





Keeping Children and Teens SAFE ONLINE

Computers and mobile devices can be helpful tools for children and teens to learn and grow in faith and fellowship. Unfortunately, the digital world is also full of unsafe and explicit content. You wouldn't hand a teen the car keys without first teaching them how to drive. The same should be true for using technology—teach them how to keep themselves and others safe while using it.

You can use the following tips to better protect young people from harm online:

- Model appropriate online behavior for young people. Children look to their parents to teach and show them the ways to appropriately use technology. The biggest influence on what children see as acceptable or unacceptable is you.
- Teach your children not to share private information or images online. Strangers posing as online friends can try to gain the trust of minors. Personal information such as name, address, and phone number should never be shared with an unknown person. Tell your children to immediately tell a trusted adult if anyone makes them feel uncomfortable.
- 3 Limit usage of computers and mobile devices to public spaces in the home. Not only will this help to prevent young people from accessing unsafe websites, it will also help them to develop safe browsing habits later in life.
- Install software that can block or monitor explicit website use. Open access to harmful websites, like those that include pornography, is a constant threat to



young people. Website filters can prevent access to harmful and explicit sites and some can even alert you when such a site is accessed.

- Feview and discuss the websites your child has visited and apps they have used. Oversight of your child or teen's browsing history and app usage can help to keep them safe online. If you notice your child has browsed an unsafe website or app, discuss why that behavior is harmful. Learn about current apps that could be harmful to children and teenagers, especially those that involve image sharing, private communication, or the illusion of privacy.
- Report online exploitation of minors
 to public authorities. If you become aware
 of explicit content involving minors, such as
 solicitation, explicit images or videos, you should
 submit a report to law enforcement or through
 resources like Cyber Tipline from the
 National Center for Missing
 and Exploited Children.



May, the Month of Mary

For centuries, the Catholic Church has set aside the entire month of May to honor Mary the Mother of God. Here are some ideas for integrating Mary in your home this May:

Make a "shrine" or altar for Mary

Place a statue or image of her on a small table; place flowers on the altar or a candle; have a small basket in which to place prayer intentions and gratitude offerings.

Buy and read a book on Mary

Some great starters: The World's First Love by Venerable Fulton Sheen; The Secret of Mary by St. Louis de Montfort; Behold Your Mother - A Biblical and Historical Defense of the Marian Doctrines by Tim Staples



Once on the website, search "Life and Witness of Mary" and a variety of video choices will show up.

- · Pray a daily rosary, or a decade a day or once week to start with
- . For kids: Make a rosary craft, a Marian poster, or have a family May Crowning of Mary

SOME EXCERPTS FROM THE CATECHISM OF THE CATHOLIC CHURCH ABOUT MARY AS OUR MODEL, OUR MOTHER THROUGH GRACE, AND HER ROLE IN THE CHURCH:

967 By her complete adherence to the Father's will, to his Son's redemptive work, and to every prompting of the Holy Spirit, the Virgin Mary is the Church's model of faith and charity. Thus she is a "preeminent and . . . wholly unique member of the Church"; indeed, she is the "exemplary realization" of the Church.

968 Her role in relation to the Church and to all humanity goes still further. "In a wholly singular way she cooperated by her obedience, faith, hope, and burning charity in the Savior's work of restoring supernatural life to souls. For this reason she is a mother to us in the order of grace."

969 "This motherhood of Mary in the order of grace continues uninterruptedly from the consent which she loyally gave at the Annunciation and which she sustained without wavering beneath the cross, until the eternal fulfillment of all the elect. Taken up to heaven she did not lay aside this saving office but by her manifold intercession continues to bring us the gifts of eternal salvation Therefore the Blessed Virgin is invoked in the Church under the titles of Advocate, Helper, Benefactress, and Mediatrix."

970 "Mary's function as mother of men in no way obscures or diminishes this unique mediation of Christ, but rather shows its power. But the Blessed Virgin's salutary influence on men... flows forth from the superabundance of the merits of Christ, rests on his mediation, depends entirely on it, and draws all its power from it." "No creature could ever be counted along with the Incarnate Word and Redeemer; but just as the priesthood of Christ is shared in various ways both by his ministers and the faithful, and as the one goodness of God is radiated in different ways among his creatures, so also the unique mediation of the Redeemer does not exclude but rather gives rise to a manifold cooperation which is but a sharing in this one source."



Info regarding potential Celebrations/Gatherings in the Church from the Bismarck Diocese

Weddings - All weddings already scheduled may take place but are to be limited to the bride and groom, the two witnesses, the parents of the bride and groom and the priest or deacon who is to witness the marriage. The Church's Rite of Matrimony Within or Outside of Mass may be used.

Funerals - All funerals are to be private not public, that is to say, for the immediate family only and for the priest or deacon who is the celebrant. The Rite of Christian Funerals Within or Outside of Mass may be used. There is to be no wake and/or vigil observed the day before or day of the funeral. No luncheon or dinner is permitted in the church hall after the funeral.

Baptism - Infant baptism may be administered but may have only 10 persons including the priest or deacon present.

RCIA - RCIA classes are cancelled, but individual preparation can still be provided. The sacramental initiation of adults by a Profession of Faith or by baptism may take place at the discretion of the priest but must be done individually and with no more than 10 persons present.

Considering the spiritual health needs of individuals, we invite you to take advantage of this grace-filled Sacrament so as to stay close to God during these times.
