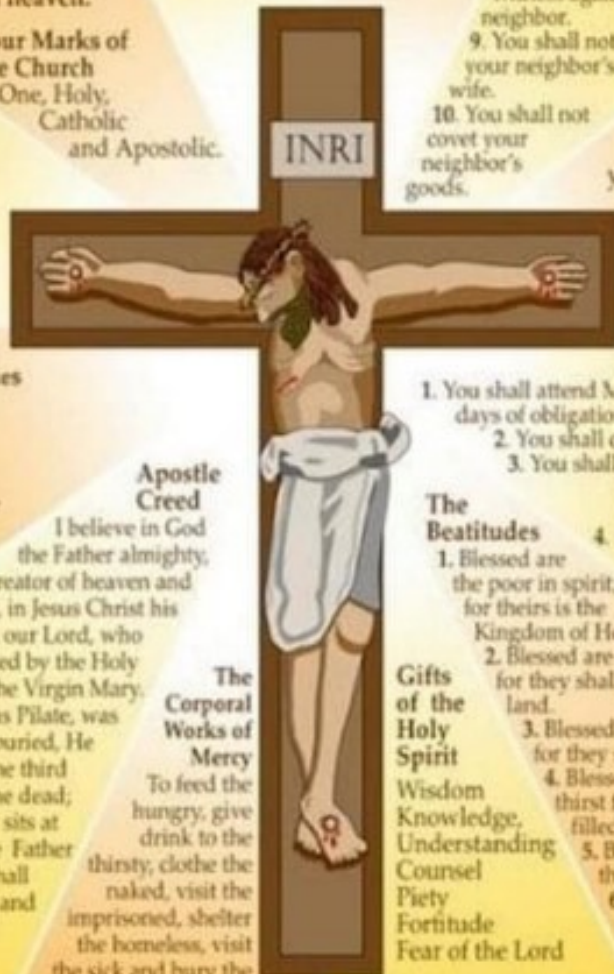

Saint of the Week: Saint Kateri Tekakwitha

Feastday: July 14

Patron: of the environment, ecology, people in exile, and Native Americans

Birth: 1656

Death: April 17, 1680

Beatified: Pope John Paul II

Canonized: On 10/21/2012 by Pope Benedict XVI

Saint Kateri Tekakwitha was an Algonquin–Mohawk laywoman, named Tekakwitha at birth, and she is informally known as the Lily of the Mohawks (1656 – April 17, 1680). Born in the Mohawk village of Ossernenon, on the south side of the Mohawk River in present-day New York State, she contracted smallpox in an epidemic at the young age of four, her face remaining scarred until her death. Her family died from the smallpox.

Tekakwitha was subsequently raised by her uncle, who was the chief of a Mohawk clan.

When her adoptive parents proposed a suitor to her, she refused to entertain the proposal. They punished her by giving her more work to do, but she did not give in. Instead, she remained quiet and diligent. Eventually they were forced to relent and accept that she had no interest in marriage. She converted to Catholicism at age nineteen and was baptized and renamed Kateri (Catherine in the Mahawk language) in honor of St. Catherine of Siena. Kateri took a vow of perpetual virginity and pledged to marry only Jesus Christ. She left her village and moved for the remaining five years of her life to the Jesuit mission village of Kahnawake, south of Montreal on the St. Lawrence River in New France, now Canada.

Kateri was very devout and would put thorns on her sleeping mat. She often prayed for the conversion of her fellow Mohawks. According to the Jesuit missionaries that served the community where Kateri lived, she often fasted and when she would eat, she would taint her food to diminish its flavor.

Upon her death at the age of 24, witnesses said that minutes later her smallpox scars vanished and her face appeared radiant and beautiful. Known for her virtue of chastity and mortification of the flesh, as well as being shunned by some of her tribe for her religious conversion to Catholicism, she is the fourth Native American to be venerated in the Catholic Church and the first to be canonized.

If this happens to be you, please call us and we would be happy to discuss your current situation. We want all of our kids to return for the upcoming school year. But we also want new families to consider our school. If you know any families who perhaps thought they could not afford a Catholic education, please let them know that as a result of this extraordinary gift, we could assist them as well.

Our goal, our mission, is to form our kids into becoming another Christ; to come to know him, love him, and to serve him and to help bring his presence to a culture and society that clearly lacks his presence in many ways. God is looking to raise up great saints who will change the world. Our school hopes to do its part in forming them. We hope to see your children at our school this fall. God bless all of you.
