REFLECTION

Jesus, Way To Life

The story of Jesus' temptation immediately follows the story of the baptism of Jesus in the River Jordan. Hunger is the occasion of the devil's first assault because Jesus has fasted for forty days and forty nights. Those days remind us of the forty years the people of God spent on their way to the Promised Land. The desert is a place of trials as well as of revelations: angels are near Jesus and serve him. Solitude places us humans in the presence of God and ourselves without any possible escape. It forces us to make radical choices. The choice of *yes* or *no* to God cannot be made without a struggle against ourselves and the solicitations of the devil. The devil departs and peace returns to us when we say *yes* to God's call. Lent is a time to withdraw into solitude in order to discern God's call. That is how Jesus did it. Let us follow his way to Life.

ORIENTATION

THE SUNDAY LECTIONARY - OVERVIEW

The First Sunday of Lent each year focuses on Jesus' fast and temptation in the desert. It immediately places before our eyes Christ's victory over Satan, whose dominion of humans he destroys, calling all of us to fight, with him, in a similar combat against the enemy of humanity.

The Second Sunday's focus is on the Transfiguration of the Lord. It imparts a certain character to Lent by offering for our contemplation Christ raised up into glory after suffering his passion.

The Third, Fourth and Fifth Sundays are the frameworks of the preparation for Easter.


- The Third Sunday: The Samaritan Woman.
- The Fourth Sunday: The cure of the man born blind.
- The Fifth Sunday: The raising of Lazarus.

We have here three baptismal teachings on Water and Spirit, The Light of faith, Death and Life.

These Readings are directed primarily to Catechumens and also rousing the baptismal faith of those around them. For the whole Christian community as well as those to be baptized (the Catechumens), Lent is a baptismal journal.

The Scriptures read during Lent proclaim the sorts of fasting and Lent that are pleasing to God and make us holy because they are inspired by the love of God and neighbor.
