As you receive this newsletter, we will be approaching the season of Lent. Lent: a time of prayer, sacrifice, and almsgiving. The tradition of Lent goes back to the very beginning of the Church. Lent, as a term, does not appear in the Bible. However, the practices we follow during Lent are very Biblical. As you will see in this edition of Proclamation!, there is a lot more to Lent than just giving up candy or chocolate. It is a time for all of us to grow closer and closer to Jesus, so we will be prepared for Holy Week, Good Friday, and best of all, Easter Sunday.

The Bible quote above is a great reminder for us to enter Lent with joyful hearts. We should willingly and happily use Lent as a time to not just "give up stuff", but really to consider and do HIS will. It's easy to do the things we want to do.
