





## MESSAGE FROM ARCHBISHOP GUSTAVO




The liturgy invites us to discover the richness of persistent prayer, which springs from a trusting heart and unites the righteous with the eternal and universal Judge. Intercession is not a mere formality: it is praying intensely for those we love, certain that God, rich in mercy, does not desire the death of the sinner, but rather that they be converted and live. God's justice is intertwined with his mercy. A prayer of supplication is not enough. Our Father also reveals himself to us in our acts of gratitude and praise. Every day we witness the power that raised Jesus from the dead, which is a sure guarantee of our hope. True faith makes every prayer a service of thanksgiving for the forgiveness of our sins and for the undeserved gift of eternal life. Prayer is not exhausted in the list of needs; it is a living encounter with the Lord, a breath that nourishes communion with the Holy Spirit. Let us ask the Lord today to teach us to pray with insistence; we might even dare to say, with heartfelt demands, but also with gratitude and adoration. Let us not tire of knocking at heaven's door until we seem impertinent. Persevering prayer bears fruit: peace, conversion, and above all, the generous gift of the Holy Spirit.

## MEDITATION OF THE SCRIPTURES



In today's Gospel Jesus talks about being prepared, using the parable of the servants waiting for their master's return from a wedding. Parables usually have a surprise twist and this one is no exception. Jesus pictures the master coming back at a late hour and finding the servants ready for him. The master is so pleased that he begins to wait on the servants—he serves them a meal. (I can almost hear the disciples saying, "No way!") Perhaps Peter was thinking, "Surely we will be prepared when Jesus comes again. He must be talking about the rest of the people." To answer Peter's question, Jesus warns that the servant who knew his duties would be punished more than one who was ignorant of those expectations. Peter and the disciples should have seen themselves as the servants who knew what was expected. That warning is one for us to hear also. We may look down on non-Christians or wonder if they will get to heaven. But the Lord doesn't expect as much from those who don't know God. Instead of judging them, we would be better off looking at ourselves. Am I serious about my faith, serious enough to show it in my actions? Has my good example ever brought a non-believer to the Church? There are examples of this even in your own parish. If you have been in the parish for many years, you could be expected to notice a newcomer more readily. How do you welcome them? "So how much does Jesus expect of me?" The answer could be in how well you know Jesus. -Tom Schmidt

## THE FOUR MARIAN DOGMAS



### Her Divine Motherhood

*Early Church; Upheld by the Council of Ephesus in 431 A.D.*  
Mary is properly called the Mother of God (Theotokos) because her son, Jesus Christ, is both true God and true Man. Never did Christ give up any of His two natures since His Incarnation.



### Her Perpetual Virginity

*Early Church; Upheld by the Church Fathers*  
The Incarnation of Jesus did not spoil the virginity of Mary. God preserved her virginity before (*ante partum*), during (*in partum*), and after (*post partum*) the birth of Christ. She remained a virgin for life.



### Her Immaculate Conception

*Early Church; Formally defined by Pope Pius IX in 1854*  
In Mary, God prepared a dwelling place for the Incarnation of Jesus. At the first moment of her conception in the womb of her mother, St. Anne, Mary was preserved free from all stain of original sin.



### Her Assumption, Body & Soul

*Early Church; Formally defined by Pope Pius XII in 1950*  
Mary, being the immaculate, ever-virgin Mother of God, after finishing the course of her life on earth, was taken up body and soul to heaven. Free from the stain of original sin, her body was not subject to decay.

"Hail Mary, full of Grace" **Scripture: Luke 1:28**; "The Lord is with You" **Luke 1:28**; Blessed are you among Women" **Luke 1:41**; "And Blessed is the fruit of thy womb Jesus" **Luke 1:42**; Holy Mary, Mother of God" **Luke 1:43** (And why is this granted me, that the mother of my Lord should come to me?) "Pray for us sinners, now and at the hour of our death" **James 5:16** St. James tells Christians to pray for one another. All the baptized are members of the Body of Christ .



## UNDERSTANDING HEALING BY FR. RICHARD



**Healing vs. Deliverance:** Healing primarily refers to the restoration of the physical body to health by the power of the Holy Spirit, especially through the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick and the faith of the person. James 5:15 says, **“And the prayer offered in faith will restore the one who is sick, and the Lord will raise him up. If he has committed sins, they will be forgiven.”**

Deliverance refers to casting out evil spirits to free people from torment, bondage, or oppression.

“Healing is an essential dimension of the apostolic mission and of Christianity. When understood at a sufficiently deep level, this expresses the entire content of redemption.” (*Pope Benedict XVI, Jesus of Nazareth, page 176*)

*Jesus is the Healer*, Isaiah prophesied that the Messiah would heal us completely. There are 4 areas for Healing: 1) **Physical healing** (healing of physical body, inside and out) 2) **Psychological healing** (healing of wounds to human psyche: mind, heart). 3) **Spiritual healing** (deliverance from sin and evil, filling with Holy Spirit); 4) **Spiritual blessing**, reconciliation with God” - The Sacrament of Reconciliation.

We may also speak of other types of social and ecological healing: a) Healing of relationships (marriage, family, community) b) Intergenerational healing (family tree); c) Healing of Body of Christ (from division to wholeness); d) Healing of society (justice ministries regarding poverty, discrimination) e) Healing of spaces and territories or nature”


It is important to remember that our sinful actions bring us illness to our souls and in consequence to our body.

### The Healing Power of the Sacraments

Sacraments point to our relationship with Jesus and our reliance on the Holy Spirit in a tangible way. Simply defined, a sacrament is an outward and visible expression of the inward grace of Jesus. Sacramental actions are not just internal or emotional; they are a physical participation in the life of the Holy Spirit.

The devil is a liar who provokes moral evil (Genesis 3:1-5; 2 Corinthians 11:13-15; 1 Peter 5:8). He uses false prophets (1 Kings 22; 1 Timothy 4:1), false philosophies (2 Corinthians 10:5), and external temptations (Matthew 4:1-11) to deceive and blind people to the truth (2 Corinthians 4:3-4).

As Christians, we conclude the Our Father by asking God to deliver us from evil. There is no official Catholic doctrine (rite) on deliverance, but there are many prayers and blessings for this purpose. Deliverance prayer is appropriate for healing many normal problems.





# BIENVENIDOS A LA VIDA PARROQUIAL DE SAN GREGORIO MAGNO

## SECCIÓN EN ESPAÑOL

### MENSAJE DEL ARZOBISPO GUSTAVO



La liturgia nos invita a descubrir la riqueza de la oración persistente, que brota de un corazón confiado y une a los justos con el Juez eterno y universal. La intercesión no es una mera formalidad: es orar intensamente por los que amamos, seguros de que Dios, rico en misericordia, no desea la muerte del pecador, sino que se convierta y viva. La justicia de Dios está entrelazada con su misericordia.

Una oración de súplica no es suficiente. Nuestro Padre también se nos revela en nuestros actos de gratitud y alabanza. Todos los días somos testigos del poder que resucitó a Jesús de entre los muertos, que es una garantía segura de nuestra esperanza. La verdadera fe hace de cada oración un servicio de acción de gracias por el perdón de nuestros pecados y por el don inmerecido de la vida eterna. La oración no se agota en la lista de necesidades; es un encuentro vivo con el Señor, un soplo que alimenta la comunión con el Espíritu Santo. Pidamos hoy al Señor que nos enseñe a orar con insistencia; incluso podríamos atrevernos a decir, con demandas sentidas, pero también con gratitud y adoración. No nos cansemos de llamar a la puerta del cielo hasta que parezcamos impertinentes. La oración perseverante da frutos: paz, conversión y, sobre todo, el don generoso del Espíritu Santo.

### REFLEXIÓN DE LAS ESCRITURAS



En el Evangelio de hoy, Jesús habla de estar preparados, utilizando la parábola de los criados que esperaban el regreso de su señor de una boda. Las parábolas suelen tener un giro inesperado, y esta tiene uno también. Jesús describe al señor regresando tarde y encontrando a los criados listos. El señor está tan contento que se pone a atenderlos a ellos y les sirve una comida. (Casi puedo oír a los discípulos decir: "¡No puede ser!"). Quizás Pedro pensaba: "Seguramente estaremos preparados cuando Jesús regrese. Debe estar hablando del resto de la gente". Para responder a la pregunta de Pedro, Jesús advierte que el criado que conocía sus deberes sería más castigado que uno que no conociera las expectativas. Pedro y los discípulos deberían haberse visto a sí mismos como los criados que sabían lo que se esperaba de ellos. Esa advertencia también nos corresponde a nosotros. Podemos menospreciar a los no cristianos o preguntarnos si llegarán al cielo. Pero el Señor no espera tanto de quienes no conocen a Dios. En lugar de juzgarlos, sería mejor que nos examináramos a nosotros mismos. ¿Soy serio en mi fe, lo suficientemente serio como para demostrarlo con mis acciones? ¿Alguna vez mi buen ejemplo ha atraído a un no creyente a la Iglesia? Hay ejemplos de esto incluso en tu propia parroquia. Si llevas muchos años en la parroquia, podrían esperar de ti que te des cuenta más fácilmente cuando llega alguien nuevo. ¿Cómo le das la bienvenida? "¿Cuánto espera Jesús de mí?" Podrías encontrar la respuesta en cuánto conoces a Jesús. -Tom Schmidt


### MEDITACIÓN SOBRE SANACIÓN POR EL P. RICHARD



**Sanación vs. Liberación:** La sanación se refiere principalmente a la restauración de la salud del cuerpo físico por el poder del Espíritu Santo, especialmente a través del Sacramento de la Unción de los Enfermos y la fe de la persona. Santiago 5:15 dice: **"Y la oración ofrecida con fe restaurará al enfermo, y el Señor lo levantará. Si ha cometido pecados, le serán perdonados"**. La liberación se

refiere a expulsar espíritus malignos para liberar a las personas del tormento, la esclavitud o la opresión. **"La curación es una dimensión esencial de la misión apostólica y del cristianismo. Cuando se entiende a un nivel suficientemente profundo, esto expresa todo el contenido de la redención"**. (Papa Benedicto XVI, Jesús de Nazaret, página 176) Jesús es el Sanador, Isaías profetizó que el Mesías nos sanaría por completo. Hay 4 áreas para la Sanación: **1) Sanación física** (sanación del cuerpo físico, por dentro y por fuera) **2) Sanación psicológica** (curación de heridas en la psique humana: mente, corazón). **3) Sanidad espiritual** (liberación del pecado y del mal, llenándose del Espíritu Santo); **4) Bendición espiritual**, reconciliación con Dios" - El Sacramento de la Reconciliación. También podemos hablar de otros tipos de sanación social y ecológica: a) Sanación de las relaciones (matrimonio, familia, comunidad) b) Sanación intergeneracional (árbol genealógico); c) Sanidad del Cuerpo de Cristo (de la división a la integridad); d) Sanación de la sociedad (ministerios de justicia en relación con la pobreza, la discriminación) e) Sanación de espacios y territorios o de la naturaleza" Es importante recordar que nuestras acciones pecaminosas nos traen enfermedades a nuestras almas y, en consecuencia, a nuestro cuerpo.

**El poder sanador de los sacramentos** Los sacramentos apuntan a nuestra relación con Jesús y nuestra confianza en el Espíritu Santo de una manera tangible. Definido de manera simple, un sacramento es una expresión externa y visible de la gracia interna de Jesús. Las acciones sacramentales no son solo internas o emocionales; son una participación física en la vida del Espíritu Santo.

and our hearts with kindness.


