

This Tuesday, July 16th, we celebrate the feast of Our Lady of Mount Carmel, who in 1251 gave St. Simon Stock, a Carmelite monk, the brown scapular. The brown scapular, now commonly unknown, is a sacramental of the Catholic Church that has the promise attached to it—with certain conditions fulfilled—that anyone who dies wearing it will not suffer eternal fire. Later in 1322, Pope John XXII also attached the Sabbatine privilege to the scapular, meaning that on the Saturday following one's death, Our Lady would come deliver one's soul from purgatory. The conditions attached to the

receiving of the promises are: 1) Wear the scapular continuously 2) Observe chastity according to one's state in life and 3) Recite daily the Little Office of Our Blessed Mother (or the Rosary as a substitute with permission from a priest). Many religious brothers and sisters wear a large scapular around the shoulders, but the laity are invited to wear a smaller woolen form. 
