

# From the Pastor's Desk

# Keeping Sunday Holy during a Time of Mass Suspension

While we have been dispensed from attending Sunday Mass at Church, we have not been dispensed from keeping Sunday holy. Therefore, let us be sure that we still keep the Lord's day holy by taking in Sunday Mass online or on TV. Daily and Sunday Masses said by Fr. Kovash and Fr. Luger can be viewed online at stjparish.com and on our Facebook page. Masses are available for viewing by 9am daily-except Monday which will be online in the evening. Please refer to the guide to the right to find ways to create a Mass environment similar to what one might experience at Church so that you may feel like you are actively participating in Mass.

Although we sadly cannot receive the Eucharist currently, the Church asks us to unite ourselves to Jesus in a spiritual Communion. May these days of not receiving His Body and Blood at Mass inspire in us a deeper longing for Him in our hearts.

Here is a prayer example for a Spiritual Communion. While viewing Mass, you may pray this at the usual time of receiving Communion in the Mass.

# HOW TO PRAY THE TV MASS FROM HOME

Creating a sacred space to reverently watch the mass in your home

Create a prayer altar under your TV or streaming device. Consider setting a crucifix or other sacred art in the prayer space. Open your bible to the gospel of the day and place it on your "home altar" to remind you that the Word of God is among you. Light a candle to symbolize the beautiful light that shines in the darkness and to help your home resemble the Church.

Set up chairs like a pew to help you engage in the mass and keep you from passively watching from the couch. Get dressed as you normally would when attending mass. Keeping this routine is especially helpful for children.

If you have holy water at home, bless yourself and your family before you begin the mass.

Take a few moments of silence to transition from the busyness of your home to the sacredness of the mass. Fully participate by standing, kneeling, sitting and responding according to the rubrics of the mass. Engage in community by having coffee and breakfast with your family after mass or by calling your loved ones to connect.

# Info regarding potential Celebrations/Gatherings in the Church from the Bismarck Diocese

Weddings - All weddings already scheduled may take place but are to be limited to the bride and groom, the two witnesses, the parents of the bride and groom and the priest or deacon who is to witness the marriage. The Church's Rite of Matrimony Within or Outside of Mass may be used.

Funerals - All funerals are to be private not public, that is to say, for the immediate family only and for the priest or deacon who is the celebrant. The Rite of Christian Funerals Within or Outside of Mass may be used. There is to be no wake and/or vigil observed the day before or day of the funeral. No luncheon or dinner is permitted in the church hall after the funeral.

Baptism - Infant baptism may be administered but may have only 10 persons including the priest or deacon pre-

RCIA - RCIA classes are cancelled, but individual preparation can still be provided. The sacramental initiation of adults by a Profession of Faith or by baptism may take place at the discretion of the priest but must be done individually and with no more than 10 persons present.



# Phishing email WARNING!

In recent weeks, several parishioners and office/school staff have received fraudulent attempts via email to share personal information or to follow directives from "Rev. Russell Kovash" to extend assistance to third parties. These are phishing (word coined as an analog with the sport of angling) attempts by scammers using e-mail lures, setting out hooks to "fish" for passwords, financial data, or direct assistance from the "sea" of internet users. There are four components to look out for in a phishing email scheme:

Generic greeting. In our local scenario, the scam is simply a greeting from someone pretending to be Father Kovash. Understand that your email addresses are readily accessible from public databases so how they got yours should not be surprising.

Forged link or Fake e-mail address. Even if a link has a name you recognize somewhere in it, it doesn't mean it originates from or points to the real person or the actual organization such as a bank or government agency. Roll your mouse over the link and see if it matches what appears in the email. If there is a discrepancy, don't click on the link. Also, websites where it is safe to enter personal information begin with "https" - the "s" stands for secure

(with some browsers, a padlock icon may take the place of the "https"). If you don't see these before the link, do not proceed.

Requests personal information. The point of sending phishing email is to trick you into providing private information. If you receive an email requesting personal information – or a note to "email me as soon as you get this message" - be on the alert that it might be a phishing attempt. If you know the person sending the email, call or text them to confirm the validity of the message. Sense of urgency. Internet criminals want you to provide your personal information now. They do this by making you think something has happened that requires you to act fast. The faster they get your information, or to get you to comply with instructions, the faster they can move on to another victim.

In the reported instances where Fr. Kovash's identity was hijacked to phish, the originating emails were variations of his name and title. Anyone can create a fake email account such as kovashrevrussell@gmail.com or frkovashbismarcknd@gmail.com or any such combination simply by getting the relevant data from the parish or diocesan website. Coupled with a personal greeting, these hooks allow cybercriminals to get their target victims to reply and comply.

DO NOT readily reply without examining the email address from which the inquiry or greeting is coming from. Keep in mind that companies, agencies, and people can be impersonated online.

If in doubt, contact the pastor directly, or confirm the requests with the Parish Office if you're not able to reach him. Father Kovash will never place a direct, targeted petition via email.
