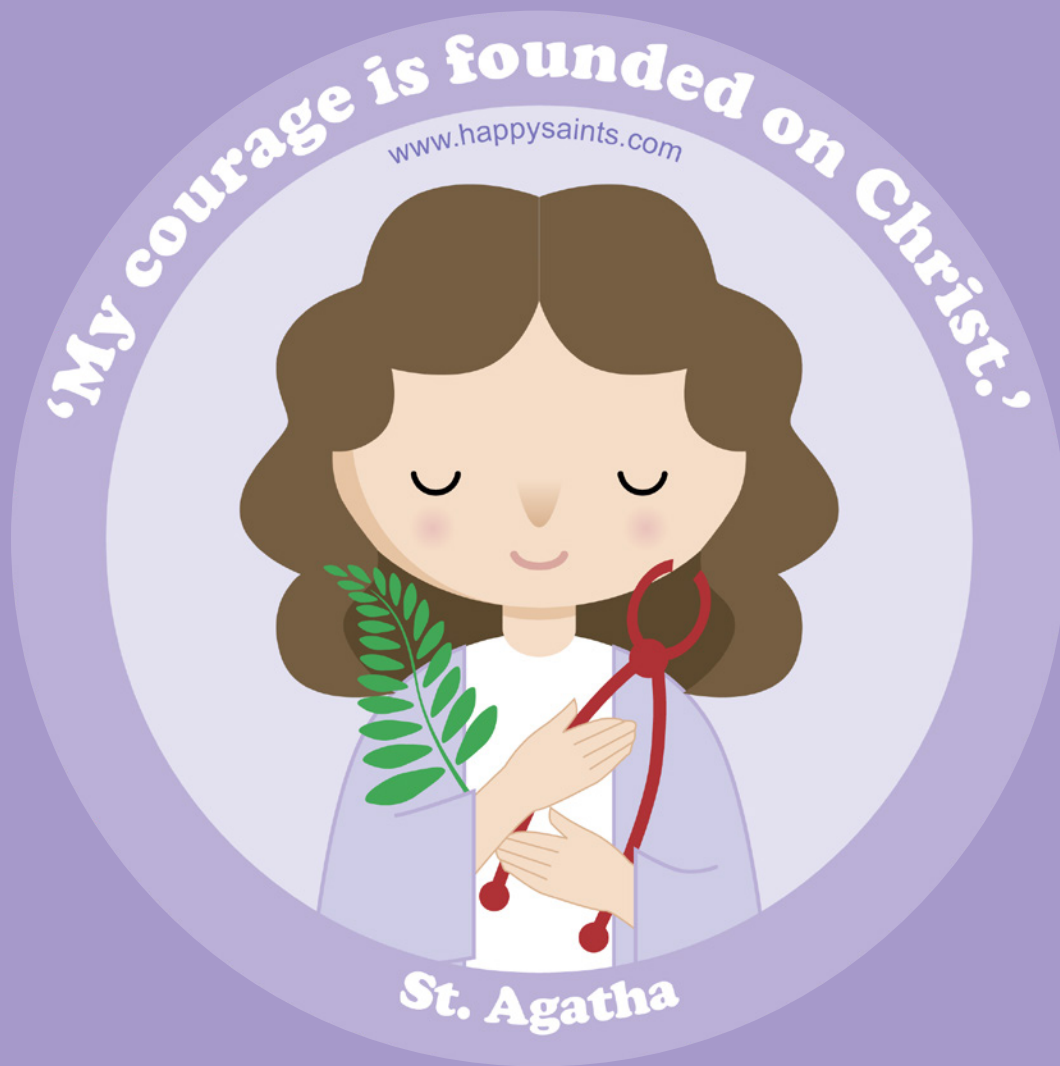

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St. Agatha (231 – 251) came from a rich family in Sicily. She dedicated her life to God as a young girl and rejected all marriage proposals. One important man tried to force St. Agatha into marriage by torturing her. She suffered humiliating and horrific tortures but her faith in Jesus remained strong until her death. She is the patron saint of Malta because she was believed to have saved the country from an invasion. Her feast day is on 5 February.

Prayer

Dear Lord Jesus, You gave St. Agatha the strength to bear her sufferings.
Give me courage to face my problems. Amen.



Unlike many countries, the Gospel of Jesus Christ was introduced into Korea by lay people and not by priests or religious. St. Andrew Kim (1821 – 1846) was the first native Catholic Priest in Korea and he administered to Christians secretly in a time when the faith was not allowed there. Those who were caught were tortured and killed, and Father Kim was one of them. Together with St. Paul Chong Hasang and hundreds of other Korean Catholics, he was a martyr who gave his life to the Lord Jesus. St. Andrew Kim is the patron saint of Korean clergy. His feast day, together with the other Korean martyrs, is on 20 September.

Dear Lord Jesus, St. Andrew Kim and his companions were persecuted for believing in You. I pray for Christians who suffer oppression everywhere.
Amen.



St. Boniface (7th Century AD) is known as the Apostle of the Germans because he helped many of them believe in Jesus. He was an English Benedictine monk sent as a missionary to Germany. He became the Bishop of Mainz and preached the Gospel bravely and tirelessly. Once, he used an ax to cut down a tree worshipped by the locals. Seeing that their 'gods' did not kill St. Boniface, they decided that his God was the true God. Some legends say that a new tree grew from the stump of the fallen tree and became the first Christmas tree! St. Boniface is the patron saint of Germany. His feast day is on 5 June.

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Dear Lord Jesus, You have blessed Your Church with courageous saints like St. Boniface. I want to be a brave defender of my faith too! Amen.



St. Charbel Makhluf (1828 – 1898) was a Maronite monk from Lebanon. Maronites are a group of Christians with a long history in the Middle East. At a young age, St. Charbel became a shepherd to his family's flock after his father died. His pious family upbringing taught him to love God greatly. Later, he joined a monastery and became a priest. Finally he became a hermit, living by himself in prayer and fasting. After his death, many healings and miracles occurred through his intercession.

St. Charbel's feast day is on 24 July.

Dear Lord Jesus, although St. Charbel was a hermit, he welcomed everyone who came to him. I pray for people everywhere to make peace with each other. Amen.



St. Cyril and St. Methodius (9th Century AD) were brothers from Greece who went to preach about Jesus to the Slavic people in Eastern Europe. They have great influence on the culture and religion of the Slavs who include Croats, Czechs, Poles, Slovaks, Russians, Ukrainians and many other peoples. They are called the Apostles of the Slavs. To teach the Gospel, they invented an alphabet known as the Cyrillic Alphabet, which is still used in the Eastern Churches today. St. Cyril became a monk and St. Methodius became a Bishop later. Their feast day is on 14 February.

Prayer

Dear Lord Jesus, St. Cyril and St. Methodius brought Your Good News to many people. Help me tell my friends how much You love them. Amen.



St. Dominic Savio (1842 – 1857) was a young Italian student of St. John Bosco. He had wanted to become a priest but he died of illness when he was only fourteen. St. Dominic resolved to become a saint from a young age, and loved to pray and speak to Jesus. He had great devotion to Mother Mary and even started a group of young boys dedicated to Mary's Immaculate Conception. Indeed, all of us can become saints when we are very young! St. Dominic is the patron saint of choirboys. His feast day is on 6 May.

Dear Lord Jesus, St. Dominic Savio is an inspiration to young people everywhere. I want to love You as he did. Amen.



St. Elizabeth Ann Seton (1774 – 1821) was the first native-born American to become a saint. She married a businessman and had five children. Her husband's business failed and he died of illness, leaving St. Elizabeth and her children penniless. She found peace in the Catholic faith, converted and began doing good works. She founded the first American religious community for women, the Sisters of Charity. She also started the first American parish school and orphanage. She is the patron saint of Catholic schools. Her feast day is on 4 January.

St. George (3rd Century AD) was a Greek soldier in the Roman army. He was martyred for believing in Jesus. There are many legends of St. George fighting a dragon, often to rescue a girl. St. Germaine Cousin of Pibrac (1579 – 1601) was a French shepherd girl who suffered much. She was born with a deformed hand, and was treated cruelly by her stepmother. She was sent to work in the farm instead of school. She found solace in God and offered her suffering for the salvation of others. Unloved and unwanted, St. Germaine's holiness and love for prayer eventually changed her family and indeed the entire village. She is the patron saint of disabled people and abused victims.

Her feast day is on 15 June.

Dear Lord Jesus, St. Germaine found solace in You amidst her miseries.
I pray that those who suffer will find strength in You. Amen.



St. John Baptist de la Salle (1651 – 1719) came from a wealthy family in France. He became a priest at 26 and started schools for poor people. Finding the teachers lacking proper training, he gave away his wealth to found a community dedicated to education. With prayers, perseverance and hard work, St. John Baptist and the 'Brothers of the Christian Schools' helped brought Catholic education to the common people. There are De La Salle schools all over the world today. St. John Baptist is the patron saint of teachers. His feast day is on 7 April.

St. John Fisher (1469 – 1535) was a Bishop during the time of King Henry VIII of England. He was a friend of the holy statesman, St. Thomas More. When King Henry went against the Catholic Church, St. John, St. Thomas and many others refused to join the king. As a result, they were executed. St. John Fisher was made a cardinal shortly before he died. His feast day is on 22 June.

St. Joseph of Cupertino (1603 – 1663) was a simple Italian boy who was taunted by people. His own parents considered him a nuisance because he was slow and could not learn any skills. As a servant in the Franciscan monastery, he was clumsy and forgetful. Yet, St. Joseph was very humble, gentle and devoted to God. By God's Grace, he was ordained a priest and grew in holiness. Through his purity and strict acts of penance, many miracles began to happen. He was often seen levitating, or floating above ground, when celebrating Mass or in other places! St. Joseph is the patron saint of pilots. His feast day is on 18 September.

He promoted human dignity and equality, which were unusual ideas in his time. His feast day is on 10 November.

St. Lucy is the patron saint of the blind and those with eye ailments. Her name literally means 'light'. Her feast day is on 13 December.

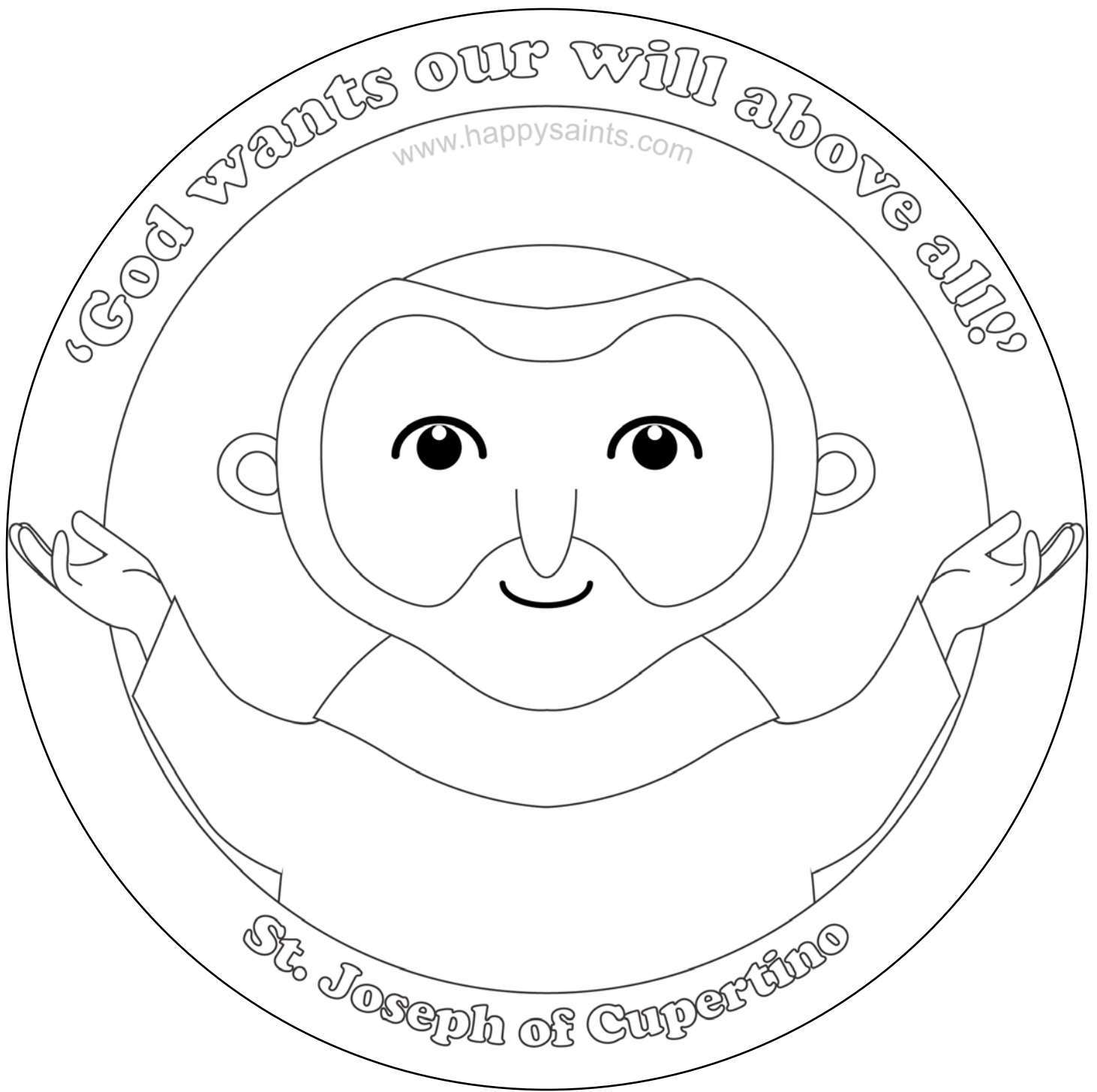


















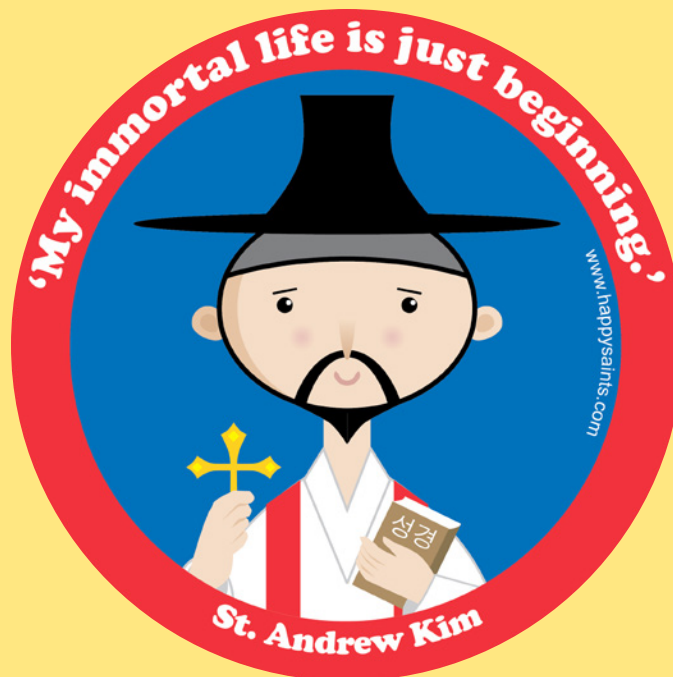
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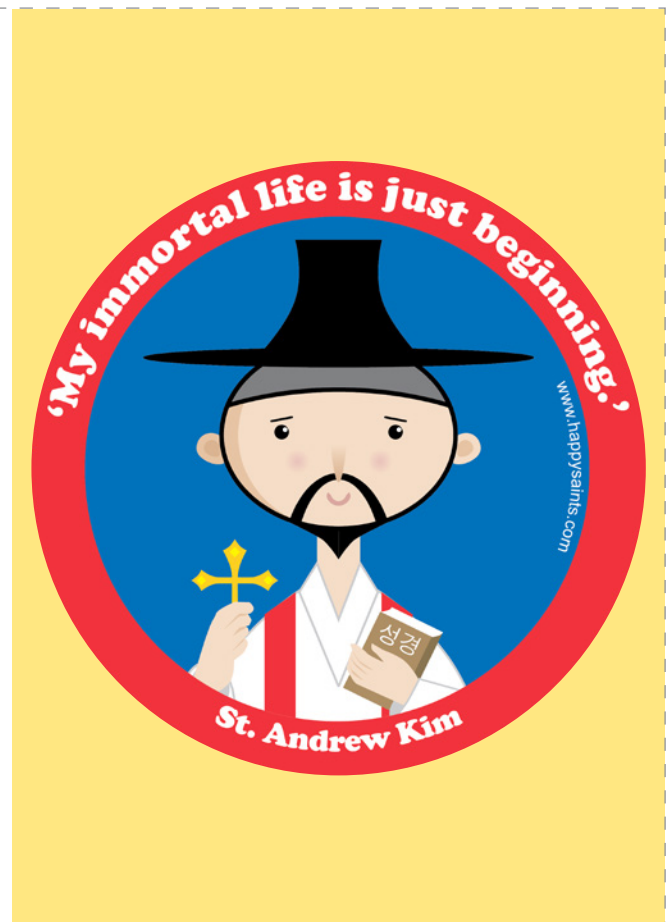
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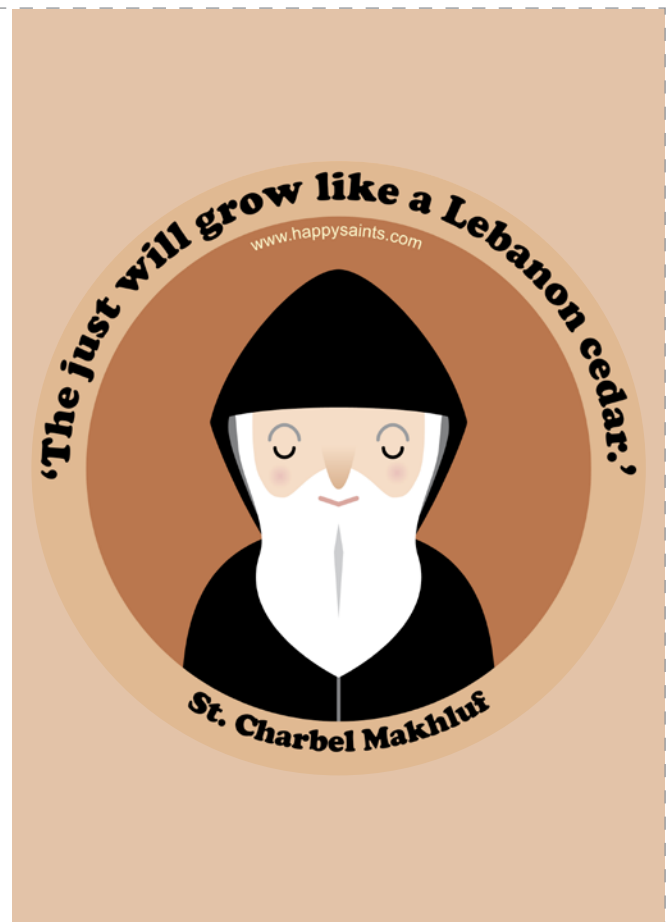
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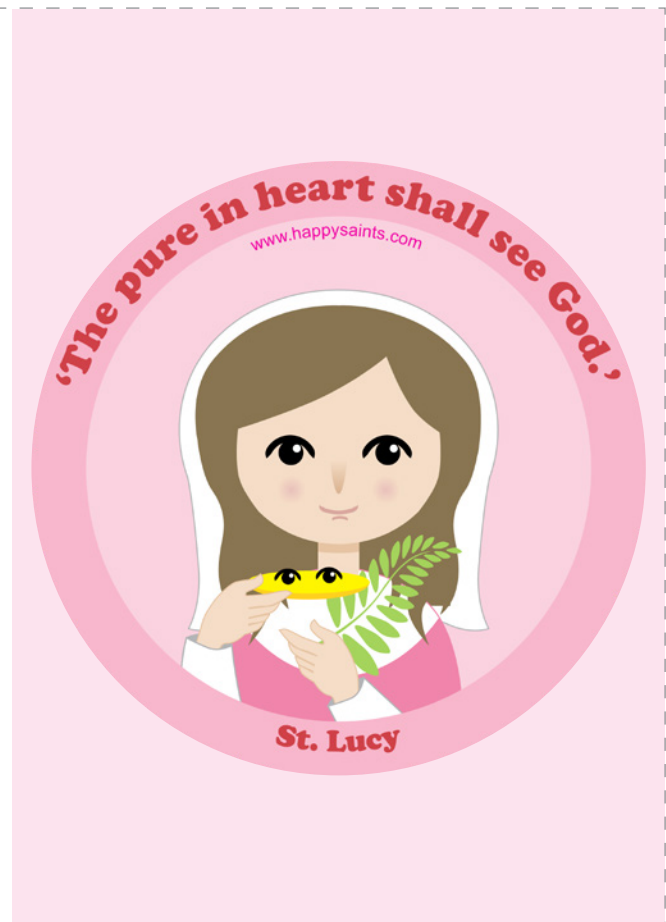
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St. Thomas More
