HAVE YOU TALKED TO YOUR MOTHER LATELY?

This Monday, October 7th, the Church celebrates the feast of Our Lady of the Rosary. The rosary is the most popular devotion to the mother of God specifically because through it we meditate on the mysteries of Christ's own life and learn about the gift of our salvation through the profound relationship Jesus has with His mother. "Behold your mother" were some of the last words Jesus spoke before he died. Therefore, we, like John, are called to receive the gift of Mary and take her into our home. One of these ways is through the rosary. Below are 15 promises given by Mother Mary to Blessed Alan de la Roche (15th century) to those who devotedly pray the rosary. The Catholic Church categorizes these promises as private revelation, signifying that although they are not considered part of church doctrine, Catholics are free to believe them as a pious tradition and may use them towards the betterment of their faith. The promises are given a "nihil obstat" and "imprimatur" (meaning "nothing obstructs" and "let it be printed," respectively). This means that the promises have been reviewed by a Catholic authority, in this case an archbishop and a cardinal, and have been found not to contradict any teachings of the Catholic faith.

1. Whoever shall faithfully serve me by the recitation of the Rosary, shall receive special graces.
2. I promise my special protection and the greatest graces to all those who shall recite the Rosary.
3. The Rosary shall be a powerful armor against hell, it will destroy vice, decrease sin, and defeat heresies.
4. It will cause virtue and good works to flourish; it will obtain for souls the abundant mercy of God; it will withdraw the heart of men from the love of the world and its vanities, and will lift them to the desire of eternal things. Oh, that souls would sanctify themselves by this means.
5. The soul which recommends itself to me by the recitation of the Rosary shall not perish.
6. Whoever shall recite the Rosary devoutly, applying himself to the consideration of its sacred mysteries, shall never be conquered by misfortune. God will not chastise him in His justice, he shall not perish by a sudden death; if he be just he shall remain in the grace of God, and become worthy of eternal life.
7. Whoever shall have a true devotion for the Rosary shall not die without the sacraments of the Church.
8. Those who are faithful to recite the Rosary shall have, during their life and at their death, the light of God and the plenitude of His graces; at the moment of death they shall participate in the merits of the saints in paradise.
9. I shall deliver from Purgatory those who have been devoted to the Rosary.
10. The faithful children of the Rosary shall merit a high degree of glory in heaven.
11. You shall obtain all you ask of me by the recitation of the Rosary.
12. All those who propagate the Holy Rosary shall be aided by me in their necessities.
13. I have obtained from my Divine Son that all the advocates of the Rosary shall have for intercessors the entire celestial court during their life and at the hour of death.
14. All who recite the Rosary are my sons, and brothers of my only son Jesus Christ.
15. Devotion of my Rosary is a great sign of predestination.
