



<u>LITURGY AND</u> <u>FAITH</u>

CROSSROADS

Water is a paradoxical element. All life depends upon it, yet it is one of the most destructive forces in this world. Thus, appropriately, Christ chose water as the instrument of our salvation through baptism, for we depend upon baptism as the means to receive spiritual life and, through it, sin is destroyed. But besides using water for our one-time baptism, the Church also consecrates water in a special

way for our frequent usage. Thus, every Catholic Church has holy water available for us in which to dip our fingers and sign ourselves with the Sign of the Cross as we enter and leave, and every church should have holy water available for the faithful to take home. The water we drink is a thing easily take for granted in our lives because of its ready availability to us. But perhaps even more so do we take holy water for granted and use it mindlessly—or even not at all. So, let us briefly examine its significance for our lives. Holy water, first and foremost, directly symbolizes and points to Christ. Jesus calls Himself the living water in Scripture, and He invites us to "come to [Him] and drink" (Jn 7:37). In symbolizing Christ, it symbolizes Him as the source of every possible grace. Although holy water is not a sacrament and cannot give sanctifying grace, it is a means of actual grace. Its effectiveness comes through the prayers of intercession from the Church, and its use removes spiritual obstacles to the mind and will. We can even be forgiven of venial sins through its use. It is also very effective in repelling the Evil One who cannot stand the Person it represents and the power the Church has over him through its prayer. It is of wise practice to have holy water accessible in the home to every family member and to try to develop a habit of using it morning and night. For parents, it is also an important practice of blessing children with holy water before bed, especially since children commonly experience bad dreams. To learn more about further benefits of holy water, how to use it, as well as its biblical foreshadowing, you may read the brief book, Holy Water and its Significance for Catholics by Father Henry Theiler from Sophia Institute Press.

THE FORGOTTEN SACRAMENT: REVIVING ANOINTING OF THE SICK

Each of us will die one day, and for some reason we rarely ponder that day. The Church gives us the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick as a means to strengthen and heal both physically and spiritually those who are dying, or those who are in danger of death through grave illness or undergoing a serious operation. If you are elderly, or even if you are young and in good health, express your wish to your family or friends that you wish to be anointed by a priest when in danger of death. Ask for the Last Rites (in addition to Anointing) when death is certain. If you know other Catholics who may be ignorant of this Sacrament, tell them about the fruits and healing possible through its reception.
