the sacrament of the Eucharist strengthens our will. Praise God that we can have confessions and Mass seven times each week here at St. Nick's. Let's take advantage of these great gifts from God, plus other ones like penance services and stations of the cross, as we journey through this great season of Lent.



Saint of the Day – Saint Ermengild

Ermengild (also known as Ermenilda) was born in the first half of the seventh century in the Kingdom of Kent, in England. Her father was the king there. She had many holy relatives. Her mother Sexburga was also declared a saint, as were her aunt Etheldreda and her daughter Werburga. Ermengild was described as sweet-tempered, humble, chaste, and just. She married Wulfhere, king of Mercia (another English kingdom). She was instrumental in converting him to Christianity, and under her influence he did much to spread the faith in his kingdom. After Wulfhere died, Ermengild joined her mother, who was building an abbey at Minster on the Isle of Sheppey, off the north coast of Kent. She became a nun there, then abbess after her mother retired. Saint Ermengild, pray for us!
