



ARCHBISHOP GUSTAVO'S MEDITATION



The Word of God invites us to contemplate one luminous image: the Holy Spirit poured out as living water. The living water of the Holy Spirit has shaped our local Church for generations. As we mark 100 years as an archdiocese, we remember how the Holy Spirit has flowed through our history – strengthening the many priests, religious, and lay faithful who fled persecution in Mexico beginning in 1926. They arrived wounded yet Spirit-filled; poor yet rich in faith. Their gifts, charisms and courage joined the river of grace that still refreshes San Antonio. That mission reaches us through a long line of saints – known and unknown – who allowed the Holy Spirit to shape their ordinary lives. Some preached, others taught, others served the poor, others lived quiet fidelity in their families or embraced a contemplative life. Each became a unique vessel for the living water of the Holy Spirit. Their witness reminds us that holiness is never a copy-and-paste project. Like the people of faith who rebuilt their lives here, like the first missionaries, like all the saints, you are sent to carry faith, unity, justice, peace, and hope into our world. May this living water never cease to flow in you and through you.

DEACON FRED'S MEDITATION



Many people throughout the world have not come to know Jesus Christ. This is our mission: to help others know and love Him. God meticulously prepared for the coming of His Son, and Jesus established the Church to continue His mission. However, He calls upon us to be active participants in bringing His message to others. As members of the Church and branches of the vine, we are invited to bear fruit and share His love. We are all indispensable members of the Church, and through us, Christ continues His work of evangelization. Our identity is rooted in being members of Jesus Christ, and we are called to live His life. As Scripture reminds us, "We must decrease; He must increase." "Do you not know that your bodies are members of Christ? But whoever is joined to the Lord becomes one Spirit with him. Avoid immorality."

To fully live the life of Christ, we must also embrace our identity as sons and daughters of Mary. Mary is not only the mother of the head—Christ—but also of the body, which is each of us, we should offer ourselves to Mary and to Jesus, allowing them to work through us.

"Oh Jesus, Transform me into Thee. May my mind be Yours to think Your thoughts! My eyes and ears Yours with which to see and hear that which You need to see and hear! My tongue, my lips, my voice, my mouth, be Yours to speak Your words! May my hands be Yours to do Your work! My heart Yours with which to love! May my feet be Yours to go where You need to go! And may my will be totally absorbed into Yours, so that it is no longer I who will but You who will in and through me. So that in all things, I may be Your perfect instrument."

We are called to take on the mind of Christ and think His thoughts. Our goal is to belong entirely to Him. We achieve this by dedicating ourselves to Mary, imitating her openness, and making ourselves available to bring Christ to others.

When we entrust ourselves to Mary, we become filled with the Holy Spirit and open ourselves to Christ's grace. Through this openness, we can accomplish great things. We must remain receptive to inspiration: How can we become better missionaries? How can we bring more souls to God?

The Legion thrives wherever faith grows. Even in the poorest countries, the Legion often remains when missionaries have left, encouraging people to pray and receive the life of Jesus.

This is Mary's Legion. Mary is acting through us also to bring people into union with Christ. We are helping Mary to have new children since we help them to be joined to Christ. Let's have zeal. People depend on us.

We spread the gospel person to person, one relationship at a time. The Holy Spirit will use us. It is Mary who does these works through us. Amen





ARCHBISHOP GUSTAVO'S MEDITATION



La Palabra de Dios nos invita a contemplar una imagen luminosa: el Espíritu Santo derramado como agua viva. El agua viva del Espíritu Santo ha moldeado nuestra Iglesia local durante generaciones. Al conmemorar 100 años como arquidiócesis, recordamos cómo el Espíritu Santo ha fluído a lo largo de nuestra historia — fortaleciendo a los muchos sacerdotes, religiosos y fieles laicos que huyeron de la persecución en México a partir de 1926. Llegaron heridos pero llenos de Espíritu; Pobre pero rico en fe. Sus dones, carismas y valentía se unieron al río de gracia que aún refresca San Antonio. Esa misión nos llega a través de una larga línea de santos — conocidos y desconocidos — que permitieron que el Espíritu Santo moldeara sus vidas ordinarias. Algunos predicaban, otros enseñaban, otros servían a los pobres, otros vivían la fidelidad tranquila en sus familias o abrazaban una vida contemplativa. Cada uno se convirtió en un recipiente único para el agua viva del Espíritu Santo. Su testimonio nos recuerda que la santidad nunca es un proyecto de copiar y pegar. Como las personas de fe que reconstruyeron sus vidas aquí, como los primeros misioneros, como todos los santos, se os envía a llevar fe, unidad, justicia, paz y esperanza a nuestro mundo. Que esta agua viva nunca deje de fluir dentro y a través de ti.

DEACON FRED'S MEDITATION



Muchas personas en todo el mundo no han llegado a conocer a Jesucristo. Esta es nuestra misión: ayudar a los demás a conocerle y amarle. Dios preparó meticulosamente la llegada de Su Hijo, y Jesús estableció la Iglesia para continuar con su misión. Sin embargo, nos llama a ser participantes activos en llevar Su mensaje a los demás. Como miembros de la Iglesia y ramas de la vid, estamos invitados a dar fruto y compartir Su amor. Todos somos miembros indispensables de la Iglesia y, a través de nosotros, Cristo continúa su obra de evangelización. Nuestra identidad está arraigada en ser miembros de Jesucristo, y estamos llamados a vivir Su vida. Como nos recuerda la Escritura, "Debemos disminuir; Debe aumentar." "¿No sabéis que vuestros cuerpos son miembros de Cristo? Pero quien está unido al Señor se convierte en un solo Espíritu con él. Evita la inmoralidad." Para vivir plenamente la vida de Cristo, también debemos abrazar nuestra identidad como hijos e hijas de María. María no es solo la madre de la cabeza—Cristo—sino también del cuerpo, que es cada uno de nosotros; deberíamos ofrecernos a María y a Jesús, permitiendo que actúen a través de nosotros. "Oh Jesús, transfórmame en Ti. ¡Que mi mente sea Vuestra para pensar Vuestros pensamientos! ¡Mis ojos y oídos son tuyos para ver y oír lo que necesitas ver y oír! ¡Mi lengua, mis labios, mi voz, mi boca, sé Tuya para hablar Tus palabras! ¡Que mis manos sean Tuyas para hacer Tu trabajo! ¡Mi corazón Es tuyo para amar! ¡Que mis pies sean tuyos para ir donde necesites ir! Y que mi voluntad sea totalmente absorbida en la Tuya, para que ya no sea yo quien quiera, sino Tú quien hará dentro y a través de mí. Para que en todo, yo pueda ser Tu instrumento perfecto." Estamos llamados a asumir la mente de Cristo y pensar en sus pensamientos. Nuestro objetivo es pertenecerle enteramente. Lo conseguimos dedicándonos a María, imitando su apertura y poniéndonos disponibles para llevar a Cristo a los demás. Cuando nos confiamos a María, nos llenamos del Espíritu Santo y nos abrimos a la gracia de Cristo. A través de esta apertura, podemos lograr grandes cosas. Debemos mantenernos receptivos a la inspiración: ¿Cómo podemos ser mejores misioneros? ¿Cómo podemos llevar más almas a Dios? La Legión prospera dondequiera que crezca la fe. Incluso en los países más pobres, la Legión suele permanecer cuando los misioneros se han ido, animando a la gente a rezar y recibir la vida de Jesús. Esta es la Legión de María. María también actúa a través de nosotros para unir a las personas con Cristo. Estamos ayudando a María a tener nuevos hijos porque les ayudamos a unirse a Cristo. Vamos a tener entusiasmo. La gente depende de nosotros. Compartimos el evangelio de persona a persona, una relación a la vez. El Santo Espíritu nos usará. Es María quien realiza estas obras a través de nosotros. Amén

A GUIDE TO TEFA FOR FAMILIES



Senate Bill 2 established TEFA to help families access funds for approved educational expenses starting in 2026–27. With final rules released on November 25, 2025, families now have clarity on how the program will work.

ELIGIBILITY

Any Texas resident **eligible for public school (PK–12)** may apply.

This includes:

- Children entering PK3–PK4 who meet Texas eligibility
- Students currently in public, private, or homeschool settings
- Students with TEFA qualifying disabilities

There is no income limit to apply, but awards are offered based on State priority groups.

PARENT: As defined by Education Code, §29.351(5), a resident of this state who is a natural or adoptive parent, managing or possessory conservator, legal guardian, custodian, or other person with legal authority to act on behalf of a child.

PARENT RESPONSIBILITY

Families must:

- Use funds only for approved expenses
- Not withdraw cash or request reimbursement
- Keep receipts
- Ensure annual testing (Grades 3–12)
- Report public school enrollment
- Follow all TEFA rules

WHAT IF FUNDS RUN OUT?

If funds run out, eligible students go on a state waitlist.

If more funds become available, awards may be offered mid-year, prorated, and begin the month after approval.

WHAT'S NEXT?

When applications open on the Texas Comptroller Website, you will apply and select one approved school. Upon completion, eligibility will be determined. Awarding is expected to go out mid-April. If your child is selected, you'll receive instructions to accept the award in the TEFA portal. Your child's TEFA account is then created so you can choose approved schools, providers, and services.

PRE-K ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

PK ages 3-5 qualify if they meet Texas public PK eligibility criteria (emergent bilingual, economically disadvantaged, homeless, military, foster, child of district employee, or Star of Texas).

TEFA QUALIFYING DISABILITIES EXPLAINED

A student with special needs (Tier 1) is defined as a child age 21 or younger with a disability listed in Texas Education Code §29.003 that requires special services to be adequately or safely educated in a public school. Eligible conditions include visual or auditory impairment, physical disability, intellectual or developmental disability, emotional disturbance, learning disability, autism, speech disability, or traumatic brain injury.

SIBLING PRIORITY

Siblings as defined by Education Code, §29.351(9), are: A brother, sister, stepbrother, stepsister, half-brother, half-sister, or a foster brother or sister who is a dependent of the participating parent and has been placed with the participating parent by an authorized placement agency or by judgment, decree, or other order of a court of competent jurisdiction.

ADDITIONAL DOCUMENTATION

One of the following documents is needed to prove a child with disabilities:

- A letter verifying the child's eligibility to receive Supplemental Security Income (SSI) or Social Security Disability Insurance (SSDI), or
- A written diagnosis from a licensed physician verifying one of the listed disabilities, or
- An Individualized Education Program (IEP) issued by a Texas public school district or open-enrollment charter school.

IMPORTANT:

A licensed professional evaluation can place your child in the top priority group, but the state can only calculate additional disability-based funding if your child has an IEP.

Families without an IEP will still be reviewed in the disability priority group but may receive the standard ESA funding amount.
