Winter is here! Please remind your child to bring their "Fab 5" (coat, hat, gloves, snow pants, and snow boots) each and every day! *I believe in one, holy, catholic, and apostolic Church.*

This week I would like to discuss the fourth and final mark of the Church: The Church is *apostolic*. This means that the Church is built on apostolic foundations. Allow me to explain. At one point during Jesus' public ministry, Jesus called his disciples to himself and appointed twelve of them and named them "apostles" (Peter, Andrew, James, John, Thomas, James the Less, Matthew, Philip, Bartholomew, Simon, Jude, and Judas) (Mark 3:13-14). These twelve were given authority in the Church (which is evident from the testimony of the New Testament, especially Acts of the Apostles). Furthermore, within the apostles, there was an "inner circle" consisting of Peter, James, and John, and even among them, Peter clearly had primacy (Matthew 16:18-19). The apostles, then, had the authority to teach, govern, and sanctify the people of God.

Given the spread of the Church throughout the whole world and the inevitability of death, the apostles needed to appoint successors to teach, govern, and sanctify the Church. This they did, and their successors we call *bishops*. That's right, *every, single, bishop* is a successor of the apostles, carrying on the authority that the apostles once had.

There is one other thing about the apostles that is absolutely essential: their testimony. The Church is also called apostolic because it believes in the *exact, same faith* as the apostles themselves. Why? Because the apostles are those who actually witnessed the preaching and actions of Jesus (most importantly his death and resurrection). Imagine it this way: say I want to know something about my grandfather (who passed away when I was two). Who would ask? Certainly, my mother or grandmother. Why? Because they actually knew him and I can trust them to tell me about him accurately. It's the same with the apostles, they witnessed these things and we know that their testimony is true. (cf. John 19:35). In fact, this is so important to the Church that the testimony of the apostles has always been seen as the sure and certain guide for correct teaching.

But how do we know that the apostles teaching has been kept intact? The reasons are simple. First, we can look at the testimony of Scripture and of Catholics throughout all the centuries and see that the Catholic Church's teachings have never changed. Second, their writings are undoubtedly authentic and we have multiple copies from many different areas of the world that corroborate each other. Finally, Jesus told us that he would give the apostles the Holy Spirit to guide them into all truth (John 16:12). The Holy Spirit is then given to them (and to the whole Church) on the feast of Pentecost. Hence, the Holy Spirit guides the Church throughout the centuries to keep her true to the teachings of the Holy Apostles.

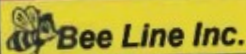
