Year of St. Joseph—December 8th, 2020-December 8th, 2021

On Dec 8th, Pope Francis issued a decree launching a special year dedicated to St. Joseph, coinciding the 150th anniversary of the declaration of St. Joseph as Patron of the Catholic Church, hailing him as a model of fatherhood and a key intercessor in modern times. The decree outlined several instances in which faithful may obtain a plenary indulgence in relation to the Year of St. Joseph, provided they meet the usual conditions of going to confession, receiving the Eucharist, and praying for the intentions of the pope. According to the document, a plenary indulgence will be available under these conditions:

- To those who meditate on the Our Father prayer for at least 30 minutes or take part in a spiritual retreat of at least one day that includes a meditation on St. Joseph
- To those who perform a corporal or spiritual work of mercy
- To families or engaged couples who recite the rosary together
- To those who entrust their daily work to St. Joseph and those who ask St. Joseph to intercede for the unemployed
- To those who recite a prayer to St. Joseph (the litanies of St. Joseph in Latin rite, or Akathistos to St. Joseph in the Byzantine rite, or any other prayer to St. Joseph) for the relief of Christians persecuted both inside and outside of the Church
- To faithful who recite "any legitimately approved prayer or act of piety in honor of St. Joseph," with an encouragement to do so on the March 19 and May 1 feasts of St. Joseph, the Feast of the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph, the Byzantine celebration of St. Joseph's Sunday, and on the 19th of every month and on every Wednesday, which has been dedicated to St. Joseph in the Latin rite
- To the elderly, sick, dying and those legitimately unable to leave the house, who recite an act of piety to St. Joseph under his title of Comfort of the Sick and Patron of a happy death, provided they offer their discomfort to God and fulfill the conditions for the indulgence "as soon as possible".

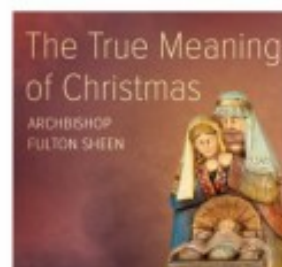

The ND Tax Credit...is still here!

North Dakota has established a Tax Credit (ND Century Code 57-38-01.21) that allows individuals, businesses, trusts, and estates to take advantage of a 40% state tax credit for contributions of \$5,000 or more to qualified ND charitable endowment funds. Even better, the unused portion of that state tax credit can be carried forward for three years.

The general provisions of North Dakota's Tax Credit (ND Century Code 57-38-01.21) are as follows:

- 1) A 40% state income tax credit can be taken on contributions to qualified North Dakota-based charitable endowment funds.
- 2) Contributions can be made by individuals, businesses, trusts, or estates.
- 3) To qualify, the contribution must be a minimum of \$5,000.
- 4) The maximum North Dakota tax credit is \$10,000 for single tax filers and \$20,000 for those who are married and filing jointly. The maximum tax credit for a single individual would be \$10,000, equal to 40% of a \$25,000 contribution. The maximum tax credit for a married couple would be \$20,000, equal to 40% of a \$50,000 contribution.
- 5) The unused portion of the North Dakota state income tax credit can be carried forward for three years.
