

MESSAGE FROM ARCHBISHOP GUSTAVO



The Feast of the Transfiguration takes us on a journey from the turmoil of exile to the height of divine glory. On the mountaintop, Peter, James, and John witnessed the radiance in Jesus but no longer in dreams and symbols; “his face changed” and “his clothing became dazzling white.” As they bowed in awe, the Father’s voice resounded: “This is my chosen Son; listen to Him.” Yet the splendor of Tabor cannot be separated from the path to Jerusalem. The Son of Man who shone in glory would also accomplish his exodus in Jerusalem, embracing cross and tomb. Hope sustains us when weariness clouds our vision and impels us to persevere in service and prayer. Together, we are called to descend from our mountain moments and bring the light of Jesus into the valleys. Let us listen for the Father’s voice – “This is my chosen Son; listen to Him” – and allow the Holy Spirit to shape our plans with wisdom and mercy. The same white garments that clothed Jesus at his Transfiguration remind us of our baptismal call to clothe ourselves in compassion, humility, and charity. May this feast rekindle in us the fire of hope and strengthen our unity in mission. As we anticipate his final coming, let us live in joyful expectation, bearing witness to the Kingdom that endures.


MEDITATION OF THE SCRIPTURES



How much is good enough? How do we know when we have been generous enough or faithful enough to please the Lord? How do we know we have done enough to avoid sin? Although I do not for one minute believe that God is sitting up in heaven next to a giant scoreboard keeping a tally of our good and bad deeds, we *will* be judged at the end of our lives. Today’s second reading provokes self analysis in this regard: “In your struggle against sin you have not yet resisted to the point of shedding blood.” How do we react when we sin? Do we give into temptation so often that we don’t even feel a ping to our conscience? Do we instantly regret what we have done and seek forgiveness from the person we have wronged? Do we look for the next available confession time? Do we let our sins pile up one upon the other and only seek the Sacrament when we can no longer stand it? Our Lord revealed to St. Faustina just how much sin hurts His Sacred Heart. If we truly took that to heart, we would flee from sin so much more often. It would become repugnant to us. During the Divine Mercy Novena, we read “bring to me all mankind, especially sinners, and immerse them in the ocean of My mercy. In this way you will console Me in the bitter grief into which the loss of souls plunges Me” (*Diary of St. Maria Faustina Kowalska*). So let us turn away from sin and instead spread love and joy and truth. Let us set the earth on fire with the blazing love of God! (see today’s Gospel)

FR. RICHARD’S MEDITATION ON HEALING



FIVE KEYS OF HEALING—UNBOUND MODEL

Key 1 - Repentance & Faith: Repentance

- Reflect and receive God’s mercy for your sins. 10 Commandments, Sins of the Heart, Pride, Fear, Self-righteousness, Judgmentalism, Self-pity, Anger, Hurt, Unforgiveness, etc.

Faith - Recommit your life to the Lord, your Savior.

Key 2 - Forgiveness :

Forgive specific people for specific offenses. Forgiving others is necessary for you to receive the freedom that God desires to give you. Ask God for guidance and from your heart, humbly surrender them to the Lord.

Key 3 - Renunciation Identify the lies or spirits blocking your freedom in Christ . Acknowledge that these lies are not of God or self . Renunciation is saying no to the lies and negative influences in your life. It is standing firm with Jesus to renounce the lies and break its power.

For Example: *In the name of Jesus, I renounce , I reject, I rebuke the SPIRIT of ,* Fear, anger, resentment, anxiety, worry, unworthiness, pride, shame, loneliness, depression, guilt, perfectionism, jealousy, abandonment, *stubbornness, laziness, hopelessness, rejection, jealousy, addiction, unforgiveness, etc.*

Key 4 - Authority : Take back your authority in Christ that you had given away. **Let us pray:** Lord Jesus Christ, all authority in heaven and earth is yours. I have nothing to fear. I am a child of light and with this comes the authority to say, ‘In the name of Jesus, I command every evil spirit that I have renounced, every spirit behind the sins I have confessed to leave me now, never to return again!’

Key 5 - The Father’s Blessing: Now emptied, ask God to fill you with his blessing. **Let us Pray:** My Father, thank you for sending Your Son to show me the way home to you. I have opened myself to you, please bless my life. As I identify with Christ, Your Son, I can hear your words spoken over me: “You are my beloved son/daughter with whom I am well pleased.” In Christ, I receive this blessing and every spiritual blessing You have for me. Thank you for calling me by name and having a special plan for my future. Immerse me in the truth of your love and more fully reveal Your will for my life so I may live it out faithfully and fearlessly for You. Thank you for my freedom!







MENSAJE DEL ARZOBISPO GUSTAVO




La Fiesta de la Transfiguración nos lleva en un viaje desde la agitación del exilio hasta la cima de la gloria divina. En la cima de la montaña, Pedro, Santiago y Juan fueron testigos del resplandor de Jesús, pero ya no de sueños y símbolos; "Su rostro cambió" y "su ropa se volvió de un blanco deslumbrante". Mientras se inclinaban con asombro, la voz del Padre resonó: "Este es mi Hijo elegido; escúchalo".

Sin embargo, el esplendor del Tabor no puede separarse del camino a Jerusalén. El Hijo del Hombre que resplandeció en gloria también cumpliría su éxodo en Jerusalén, abrazando la cruz y la tumba. La esperanza nos sostiene cuando el cansancio nubla nuestra visión y nos impulsa a perseverar en el servicio y la oración. Juntos, estamos llamados a descender de nuestros momentos en la montaña y llevar la luz de Jesús a los valles. Escuchemos la voz del Padre: "Este es mi Hijo elegido; escúchalo" - y permite que el Espíritu Santo dé forma a nuestros planes con sabiduría y misericordia. Las mismas vestiduras blancas que vistieron a Jesús en su Transfiguración nos recuerdan nuestro llamado bautismal a revestirnos de compasión, humildad y caridad. Que esta fiesta reavive en nosotros el fuego de la esperanza y fortalezca nuestra unidad en la misión. Mientras anticipamos su venida final, vivamos en alegre expectativa, dando testimonio del Reino que perdura.

REFLEXIÓN DE LAS ESCRITURAS



¿Cuánto es suficiente? ¿Cómo sabemos cuánto hemos sido lo suficientemente generosos o fieles para agradecer al Señor? ¿Cómo sabemos que hemos hecho lo suficiente para evitar el pecado? Aunque no creo ni por un instante que Dios esté sentado en el cielo junto a un marcador gigantesco que lleva la cuenta de nuestras buenas y malas acciones, es cierto que seremos juzgados al final de nuestras vidas. La segunda lectura de hoy me invita a un autoanálisis al respecto: "todavía no han llegado a derramar su sangre en la lucha contra el pecado". ¿Cómo reaccionamos cuando pecamos? ¿Cedemos a la tentación tan a menudo que ni siquiera sentimos remordimiento? ¿Nos arrepentimos al instante de lo que hemos hecho y buscamos el perdón de la persona a la que hemos ofendido? ¿Buscamos la próxima oportunidad para ir a confesarnos? ¿Dejamos que nuestros pecados se amontonen y solo buscamos el Sacramento cuando ya no podemos soportarlo más? Nuestro Señor le reveló a Santa Faustina cuánto hierde el pecado a su Sagrado Corazón. Si realmente tomáramos esto en serio, huiríamos del pecado con mucha más frecuencia. Se volvería repugnante para nosotros. Durante la Novena a la Divina Misericordia, leemos: «Trae a mí a toda la humanidad, especialmente a los pecadores, y sumérgelos en el océano de mi misericordia. Así me consolarás en el amargo dolor en que me sume la pérdida de las almas» (Diario de Santa María Faustina Kowalska). Así que, alejémonos del pecado y, en cambio, derramemos amor, alegría y verdad. ¡Encendemos la tierra con el amor ardiente de Dios! (ver el Evangelio de hoy)

MEDITACION DEL P. RICHARD SOBRE LA SANACIÓN



CINCO PASOS DE SANACIÓN: MODELO "UNBOUND"

PASO 1 - Arrepentimiento y fe: Arrepentimiento - Reflexiona y recibe la misericordia de Dios por tus pecados. 10 Mandamientos, Pecados del Corazón, Orgullo, Miedo, Justicia, Juzgamiento, Autocompasión, Ira, Dolor, Falta de perdón, etc. Fe - Vuelve a comprometer-consagrar tu vida con el Señor, tu Salvador.

PASO 2 - Perdón: Perdonar a personas específicas por ofensas específicas. Perdonar a los demás es necesario para que recibas la libertad que Dios desea darte. Pídele a Dios que te guíe y de corazón, entrégelos humildemente al Señor.

PASO 3 - Renuncia Identifica las mentiras o espíritus que bloquean tu libertad en Cristo. Reconoce que estas mentiras no son de Dios ni de ti mismo. La renuncia es decir no a las mentiras y las influencias negativas en tu vida. Es mantenerse firme con Jesús para renunciar a las mentiras y romper su poder. **Por ejemplo: En el nombre de Jesús, renuncio, rechazo, repudio el ESPÍRITU de** , Miedo, ira, resentimiento, ansiedad, preocupación, indignidad, orgullo, vergüenza, soledad, depresión, culpa, perfeccionismo, celos, abandono, terquedad, pereza, desesperanza, rechazo, celos, adicción, falta de perdón, etc.

PASO 4 - Autoridad: Recupera tu autoridad en Cristo que habías regalado. **Oremos:** Señor Jesucristo, toda autoridad en el cielo y en la tierra es tuya. No tengo nada que temer. Soy un hijo de luz y con esto viene la autoridad para decir: '¡En el nombre de Jesús, ordeno a todo espíritu maligno al que he renunciado, a todo espíritu detrás de los pecados que he confesado que me abandone ahora, que nunca regrese más!'

PASO 5 - La bendición del Padre: Ahora ya libre, pídele a Dios que te llene con su bendición. **Oremos:** Padre mío, gracias por enviar a Tu Hijo para mostrarme el camino a casa para ti. Me he abierto a ti, por favor bendice mi vida. Al identificarme con Cristo, Tu Hijo, puedo escuchar tus palabras pronunciadas sobre mí: "**Tú eres mi amado hijo/hija en quien me complazco**". En Cristo, recibo esta bendición y toda bendición espiritual que tienes para mí. Gracias por llamarme por mi nombre y tener un plan especial para mi futuro. Sumérgeme en la verdad de tu amor y revela más plenamente Tu voluntad para mi vida para que pueda vivirla fielmente y sin miedo para Ti. ¡Gracias por mi libertad!
