

## MESSAGE FROM ARCHBISHOP GUSTAVO



Persecuted Christians around the world face cold prisons, social exile, and even death. Still, they stand firm in prayer and praise. Christ's rising, God shows He never abandons His own. We hope for that mystery to strengthen you when trials come. In the face of hardship, God fights for us. God will battle every obstacle – injustice, indifference, hatred – and bring you through by His grace. Trust in His power, not in spectacular signs. Pope Leo XIV invites us to live as a missionary Church of mercy. He tells us that the Holy Spirit “breaks down barriers and tears down the walls of indifference and hatred because He ‘teaches us all things’ and ‘reminds us of Jesus’ words’ (cf. Jn 14:26).” Let those words inspire your zeal. Build bridges of dialogue where walls of fear exist. Bring the light of Christ to those who have lost hope. Dear friends, gratitude and solidarity go hand in hand. Stand with persecuted Christians through prayer, witness, and practical support. In humility and trust, walk forward.

## MEDITATION OF THE SCRIPTURES



The second reading from the Letter to the Colossians goes well with the first reading and the Gospel. Those passages warn how useless material wealth will be when we die. St. Paul continues this warning by reminding us that we have already died with Christ in baptism and risen to new life. To live this new life we must put to death whatever tendencies keep us from Christ. Wealth can be a gift from God. The abuse is not necessarily in the possession of wealth. More likely, we abuse wealth in the way we attain it. How does that happen? I can give an obvious answer such as robbing a bank. Instead, do I work a full day for my pay, or do I spend a lot of time visiting with other employees or texting my friends? Am I honest with my customers, charging only for work I have done? As for using our wealth, we usually think of family first. Do we spoil our kids, so they can “have the things I couldn’t afford when I was young”? Or do we teach them to work for what they get? Do we teach our children to be generous to others? Notice that Paul goes deeper, pointing out the thoughts and desires that lead to a life centered in wealth. In baptism we put to death passion and greed, tendencies that push us to own more or to control another person. Paul uses the image of taking off these vices as if they were clothing and putting on a new self that shows Christ in us. We begin to see Christ in others, for as Paul says, “Christ is all and in all” (Colossians 3:11). -Tom Schmidt

## FR. RICHARD'S MEDITATION ON FORGIVENESS.



**WHY IS SO DIFFICULT TO FORGIVE?** Most believers know the importance of forgiveness (e.g., Matt 6:12-15 and Matt 18:32-35). This talk underscores Jesus' mandate to forgive and addresses a crucial question: **Why do we have such trouble practicing something so central to our faith?** As you listen, invite the Holy Spirit

to help you recognize the obstacles to true forgiveness. Forgiveness is good for us, materially and spiritually. It unlocks areas of our life that have been blocked from the Father's blessing. Jesus commands us to forgive those who hurt us. It's not an option. Refusing to forgive is a sin. Forgiveness is letting go of our right to be angry, our right to be repaid, and our judgment of the other person. It's leaving everything to the merciful justice of God. There are four reasons we don't forgive: pride, fear, doubt, and deception.

- **Pride:** the antidote is **LOVE**, knowing how much we've been forgiven and realizing we can never earn mercy.
- **Fear:** the antidote is **FAITH**, trusting God will protect us and that we don't have to use resentment and anger as a shield to protect ourselves.
- **Doubt:** the antidote is **HOPE**, believing in the power of God to free us from unforgiveness, trusting that He can release us from the trap of emotional pain and bitterness.
- **Deception:** the antidote is **TRUTH**. We need to get clear about what forgiveness is and what it's not.

**Faith=Freedom!** If Jesus Christ came to set us free, then our spiritual journey should look like an exodus. Through baptism into His death, the Son of God leads us through the waters of the Red Sea, and through participation in His resurrection, we rise again to new life in the Promised Land, where we rise again to new life in the Promised Land, where we are free sons and daughters. The Church teaches us that spiritual battle is real. Our enemy is not ourselves or other people or circumstances. **Our enemy is THE enemy., the Devil**

The devil attacks us to hurt God's heart, thwart His plan in the world, and tear us away from God's family so he can take others down with us. Satan conducts his campaign against us with lies. Behind every sin is a lie attacking God the Father; Satan wants to erase the image of the Father from our hearts. When he succeeds, we live like anxious orphans, grasping for protection, promotion, power, or pleasure wherever we can. May the Lord place His healing hand in the heart of all who cant forgive. Amen







### MENSAJE DEL ARZOBISPO GUSTAVO




Quisiera compartir algunas reflexiones sobre nuestra oración por las vocaciones, las llamadas a servir a la mies de Dios, y en particular sobre los ministros eclesiales laicos que, como los primeros discípulos, enseñan, pastorean y sanan en el nombre de Cristo. El corazón de nuestra oración vocacional no es simplemente pedir a Dios obreros, sino comprometernos a buscar y apoyar a aquellos que Él llama, hombres y mujeres que estarán en medio de la gente, proclamando el Evangelio con palabras y obras. Los discípulos misioneros comprometidos construyen la comunidad coordinando la catequesis, guiando grupos de oración, visitando a los enfermos y formando discípulos. En solidaridad con la oración, reconocemos que los ministros laicos son pioneros en nuevas expresiones de ministerio, respondiendo a las necesidades emergentes en nuestras parroquias, escuelas y alcance social. Pidamos al Dueño de la mies que suscite hombres y mujeres de oración y de servicio: catequistas que difundan la luz de la Escritura; coordinadores pastorales que promueven la comunión; músicos pastorales que elevan los corazones al cielo; y a todos los ministros laicos que enriquecen el Cuerpo de Cristo. Que nuestra oración persistente produzca abundantes obreros, cada uno portador de la luz de Cristo para nuestro mundo.

### REFLEXIÓN DE LAS ESCRITURAS



La segunda lectura de la Carta a los Colosenses encaja perfectamente con la primera lectura y el Evangelio. Estos pasajes nos advierten que las riquezas materiales serán inútiles al morir. San Pablo continúa esta advertencia recordándonos que ya hemos muerto con Cristo en el bautismo y resucitamos a una vida nueva. Para vivir esta vida nueva, debemos dar término a cualquier tendencia que nos aleje de Cristo. La riqueza puede ser un regalo de Dios. El abuso de ella no existe necesariamente en poseerla. Es más probable que abusemos de ella en la forma en que la obtenemos. ¿Cómo sucede esto? Puedo dar una respuesta obvia, como robar un banco. En cambio, ¿trabajo un día completo para ganar mi sueldo o dedico mucho tiempo a visitar a otros empleados o a enviar mensajes a mis amigos? ¿Soy honesto con mis clientes, cobrando solo por el trabajo realizado? En cuanto al uso de la riqueza, solemos pensar primero en la familia. ¿Consentimos a nuestros hijos para que puedan tener las cosas que yo no podía tener de joven? ¿O les enseñamos a trabajar por lo que obtienen? ¿Enseñamos a nuestros hijos a ser generosos con los demás? Observemos que Pablo va más a fondo, señalando los pensamientos y deseos que conducen a una vida centrada en la riqueza. En el bautismo, damos término a la pasión y la avaricia, tendencias que nos impulsan a poseer más o a controlar a otra persona. Pablo utiliza la imagen de despojarse de estos vicios como si fueran ropas y revestirse de un nuevo ser que demuestra a Cristo dentro de nosotros. Comenzamos a ver a Cristo en los demás, porque, como dice Pablo: "Cristo es todo en todos" (Colosenses 3,11). -Tom Schmidt

### REFLEXION ACERCA DEL PERDON PADRE RICHARD



¿Por qué es tan difícil perdonar? La mayoría de los creyentes conocen la importancia del perdón (por ejemplo, Mateo 6:12-15 y Mateo 18:32-35). Esta charla subraya el mandato de Jesús de perdonar y aborda una pregunta crucial: **¿Por qué tenemos tantos problemas para practicar algo tan central para nuestra fe?** Mientras escuchas, invita al Espíritu Santo a que te ayude a reconocer los obstáculos para el verdadero perdón. El perdón es bueno para nosotros, material y espiritualmente. Desbloquea áreas de nuestra vida que han sido bloqueadas de la bendición del Padre. Jesús nos ordena perdonar a los que nos lastiman. **No es una opción. Negarse a perdonar es un pecado.** El perdón es dejar de lado nuestro derecho a estar enojados, nuestro derecho a ser recompensados y nuestro juicio sobre la otra persona. Es dejar todo a la justicia misericordiosa de Dios. **Hay cuatro razones por las que no perdonamos: orgullo, miedo, duda y engaño.**  
**Orgullo:** el antídoto es el AMOR, saber cuánto hemos sido perdonados y darnos cuenta de que nunca podremos ganarnos la misericordia.

**Miedo:** el antídoto es la FE, confiar en que Dios nos protegerá y que no tenemos que usar el resentimiento y la ira como escudo para protegernos.

**Duda:** el antídoto es la ESPERANZA, creer en el poder de Dios para liberarnos de la falta de perdón, confiando en que Él puede liberarnos de la trampa del dolor emocional y la amargura.

**Engaño:** el antídoto es la VERDAD. Necesitamos tener claro qué es el perdón y qué no es.

**¡Fe = Libertad!** Si Jesucristo vino a liberarnos, entonces nuestro viaje espiritual debería verse como un éxodo. A través del bautismo en Su muerte, el Hijo de Dios nos guía a través de las aguas del Mar Rojo, y a través de la participación en Su resurrección, nos elevamos de nuevo a una nueva vida en la Tierra Prometida, donde nos levantamos de nuevo a una nueva vida en la Tierra

La Iglesia nos enseña que la batalla espiritual es real. Nuestro enemigo no somos nosotros mismos ni otras personas o circunstancias. Nuestro enemigo es EL enemigo, el Diablo El diablo nos ataca para herir el corazón de Dios, frustrar su plan en el mundo y separarnos de la familia de Dios para que pueda llevar a otros con nosotros.

Que el Señor ponga su mano sanadora en el corazón de todos los que no pueden perdonar. Amén en Cristo, P. Richard



# Texas Catholic Conference of Bishops

**KNOW YOUR RIGHTS:** Regardless of your immigration status, you have certain rights. Know your rights when you are encountering any law enforcement official or government official.

1. You have the right to remain silent. It is your right to refuse to speak to any law enforcement official: federal, state or local.
2. If you are not a U.S. citizen and an immigration agent requests your immigration papers, you must show them if you have them with you. Carry all immigration documentation with you at all times.
3. You have the right to ask for and review a warrant before law enforcement enters your home. An immigration-related warrant of removal does not give law enforcement the right to enter your home.
4. You have the right to speak with an attorney. The government is not required to provide you with an attorney, but you have the right to retain one.
5. You have the right not to sign anything until an attorney has reviewed the document and can explain the consequences of signing the document. If you sign the document before you understand it fully you may voluntarily give up legal rights.
6. If you are approached by a law enforcement officer, do not run. You have the right not to answer questions. Running may give the officer probable cause to detain or arrest you.
7. You have the right to contact your local consulate and request assistance when detained at an immigration detention facility.

In Texas, a passenger in a vehicle has the right not to provide identity documents unless there is probable cause to detain them, such as visible criminal activity.

1 Prepare a Family Emergency Plan

2 Prepare for emergencies by creating a family disaster plan that includes the following:

1. Contact information of a licensed immigration attorney, preferably a member of the American Immigration Lawyers Association (AILA).

If you have children who are U.S. citizens, complete an Authorization Agreement for Voluntary Adult Caregiver that allows a Texas resident to designate a family member or friend to take custody of his or her children while he or she is unavailable. Forms and instructions are available in English, Spanish and Vietnamese at [texaslawhelp.org/article/authorization-for-nonparent-care-of-a-child](https://texaslawhelp.org/article/authorization-for-nonparent-care-of-a-child) and on the Texas State Department of Family and Protective Services website at [www.dfps.texas.gov/site\\_map/forms.asp](https://www.dfps.texas.gov/site_map/forms.asp).

1. File a Power of Attorney to designate an agent that can handle any business, property or other personal affairs in your absence. It is necessary for an attorney to file the Power of Attorney with the court.

Keep all identity and immigration documents together with the information listed above.

**CONOZCA SUS DERECHOS:** Independientemente de su estatus migratorio, usted tiene ciertos derechos. Sea consciente de sus derechos cuando se encuentre con cualquier funcionario de las fuerzas del orden o funcionario del gobierno.

1. Tiene derecho a permanecer en silencio. Es su derecho negarse a hablar con cualquier funcionario de las fuerzas del orden, ya sea federal, estatal o local.
2. Si no es ciudadano de Estados Unidos y un agente de migración le solicita sus documentos migratorios, usted debe mostrarlos si los tiene consigo. En todo momento lleve con usted toda su documentación migratoria.
3. Tiene derecho a solicitar y revisar una orden judicial antes de que las fuerzas del orden ingresen a su domicilio. Una orden de deportación relacionada con la migración no le da a las fuerzas del orden el derecho de ingresar a su hogar.
4. Tiene derecho a hablar con un abogado. El gobierno no está obligado a proporcionarle un abogado, pero usted tiene derecho a contratar uno.
5. Tiene derecho a no firmar documento alguno hasta que un abogado lo haya revisado y pueda explicarle las consecuencias de firmarlo. Si firma el documento antes de comprenderlo completamente, usted podría renunciar voluntariamente a sus derechos.
6. Si se le acerca un agente de las fuerzas del orden, no corra. Tiene derecho a no responder preguntas. Si corre, el agente podría tener una causa probable para detenerlo o arrestarlo.
7. Tiene derecho a comunicarse con su consulado local y solicitar asistencia cuando se encuentre detenido en un centro de reclusión de inmigrantes.

En Texas, un pasajero de un vehículo tiene derecho a no proporcionar documentos de identidad a menos que exista una causa probable para detenerlo, como lo sería una actividad delictiva visible.

1 Prepare un plan familiar para desastres

2 Prepárese para emergencias creando un plan familiar de desastres que incluya lo siguiente:

1. Información de contacto de un abogado de migración con licencia, preferiblemente uno que sea miembro de la Asociación Estadounidense de Abogados de Migración (AILA, por sus siglas en inglés).

Si tiene hijos que sean ciudadanos estadounidenses, complete un acuerdo de autorización para tutor adulto voluntario (Authorization Agreement for Voluntary Adult Caregiver), que le permite a un residente de Texas designar a un familiar o amigo para que tome la custodia de sus hijos mientras el padre o la madre no está disponible. Los formularios e instrucciones están disponibles en inglés, español y vietnamita en <https://texaslawhelp.org/article/authorization-for-nonparent-care-of-a-child>, así como en el sitio web del Departamento de Servicios Familiares y de Protección del Estado de Texas, en [https://www.dfps.texas.gov/site\\_map/forms.asp](https://www.dfps.texas.gov/site_map/forms.asp).

1. Presente un Poder Notarial para designar a un agente que en ausencia de usted pueda manejar cualquier negocio, propiedad u otros asuntos personales. Es necesario que un abogado presente el Poder Notarial ante el tribunal.

Guarde todos sus documentos de identidad y migración junto con el resto de la información mencionada anteriormente.
