

As I mentioned last week, I would like to write a series on the Nicene Creed. Let's dive in.

The first article: I believe in one God, the Father almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all things visible and invisible. In this article we profess, obviously, belief in one God. In looking at this article we have to remember that Jews and early Catholics lived in the midst of polytheists, i.e. those who believed in many gods. In the ancient world, many of these polytheists believed in henotheism, which was the belief that each nation had its own god or gods, and that if one nation conquered another, it meant that that nation's god had defeated the other nation's god in battle. It was within this context that God would reveal to the Jews his power and glory, often granting the Jews victory in battle against a very powerful enemy. It became known, then, that this tiny nation of Israel had a powerful God. Furthermore, God revealed to the Jews that not only was he a powerful God, but that he was Lord of all creation (calling himself "the Lord of heaven and earth") and the only God in existence. It was God and God alone who created the entire universe, and the socalled gods of the other nations were false, as the Psalmist says: "Their idols are silver and gold, the work of human hands. They have mouths but do not speak, eyes but do not see." Centuries later, Jesus, having been sent by the Father, confirmed this belief.

This one, true God we call "the Father almighty." We call him "almighty" because he has power to do all that he wills. This is demonstrated not only by great military victories but also by his complete control of creation, which we see, for example, in the parting of the Red Sea, miracles, and, of course, the act of creating. In fact, God created the entire universe out of nothing, meaning that there was no pre-existing matter for him to work with. All things that exist (besides God himself) were created by God. Finally, we call God our "Father." We say this because he is the Father of his Only Begotten Son, Jesus. Another reason is that he is truly our Father and we are truly his children. Let us, therefore, approach Our God and Father with great reverence, for he has power to do all that he wills.



Important information to know before voting on these measures

Four measures will appear on the North Dakota ballot on November 6, 2018.

Measure No. 1 is a constitutional amendment that would establish new mandates on private and public persons related to attempts to influence government. While well-intentioned, Measure 1 is poorly drafted, cannot be easily fixed, and is a threat to the mission of churches and charities. Among its many problems, it would force churches to divulge the private information its members or contributors as the "price" for speaking on a public issue. The North Dakota Catholic Conference urges a **NO vote on Measure 1**.

Measure 2 is constitutional amendment to state that "only a citizen" of the United States is a qualified elector, instead of the current provision that states "every citizen" of the United States is a qualified elector. The North Dakota Catholic Conference has no position on Measure 2. Catholics should use their informed prudential judgment.

Measure 3 is a statutory measure to legalize recreational marijuana. It removes practically every law concerning marijuana and has no limits how much or where a person could grow, sell, or use marijuana. It is a threat to health, safety, and the common good. The North Dakota Catholic Conference urges a **NO vote on Measure 3**.

Measure 4 is a statutory measure requiring the Department of Transportation to issue red personalized vehicle plates to volunteer emergency responders. The North Dakota Catholic Conference has no position on Measure 4. Catholics should use their informed prudential judgment.
