

From the Pastor's Desk

As we near the end of the Church's liturgical year, the readings become more eschatological – meaning that they have to do with the end times. The main theme of today's readings is the reality of life after death and of the relationship between our lives on earth and the life of glory or punishment that will follow. Many Christians today, even good, pious Christians, fear death and try to keep the very thought of it far from their minds. The normal, pious Christian however, should see death as what it is, an end of his time of probation and the door to his eternal reward. It is not normal for a student to dread his graduation day. Death for the God-fearing, honest Christian is graduation day. Therefore, no Christian should be afraid of it. Let each one of us look into his own conscience this day. If there are sins on my conscience, which I would not want there when facing my just Judge, I still have time to approach the merciful Father. The Christian who does this daily, or even weekly, will not worry when death calls.

Internet Accountability and Filtering

Pornography is not a topic about which most adults are comfortable speaking. This is especially the case when it comes to parents addressing it with their children. Too many parents, grandparents, and guardians think that internet-based pornography is beyond the interest of their children. Statistics tell us another story.

To provide you with the tools you need to overcome pornography and to make your home a safe haven for children and adults—one free of pornography—our diocese celebrated its first-ever Safe Haven Sunday the weekend of Nov. 2-3. The awareness weekend was implemented to provide access to teaching and resources that support and protect individuals, marriages, and families in making all homes a safe haven.

In the next few weeks, Fr. Kovash will be mailing each family/individual registered at our parish the book, *Equipped: Smart Catholic Parenting in a Sexualized Culture*. This book includes a unique seven-day text-to-opt-in program: *The Equipped 7-Day E-mail Challenge*. This challenge provides practical tips any caring adult can take to create safer digital environments for themselves and our young people. We encourage you to take advantage of these resources and ask that you be intentional about taking the steps suggested to ensure safety and joy for you, your loved ones, and the greater community.
