

His Excellency Bishop Robert Barron has convoked a Diocesan Synod focused on the themes of evangelization and priestly vocations. This event aims to inspire and equip our community to share the joy of the Gospel and respond to God's call in their lives. As Pope Francis reminds us, we have a duty to share the Gospel with all whom we meet as we strive to be witnesses of Christ's love in the world.

The preparatory phase of the Synod will begin on March 2, 2025. During this phase, consultation will take place across the Diocese in order to aid the deliberations of the Synod assembly in August, on the Feast of the Queenship of Mary. We invite every member of the local church to participate in this preparatory phase by completing the survey on evangelization and vocations, which can be accessed by visiting our Synod website, or by scanning the code below.

Lent



We are now into the great season of Lent. It is important for us to realize that our life is a journey, a movement towards God and to prepare ourselves to receive him fully. That we are pilgrims on the journey is what Lent is all about. During the season of Lent, the church invites us to examine our lives, to repent of our sins and do penance. By means of fasting, penance and prayers, the faithful

obtain strength they need to overcome the sinful tendencies. The purpose of Lent is to provide that purification by weaning human persons from sin and selfishness through self-denial and prayer, by creating in them the desire to do God's will and to make his kingdom alive by making it first come into their hearts. The real aim of Lent above all else, is to prepare Christians for the celebration of the death and Resurrection of Jesus Christ. The better the preparation for this day, the more effective the celebration will be. One can effectively re-live the mystery only with a purified mind and heart. The Church invites all to repent from evil ways and return to the Lord who is eagerly waiting for each one to come to him. Hence Paul in the second reading tells us that it is necessary for us and for our salvation to believe in Jesus and witness to him.

In a time of crisis, will I remain true to my principles, no matter the cost? The first and third readings on this Lenten Sunday pose this challenging question. The selection from Deuteronomy is a presentation prayer. Recalled are the experiences of slavery in Egypt and of victory in the Promised Land where the Israelites settled down to farming. The prayer was recited as the first fruits of the harvest were offered. The reading urges the Israelites to preserve their values and principles against the false gods of the Canaanites who also inhabited the land. Luke shows how Jesus succeeds in his desert experience, in contrast to Israel. Jesus would not be bought off by Satan's offer of political power in the second temptation. Jesus' ultimate victory against evil will come in the passion.

Maple River Loaves & Fishes 2025 March Campaign

It's time to gear up for the largest statewide food and fund drive to help restock MN food shelves. The MN FoodShare March Campaign is the annual food and fund drive involving the 300 food shelves around the state. **The 2025 March Campaign will run March 1st, 2025 to April 6th, 2025.** The March Campaign is the only statewide food and fund drive that raises more than half the food distributed by the 300 food shelves.

The March Campaign also matches the dollar amount donated throughout the month of March. Remember, for every dollar you donate, we can buy \$10 worth of food using our network which includes Second Harvest, Kilty's Foods and other organizations. 100% of your money stays in the Maple River area, and 95% goes directly to food.

As a reference, 46% of our clients are from Mapleton, 21% Amboy, 18% Good Thunder, and 10% from MN. Lake. Did you know hunger is still a problem in Minnesota? Feeding America reports that 537,890 Minnesotans are facing hunger. 34% of these individuals are under the age of 18.

Minnesotans made an estimated record-breaking 9 million visits to food shelves in 2024.2 This is up 20% from the previous record of 7.5 million set in 2023. Annual visits to food shelves are now 150% higher than they were prior to the COVID-19 pandemic.

95% of contributions go towards Local hunger relief.

What to collect:

Food Donations - Food shelves need all types of food, personal hygiene and cleaning products.

Cash Donations – Easier to collect and deliver. Cash also gives us more flexibility to acquire perishable items like fresh produce, meat and dairy products.
