

MESSAGE FROM ARCHBISHOP GUSTAVO



There are always poor people around us, because the poor are the ones who need what each of us can give them. We must ask ourselves: What can I do for this person God places in my path? Who else can I serve? How can I go beyond myself to serve others, for the greater glory of God? Jesus invites us to use possessions as tools for unity and peace, rather than division. This requires wisdom, discernment, and generosity, gifts and fruits of the Holy Spirit in the human heart. We cannot allow money, power, or fame to become masters who enslave us and rob us of our inner freedom. On the contrary, the Lord Jesus wants to lift the poor from their lowliness through our works of mercy. Before Jesus, we are all poor. And it is precisely in the poor that he presents himself to us in a concrete way. Jesus not only calls us to give alms, but to truly invest ourselves: our time, our talents, and our attention to those who suffer, to the invisible of this world. A good shared, a talent placed at the service of another, is not lost; it is transformed and grows in value. We must direct our generosity toward those who have less and recognize that, although we need material goods to live, they cannot fill the emptiness of the heart or sustain true hope. Only God satisfies the thirst for the infinite that He has placed within us.

MAN'S FREEDOM



It has been said that in an effort to teach someone anything, you have to show them what they need to learn, let them do it and then follow up and show them again. If you lecture them, they will grasp very little of the information that has been said to them.

If you show them, they will learn some of what was presented to them, but if you get them involved, let them get their hands dirty, they will have a better understanding of what is expected of them.

For many of you, the work or profession that you do requires you to take a course so that you can perform your work at hand. Now the course that you took could have come in the form of an education-this education could have come from a high-learning institute, or it could be the school of hard knocks. Whatever road you took, you had to learn your skills, master the skills and execute them to become better at your job.

What about your spirituality? What course are you taking to master your faith, are you sharing the gifts given to you by God with his people? If not, what is holding you back from giving back what God has loaned you? There is a thought that has been preached, we are not worthing of the love that God has given us, therefore, we are not worthy of serving his church, much less his people. Sounds very rational...

CCC 1730 God created man a rational being, conferring on him the dignity of a person who can initiate and control his own actions. "God willed that man should be 'left in the hand of his own counsel,' so that he might of his own accord seek his Creator and freely attain his full and blessed perfection by cleaving to him."

Man is rational and therefore like God; he is created with free will and is master over his acts. **26 GS 17; Sir 15:14**

Bishop JC Ryle said - Holiness is the habit of being of one mind with God, according as we find His mind described in Scripture. It is the habit of agreeing in God's judgment - hating what He hates - loving what He loves - and measuring everything in this world by the standard of His Word...

The truth of why many men does not see themselves as Holy Men of God, is that they do not have a relationship with his Son, Jesus. Without this relationship, men are prone to follow what the world teaches. We can easily follow any theme or person that makes senses or better yet, agrees with our way of living... but does this theme or person teach and live on virtues?

CCC 1803 "Whatever is true, whatever is honorable, whatever is just, whatever is pure, whatever is lovely, whatever is gracious, if there is any excellence, if there is anything worthy of praise, think about these things." A virtue is an habitual and firm disposition to do the good. It allows the person not only to perform good acts, but to give the best of himself. The virtuous person tends toward the good with all his sensory and spiritual powers; he pursues the good and chooses it in concrete actions.





MENSAJE DEL ARZOBISPO GUSTAVO



Siempre hay pobres a nuestro alrededor, porque los pobres son los que necesitan lo que cada uno de nosotros puede darles. Debemos preguntarnos: ¿Qué puedo hacer por esta persona que Dios pone en mi camino? ¿A quién más puedo servir? ¿Cómo puedo ir más allá de mí mismo para servir a los demás, para la mayor gloria de Dios? Jesús nos invita a usar las posesiones como herramientas para la unidad y la paz, en lugar de la división. Esto requiere sabiduría, discernimiento y generosidad, dones y frutos del Espíritu Santo en el corazón humano. No podemos permitir que el dinero, el poder o la fama se conviertan en amos que nos esclavizan y nos roban nuestra libertad interior. Por el contrario, el Señor Jesús quiere levantar a los pobres de su humildad a través de nuestras obras de misericordia. Ante Jesús, todos somos pobres. Jesús no solo nos llama a dar limosna, sino a invertir verdaderamente nuestro tiempo, nuestros talentos y nuestra atención a los que sufren, a los invisibles de este mundo. Solo Dios satisface la sed de infinito que ha puesto en nosotros.



LA LIBERTAD DEL HOMBRE

Se ha dicho que en un esfuerzo por enseñarle algo a alguien, hay que mostrarle lo que necesita aprender, dejar que lo haga y luego hacer un seguimiento y mostrarle de nuevo. Si les da una lección, captarán muy poco de la información que se les ha dicho. Si se los muestra, aprenderán algo de lo que se les presentó, pero si los involucra, déjelos ensuciarse las manos, tendrán una mejor comprensión de lo que se espera de ellos.



Para muchos de ustedes, el trabajo o la profesión que realizan requiere que tomen un curso para poder realizar su trabajo en cuestión. Ahora bien, el curso que tomaste podría haber venido en forma de educación, esta educación podría haber venido de un instituto de alto aprendizaje, o podría ser la escuela de los golpes duros. Cualquiera que fuera el camino que tomara, tenía que aprender sus habilidades, dominar las habilidades y ejecutarlas para mejorar en su trabajo. ¿Qué hay de tu espiritualidad? ¿Qué curso estás tomando para dominar tu fe, estás compartiendo los dones que Dios te ha dado con su pueblo? Si no es así, ¿qué te impide devolver lo que Dios te ha prestado? Hay un pensamiento que se ha predicado, no somos dignos del amor que Dios nos ha dado, por lo tanto, no somos dignos de servir a su iglesia, y mucho menos a su pueblo. Suenan muy racionales... **CCC 1730** Dios creó al hombre como un ser racional, confiriéndole la dignidad de persona que puede iniciar y controlar sus propias acciones. "Dios quiso que el hombre fuera 'dejado en la mano de su propio consejo', para que pudiera por su propia voluntad buscar a su Creador y alcanzar libremente su plena y bendita perfección al adherirse a él". El hombre es racional y, por lo tanto, como Dios; es creado con libre albedrío y es dueño de sus actos. **26 GS 17; Eclo 15:14** El obispo JC Ryle dijo: La santidad es el hábito de estar de acuerdo con Dios, según encontremos su mente descrita en las Escrituras. Es el hábito de estar de acuerdo en el juicio de Dios, odiar lo que Él odia, amar lo que ama, y medir todo en este mundo según el estándar de Su Palabra. La verdad de por qué muchos hombres no se ven a sí mismos como Hombres Santos de Dios, es que no tienen una relación con su Hijo, Jesús. Sin esta relación, los hombres son propensos a seguir lo que el mundo enseña. Podemos seguir fácilmente cualquier tema o persona que tenga sentido o mejor aún, esté de acuerdo con nuestra forma de vivir... Pero, ¿este tema o persona enseña y vive de virtudes? **CCC 1803** "Todo lo que es verdadero, todo lo honorable, todo lo justo, todo lo puro, todo lo amable, todo lo que es gracioso, si hay alguna excelencia, si hay algo digno de alabanza, en esto pensad". Una virtud es una disposición habitual y firme para hacer el bien. Permite a la persona no solo realizar buenos actos, sino dar lo mejor de sí misma. La persona virtuosa tiende hacia el bien con todas sus facultades sensoriales y espirituales; persigue el bien y lo elige en acciones concretas. Allí encontraremos nuestra libertad.
