

I believe in one, holy, catholic, and apostolic Church.

In this article we profess belief in what we call the four marks of the Church. As the Catechism teaches us "[t]hese four characteristics, inseparably linked with each other, indicate essential features of the Church and her mission." I will treat each one individually.

First we profess that the Church is one. Specifically this refers to the *unity* of the Church. The Church is unified first because of her divine founder. Jesus founded a single Church (As he said to Peter, "I call you Peter and upon this rock, I will build *my Church*. (Matthew 16:18). What exactly does this word "Church" mean? "Church" is a translation of the Greek word "ecclesia" which means "assembly." Therefore, the Church is the "assembly" of God. It stands to reason, then, that all believers must be united into one "assembly." There is a concept of the Christian faith that professes that as long as the individual believes in Christ in his heart, then "going to Church" is unnecessary. This is contrary to the will of Christ who willed that all those who believe in him would be gathered into one community.

How do we know, then that we are part of the true Church of Christ? The Church identifies three visible bonds of unity: the profession of faith received from the Apostles, common celebration of divine worship, especially the sacraments, and apostolic succession through the sacrament of Holy Orders (this last one regards the fact that the bishops are successors of the Apostles, and the tangible sign that you are unified with the Church in unity with the local bishop and with the pope).

That said there are three sins against unity: heresy, schism, and apostasy. Heresy is the denial of something that is divinely revealed. For example: to deny that Jesus is God or that Mary was conceived without original sin are heresies. Such denials wound unity because they attack the faith that unifies us (the history of the Church shows that heretics regularly divide Christians as a matter of course).

Those who are in schism generally profess the same faith as the Church but refuse to submit to legitimate ecclesiastical authority. Usually this takes the form of a refusal to acknowledge the authority of the pope. The best known case of schism is the Orthodox Church. The Orthodox Church professes our same faith (and even has valid sacraments) but do not recognize the pope's authority (they've been in schism since 1054).

Finally, apostasy is the formal renunciation of the Catholic faith. These three sins, sadly, are all too common in the world today. Let us, then, profess our faith boldly and submit to the yoke of the Church that Christ founded so that we may fulfill that which he himself prayed for: "that they may be one" (John 17:22).


