Dear Parish Family,

This reflection for the Second Sunday of Ordinary Time focuses on the second reading from St. Paul’s First Letter to the Corinthians. Because the first reading and the Gospel usually share a common theme, the second reading is often somewhat overlooked. It is like that good middle-birth-order child that gets lost in the family shuffle unless they bring attention to their needs. Today, let us focus on St. Paul’s rich explanation of the gifts of the Holy Spirit.

While the first reading and the Gospel use images of marital love to describe the love God has for us, the second reading tells us how that love is manifested in the Church. There are three different types of gifts or charisms that God gives to us (Often referred to as Charismatic Gifts of the Holy Spirit): Intellectual, Service and Works.

The first group contains Wisdom, Knowledge and Faith. Wisdom is not just a recall of things about God’s words or actions, but the meaning of them. Knowledge is the ready recall of the truth of God’s plan for salvation and the ability to express it effectively. Faith here means more than just our common belief in Christ, but an extraordinary trust in Christ Jesus.

The Service gifts include Prophecy – not future-telling – but boldly giving witness to God’s Word in the particular circumstances you find yourself. Healing and Mighty Deeds are also included. Discernment of Spirits is the gift to unveil a subtle lie that would lead us away from the Truth.

The gifts of Works include the gift of Tongues – the ecstatic praise given to God in a language unintelligible to the hearer. Interpretation of Tongues is the gift to undo the confusion of the Tower of Babel and occasionally interpret the praises uttered.

One important thing to take away from this Scripture passage is that ALL of these charisms have one and the same source: the same Spirit, the same Lord, the same God. Who gets which gift is known only to the mind of God. No gift is better than the other. Each has its purpose and that is the building up the Church, the Body of Christ. Another takeaway is that all these gifts are given not for the benefit of the receiver, but for the good of the other.

With the season of gift-giving still fresh in our memory, why not pray to our Lord and ask Him to bestow the gift of His choice upon you. This charism is given to be given away, so be aware that the gift is not about which one you want, but about what the Church needs.
