Director of Religious Education (DRE)

Responsibilities of the Religious Education Director are as follows:

- Recruit, develop, and support volunteers, with the help of the pastor (calling teachers from the previous year in May or early summer to see if interested in teaching again).
- Provide curriculum planning and preparation (ordering new books in August for new school year).
- Look at school calendars with the pastor in order to confirm dates for RE calendar, including RCIA and other parish events.
- Maintain religious education registration, budget, expenses, files, and records including all sacramental recording throughout the year for any sacraments that are done at any of our three parishes.
- Make sure Safe Environment background checks are done on all new volunteers and employees of church and school, as well as provide safe environment training for all volunteers and employees of the church. Safe Environment training DVDs are shown to grades Kindergarten through 8th grade before the end of the year for all three parishes. The Diocese of Bismarck Safe Environment Parish Worksheet is filled out and due by June 30th.
- Provide for parent meetings for 1st Communion and Confirmation.
- Collaborate with parish staff and other ministers.
- Offer resources and support to parents and catechists as needed.
- Make sure classrooms in the school are set up and ready for Wednesday nights and things are put away. Make sure school is locked by the end of the day after each Faith Formation Wednesday.
- Schedule Senior Mass and meeting with Pastor.
- Coordinate needs for any baptism requests.
- Assist and coordinate any needs for the RCIA classes and administrative work.
- Continue assisting with the parish website, Facebook, and preparing the weekly bulletins for the parish.
- Assist Pastor with book orders, gifts, and any other needs.

I believe in the Holy Spirit...who has spoken through the prophets.

Regarding this article of the Creed the Catechism states: "By 'prophets' the faith of the Church here understands all whom the Holy Spirit inspired in living proclamation and in the composition of the sacred books, both of the Old and the New Testaments." This means that when we read any passage in the Bible, we reading the words that the Holy Spirit himself has inspired. Paragraphs 105-107 of the Catechism are very informative on this matter and so I will quote them here in full:

God is the author of Sacred Scripture.

"The divinely revealed realities, which are contained and presented in the text of Sacred Scripture, have been written down under the inspiration of the Holy Spirit."

"For Holy Mother Church, relying on the faith of the apostolic age, accepts as sacred and canonical the books of the Old and the New Testaments, whole and entire, with all their parts, on the grounds that, written under the inspiration of the Holy Spirit, they have God as their author and have been handed on as such to the Church herself."

God inspired the human authors of the sacred books. "To compose the sacred books, God chose certain men who, all the while he employed them in this task, made full use of their own faculties and powers so that, though he acted in them and by them, it was as true authors that they consigned to writing whatever he wanted written, and no more."

The inspired books teach the truth. "Since therefore all that the inspired authors or sacred writers affirm should be regarded as affirmed by the Holy Spirit, we must acknowledge that the books of Scripture firmly, faithfully, and without error teach that truth which God, for the sake of our salvation, wished to see confided to the Sacred Scriptures."

St. Robert Bellarmine puts it nicely: "The tongues and hands of the sacred authors should be called nothing other than the writing instruments of the Holy Spirit." That said, a couple of things need to be kept in mind. First, we need an authentic interpreter of the Scriptures, or else we will likely fall into error. For this reason, Jesus gave his Church (in particular the Magisterium) the authority to authentically interpret Scripture (NOTE: The Church interprets Scripture the exact same way as it did in the early Church, hence the Church's interpretation of Scripture does not change). Finally, each book of the Bible needs to be read according to its genre, or else, once again, we will fall into error.

On that note, two final thoughts before I close: first, as the Catholic faithful, we do not need to fear anything disproving the Bible. This is because truth cannot contradict truth. For example, a scientific truth will never contradict the Bible rightly interpreted. As St. Augustine says, "let every good and true Christian understand that wherever truth may be found, it belongs to his Master."

Finally, we always must have *respect for the text of Scripture*. As Augustine says again, "it is necessary to have our hearts subdued by piety, and not to run in the face of Holy Scripture, whether when understood it strikes at some of our sins, or, when not understood, we feel as if we could be wiser and give better commands ourselves. We must rather think and believe that whatever is there written, even though it be hidden, is better and truer than anything we could devise by our own wisdom."
