



SCRIPTURE MEDITATION




MEDITATION OF THE SCRIPTURES:

There is a Christmas song that says of Bethlehem: **“Yet in thy dark streets shineth the everlasting Light.”** Though today it has many modern homes and buildings, you can still see that it is part of **“the hill country...of Judah.”** (Lk 1:39) It is not too far from En Kerem, where John the Baptist was born, and apparently where today’s Gospel takes place.

We see in the Gospel reading today how Elizabeth and her unborn child rejoiced at the news of Jesus’ coming birth. The story implies that Mary went to see Elizabeth as soon as the angel told her about Jesus. I would think that talking about it made this miracle more real. Jesus is the “everlasting Light” mentioned in the song. That light shines today, not just in Bethlehem, but everywhere that his followers bring it. When we console someone who is mourning, that light shines. When we forgive someone who hurt us, the light is burning. When we teach a child how to pray, it shines even brighter.

Our dark streets need the everlasting Light today as much as they did 2000 years ago. Today we remember how Mary and Elizabeth shared their faith in God. They did so much like we do today. Jesus, who seems to be invisible today, is seen in the shared faith of those who bring him into the world by their words and actions. -Tom Schmidt

ARCHBISHOP GUSTAVO MEDITATION



We are all called to be a sign of new life in the midst of weariness, divisions, or fears, especially as we prepare as a local Church for the great celebration of the 500th anniversary – in 2031 – of the apparitions of Our Lady of Guadalupe. As Pope Leo XIV has said: “The Jubilee is an open door... Jesus is not a wall that separates, but a door that unites us.” This means that the mission of Guadalupe cannot be closed in on itself. On the contrary, it must be a bridge – between generations, between cultures, between those who seek God from different places. Therefore, if we truly want to honor Our Lady, we must ask ourselves: whom are we connecting with? Whom are we including? We need to hear this call especially today: to discern seriously – in prayer, in dialogue, and in the path of concrete actions – how to pass the baton to the new generations. It is not enough to lament that young people are not coming; it is necessary to open real spaces for them, entrust them with responsibilities, accompany them with patience, and bear witness to the love that Our Lady of Guadalupe conveys. Here the Nican Mopōhua resonates, where the Virgin says: “Go, my youngest son, put forth all your effort. I send you.” And Juan Diego replies: “I will go to fulfill your command, my Lady.” That dialogue remains alive. Today the Virgin Mary looks at us and says: “I truly send you; you are my trusted ambassadors. “And we, like Juan Diego, must respond with humility, but also with determination. As we celebrate Advent and journey toward 2031, let us embrace our mission to be signs of hope, bridges of communion, and sowers of new life, together with – and through – our young people. In this way, the Mother of Heaven will continue to show and give her love through us.

CHRISTMAS PRAYER: GOD IS NOT THERE

Tonight (Christmas), we do not seek Christ among the opulence of the world, in the idolatry of wealth, in the pursuit of power, or in worldly intrigues. **God is not there.** We seek God through the sign given by the angels: lying in a manger, wrapped in swaddling clothes made by the poor, born to a humble carpenter from Nazareth, resting on a poor cloth and a bit of straw—the God who became man, the King of the ages, made accessible to humanity as a poor child. Now is the time to look upon the Child Jesus—not only in the beautiful images of our nativity scenes, but among the malnourished children who go to bed tonight with nothing to eat; among the homeless who sleep wrapped in newspapers in doorways; among the poor laborer who has earned only enough to buy a simple gift for his mother; among the paperboy who failed to sell his newspapers and may face harsh reprimand from a stepparent; among the young rural worker who is unemployed or afflicted by illness tonight. Not everything is joy. There is much suffering. There are many broken homes, much pain, and great poverty. How sad is the story of our children. Jesus takes all of this upon Himself tonight. Amen. *(St. Oscar Romero)*

Dear Parents: Teach your children to love and appreciate what they have and to share with those most in need. The Spirit of Christmas is the Spirit of Generosity.



MEDITACION DEL ARZOBISPO GUSTAVO



Todos estamos llamados a ser un signo de nueva vida en medio del cansancio, las divisiones o los miedos, especialmente mientras nos preparamos como Iglesia local para la gran celebración del 500º aniversario — en 2031 — de las apariciones de Nuestra Señora de Guadalupe. Como ha dicho el Papa León XIV: "El Jubileo es una puerta abierta... Jesús no es un muro que separa, sino una puerta que nos une." Esto significa que la misión de Guadalupe no puede cerrarse sobre sí misma. Al contrario, debe ser un puente — entre generaciones, entre culturas, entre quienes buscan a Dios desde diferentes lugares. Por lo tanto, si realmente queremos honrar a Nuestra Señora, debemos preguntarnos: ¿con quién estamos conectando? ¿A quién incluimos? Necesitamos escuchar este llamamiento especialmente hoy: discernir seriamente —en la oración, en el diálogo y en el camino de acciones concretas— cómo pasar el testigo a las nuevas generaciones. No basta con lamentar que los jóvenes no vengan; es necesario abrirles espacios reales, confiarles responsabilidades, acompañarles con paciencia y dar testimonio del amor que transmite Nuestra Señora de Guadalupe. Aquí resuena el Mopōhua nicano, donde la Virgen dice: "Ve, hijo menor mío, pon todo tu esfuerzo. Te envío a ti." Y Juan Diego responde: "Iré a cumplir tu mandato, mi señora." Ese diálogo sigue vivo. Hoy la Virgen María nos mira y dice: "De verdad os envío; Sois mis embajadores de confianza. Y nosotros, como Juan Diego, debemos responder con humildad, pero también con determinación. Mientras celebramos el Adviento y nuestro camino hacia 2031, abracemos nuestra misión de ser signos de esperanza, puentes de comunión y sembradores de nueva vida, junto con — y a través — de nuestros jóvenes. De este modo, la Madre del Cielo seguirá mostrando y dando su amor a través de nosotros.
