

GUADALUPE Wednesday, December 12th St. Joseph's Parish will have a bilingual procession that will begin at 7:00 PM, followed by Mass at 7:10 PM and a reception to celebrate the feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe. Everyone is invited to attend.

KNIGHTS OF COLUMBUS Monday, the 10th of December following the 7:00 PM Mass the Knights of Columbus will have a meeting in O'Neill Hall.

For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate, he suffered death and was buried.

Here we profess that Jesus was crucified under Pontius Pilate (as the Scriptures tell us), who was the governor of Judea during the reign of the Roman emperor Tiberias. But why do we make it a point to say Pilate's name in our Creed? The reason is that gives an accurate time frame as to when exactly Our Blessed Lord's Passion occurred. We then profess that Jesus did truly die and was buried. Today some try to claim that Jesus did not truly die on the cross (a truly ridiculous claim, considering what crucifixion was) but simply passed out. The consequence of this being that Jesus did not, then actually rise from the dead. Such an absurd belief contradicts all the evidence. Jesus truly died. In fact, the Romans recognized that he had died when they went up to break his legs. They would do this because people who were crucified died of asphyxiation. Because of this the crucified would often push themselves up with their legs so they could breath for a short time. This often meant that a person would hang on a cross for a few days before death. Breaking their legs sped up the process. In discovering that Jesus was dead, a soldier thrust a lance into his side to make sure, causing blood and water to flow out. I'll spare you the science lesson, suffice it to say that this indicates that the soldier literally pierced his heart. After his death, Joseph of Arimathea and Nicodemus buried him in a nearby tomb (it's about a hundred yards from the place of crucifixion.)

Why did he have to die? What was the point? In short, the point was that Jesus was offering himself in sacrifice. We refer to Jesus (as Scripture does) as "the Lamb of God." Scripture says this because in the Old Covenant lambs were sacrificed in atonement for the sins of Israel. Jesus, however, offers himself as the final and definitive sacrifice for the sins of all mankind.

How do we, then, receive the fruits of this sacrifice? It is through the sacraments. We receive the forgiveness of our sins through Baptism and Confession (which forgives sins committed after Baptism). I would also like to explain how the Eucharist is intimately tied to the Crucifixion, but I have exceeded my word limit, so that's all for this week.




