*I look forward to the resurrection of the dead.*

Earlier we looked at how we believe that Jesus rose from the dead. In this article we profess the resurrection of the dead in general. We know, of course, that our souls will live forever and that our bodies will die. However, we must remember that on the last day (when Jesus comes again) he will raise our bodies up as well and then our bodies will also live forever.

We need to remember that this is a distinctly Christian belief. In the first century, it was only the Catholic Church and some Jews who believed in the resurrection of the dead. It was the belief of pagan religions that when the body died, that it was simply dead, never to come to life again. In fact, it is because of our belief in the resurrection of the dead that Church strictly *forbids* the spreading of ashes after death. Remember: the preferred mode of burial is to bury the body intact. Cremation is permitted, but the ashes absolutely **MUST** be buried. The reason for this is that burial of the body indicates hope for the resurrection of the dead, whereas spreading of the ashes over a landscape constitutes a denial of this fact (in fact, in the early centuries of the Church, the Romans would not allow Catholics to bury the bodies of martyrs, but rather leave them exposed so as to be eaten by animals as a way of mocking the resurrection of the dead).

There are a few other things that we need to keep in mind here. First is the state of the resurrected body. When we rise from the dead, we will have glorified bodies. Our bodies will no longer be subject to death, diseases, or any other kind of suffering.

Let us also remember that our hope for the resurrection of the dead is firmly rooted in Christ. We will be raised *by him*: "For this is the will of my Father, that everyone who sees the Son and believes in him may have eternal life, and I shall raise him on the last day" (John 6:40). At this point, I want to point to something very important: Jesus promises to raise up *those who believe in him*. Those who are true followers of Christ will rise to the resurrection of life, but those who are not will rise to the resurrection of judgment (John 5:29). Let us, therefore, always strive to follow the Lord Jesus, waiting in blessed hope for the coming of our Savior.
