

Saint of the Week: St. Charbel Makhluf

Feast day: July 24 Birth: May 8, 1828

Death: December 24, 1898 Canonized: October 9, 1977


Youssef Antoun Makhlouf was born on May 8, 1828, one of five children. His family lived in the village of Bekaa Kafra in the Lebanese mountains. His father, a mule driver, died in 1831, returning from corvée for the Turkish army, leaving his wife a widow to care for

their children. Later she remarried a man who went on to seek Holy Orders, becoming the parish priest of the village. (Note: Youssef's family belonged to the Maronite Eastern Rite which allows for married priests—only if married prior to being ordained.)

Youssef was raised in a pious home and became drawn to the lives of the saints and to the hermit life, as was practiced by two of his uncles. As a young boy, he was responsible for the family's small flock. He would take the flock to a grotto nearby, where he had installed an icon of the Blessed Virgin Mary, and then spend the day in prayer.

In 1851, Youssef left his family and entered the Lebanese Maronite Order. Here he received the religious habit of a monk and took the name Charbel, after a Christian martyr in Antioch from the 2nd century. As a young monk, Charbel studied philosophy and theology to prepare himself for Holy Orders. Among his seminary professors was Father Nimatullah Kassab, who was himself later also declared a saint. Charbel was ordained on July 23, 1859. In 1875, he was granted permission to live as a hermit, spending the next 23 years living as a solitary hermit until his death from a stroke on Christmas Eve, December 24, 1898.

A few months after his death, a bright light was seen surrounding his tomb and the superiors opened it to find his body still intact. Experts and doctors were unable to give medical explanations for the incorruptibility and flexibility. In years following, his grave was reopened a few times, each time his body was found intact with no alteration despite the grave having become severely rusty. In 1976, his grave was opened again; this time the body was completely decomposed, and only the skeleton remained. He is known among the Lebanese and Christians around the world for his many miraculous healings and for his ability to unite Christians and Muslims.
