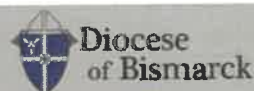

Amazing Grace is one of my most beloved American hymns. What always gets to me is how the words vividly reflect the joy in the salvation we all yearn for, while acknowledging the hardships that life inflicts upon us. It is a song of hope, of trust, and of absolute faith in a God of justice and a God of mercy. This week, I reflect upon what we tend to miss when we sing the song. A thing that today's Gospel helps to remind us. There can be no salvation if we are not ready and willing to be saved. And the path to salvation is clear.
