





DOMINGO 14 DE OCTUBRE XXVIII DOMINGO DEL TIEMPO ORDINARIO Marcos 10, 17-27

El evangelio nos ofrece una escena muy conocida: el joven rico y su pretensión de obtener la salvación ("heredar la vida eterna"). Es verdad que este texto es un conjunto no demasiado homogéneo. Los grandes maestros han pensado, no sin razón, que son varios textos en torno a palabras de Jesús sobre el peligro de las riquezas y sobre la vida eterna, las que se han conjuntado en esta pequeña historia. Es muy razonable distinguir tres partes: a) la escena del joven rico (vv.17-22); b) la dificultad para entrar en el Reino de Dios (vv. 23-27); c) las renuncias de los verdaderos discípulos (vv.28-30). Todo rematado sobre el dicho "los últimos serán los primeros " (v. 31). Las dos primeras tienen una conexión más fuerte que la tercera. Es verdad que todo el conjunto gira en torno a las claves del verdadero seguimiento. No se trata de una enseñanza sobre el voto de pobreza de los monjes, sino de algo que afecta a la salvación para todos.

Las riquezas, poseerlas, amarlas, buscarlas es un modo de vida que define una actitud contraria a la praxis del Reino de Dios y a la vida eterna: es poder, seguridad, placer... todo eso no es la felicidad. La alternativa, en este caso, es seguir a Jesús en vez de los preceptos de la ley, que le han permitido ser un hombre rico. En la mentalidad judía, ser un hombre de riquezas y ser justo iban muy unidos. Es eso, por lo mismo, lo que desbarata Jesús para este joven con su planteamiento del seguimiento como radicalidad. Pensar que el seguimiento de Jesús es una opción de miseria sería una forma equivocada de entender lo que nos propone este historia evangélica.
