## From the Pastor's Desk

The main themes of today's Scripture readings are the power of intercessory prayer, the ideal prayer, the Our Father, and the necessity for persistence and perseverance in prayer, with trusting faith and boldness. In short, the readings teach us what to pray for and how to pray. The first reading, taken from the book of Genesis, gives us a model of intercessory prayer provided by Abraham in his dialogue with God. In the gospel passage, after teaching a model prayer, Jesus instructs his disciples to pray to God their heavenly Father with the same boldness, daring, intimacy, conviction, persistence and perseverance shown both by Abraham and by the friend in need in Jesus' parable. Jesus gives us the assurance that God will neither be irritated by our requests nor unwilling to meet them with generosity.

# LITURGY AND FAITH CROSSROADS

Although all space in the world rightfully belongs to God, still the Church designates a special and sacred building for us to worship and experience God amidst the Mass and during quiet get-away moments in our day if we so choose. More often than not, the world is a busy, noisy, godless place, and it is, therefore, paramount that we have a place set apart to encounter God. When we enter a Church building, a door opens to a new, interior world, and the door behind us closes to the outside world. This change in worlds reflects what should also be taking place in our soul. A Catholic Church is literally the house of

God, and just as when we enter someone else's home and we respect their ways of doing things, leaving our own ways behind, so do we

similarly begin doing things differently when we enter God's house. This is where liturgy comes in. Everything we experience in God's house is supposed to reflect Him and His "style", so to speak. But most specifically, liturgy is supposed to lead us, as invited guests, into deeper conversation with our Host. "My house shall be called a house of prayer for all the nations" (Mk 15:17), Jesus says. Hence, attention must be given to the environment that assists prayer, namely, silence. Silence is the language of God, and it is called this because it is only within the silence of the heart that we can hear God's voice. St. John Paul II, writing in 2004 to mark the 40th anniversary of the Second Vatican Council's document on the liturgy, Sacrosanctum Concilium, challenges each of us, saying "One aspect that we must foster in our communities with greater commitment is the experience of silence." We are called to observe a spirit of silence not only for others who wish to pray, but most especially for ourselves, so that we can more readily hear the many things God wishes to say to us. Our church building must feel different from the outside world because it holds the Most Sacred, the God of the universe! The best way for it to retain this sacred feel is through a spirit of silence, and we are privileged in our call to play an integral part in this!!
